13. Did you know... That the colorful new Myrtle Beach Boardwalk decking is made from recycled milk bottles? Tangent Technologies created the four-inch-thick boards out of recycled HDPE (High-Density Polyethylene), the type of plastic used in milk jugs and laundry detergent bottles. More than 210 million plastic milk bottles are recovered each year and repurposed as recycled plastic lumber.
