The seal was created by local artist John Dietz and was first published on March 15, 1976, which became its copyright date. In 1995, the City of Myrtle Beach acquired the rights. The city then applied for, and received, the copyright registration that same year. That copyright is valid through 2071 and the use of the seal without the City of Myrtle Beach’s permission is illegal.

*Habitat for Humanity of Horry County, Inc. desires to donate the following items for use at Futrell Park:*

**Motion M2023-059 to accept a donation in the amount of \$32,000 from Habitat for Humanity on behalf of Parks, Recreation, and Sports Tourism for the walking trail expansion completed at Futrell Park. No match is required.**

*This funding is part of the ongoing park upgrades occurring at Futrell Park. In collaboration with Habitat for Humanity, the Neighborhood Services and Parks, Recreation, and Sports Tourism (PRST) Departments have played a role in assisting with the completion of the playground renovation, splash pad construction, and fitness trail expansion. Upcoming projects include the installation of benches, tables, swings, and historic placards within the park.*

## **REGULAR AGENDA**

**2nd Reading Ordinance 2023-031 to amend Section 203 of the Zoning Code, definitions, to define Private Event, Banquet Hall, and Event Space; and, amend Section 1407.C and Section 1501 of the Zoning Code to allow Event Spaces as a conditional use in the C7 (Downtown Commercial) District.**

*The proposed ordinance defines a private event and separates the current definition of "event spaces/banquets" into two separate definitions to allow for greater clarity in our zoning code. Event spaces are permitted as a conditional use under Section 1502.A. On 04/18/23, the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval (8/0).*

*The specified conditions are:*

- *The occupancy limit as set by the Fire Marshall does not exceed 70 persons.*
- *All non-residential uses will be closed for business between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.*
- *The event space is prohibited from hosting events that are open to the general public. Therefore, all events within the space must be private events.*

**1st Reading Ordinance 2023-032 a series ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of City of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, Waterworks and Sewer System Revenue Bonds, Series 2023C, in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$43,000,000; prescribing the form and details of such bonds; and, other matters relating thereto.**

*The bonds will finance system improvements (\$37.5 million) and refund the remaining principal balances on the 2011 Water and Sewer Revenue Bond Issues (\$4.4 million).*

*Improvements include:*

- *Phase I and II of a project to install a 48" parallel water line from Old Bryan Drive to 48th Avenue North*
- *Continuation of the Advance Metering Project*
- *Canal Street force main replacement*
- *SCDOT Ride III Projects (including Fred Nash and Highway 501)*
- *Several pump station renovations (Myrtle Manor, BATB, 24th Avenue North, Jake Abraham, Bear Branch, and The Forest)*
- *Arts & Innovation District utility infrastructure*
- *Various other projects to upgrade or renew the water & sewer infrastructure serving the system*

**Resolution R2023-018 approving the Myrtle Beach Downtown Municipal Improvement District Annual Assessment Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024; and, other matters related thereto.**

*With Ordinance R2022-025, City Council established the MID and the assessment roll. All of the proper procedures were followed in the original establishment of the MID. This resolution is confirming the annual assessment roll for this year.*

**Motion M2023-060 to declare certain vehicles abandoned or derelict pursuant to the authority of Article 41 of Title 56 South Carolina Code of Laws 2001.**

*This declaration is an effort to improve the appearance of both commercial and residential neighborhoods. This report includes vehicles staff tagged as abandoned or derelict. Council's approval allows these vehicles to be towed from their private property locations to a tow yard where they may be reclaimed by the current owner upon payment of the applicable towing and storage fees. If the vehicles are not claimed by the owner within 30*

*days of the required notice, then the tow company may sell the vehicle and keep the proceeds as compensation.*
