8. **Did you know...** That a gallon of drinking water costs Myrtle Beach city residents only a quarter of a penny? That's the price-per-gallon for the first 4,000 gallons of water each month, beginning August 1, 2022. The cost includes a \$3.30 base charge per month and the new use charge of \$1.73 per 1,000 gallons, per month. Put another way, Myrtle Beach residents get four gallons of water for just a penny, delivered on-demand, directly to your home, around-the-clock. At just 25.5 cents for 100 gallons of water, that's a bargain! Residential customers who live outside the city limits pay twice as much as in-city residents, so a gallon of water costs them half a cent, and 100 gallons is about 51 cents.

CONSENT AGENDA – *The Consent Agenda covers items anticipated to be routine in nature. Any Council member may ask that an item be moved from the Consent Agenda to the Regular Agenda for lengthier discussion, or a member of the public may request that such an item be moved. Items remaining on the Consent Agenda will be briefly described by staff and may be passed as a group with the approval of the agenda.*

Note: *City laws are known as ordinances. Before a city ordinance can be enacted, it must be introduced (1st Reading) and then approved (2nd Reading). Resolutions are actions through which City Council reinforces or makes policy not rising to the level of law. Motions are related to direction from City Council to city staff to take certain actions.*

Motion M2022-112 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to: apply for a grant of \$26,116.52 for the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation; record the appropriation of such grants funds in the amount that may be approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. No match is required.

If awarded, the grant would allow the Fire Department to purchase twelve Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for frontline apparatuses. MBFD seeks funding to obtain AEDs for continued life safety response measures throughout our communities. AEDs will benefit city residents and visitors by replacing outdated AEDs within frontline apparatuses. Newly acquired AEDs allow for reliable and easy-to-use defibrillation to enhance the Myrtle Beach Fire Department's goal of safety, incident stabilization and property conservation.

Motion M2022-113 to accept a donation of \$1,000 from Sufism Reoriented in support of capital improvements that promote pedestrian safety within our community. No local match is required.

These funds were donated by Sufism Reoriented at the request of Ms. Barbara Emrich in appreciation for the refreshed pavement markings that accompanied the recent resurfacing of Ocean Boulevard in support of pedestrian safety.

Motion M2022-114 authorizing the City Manager to: apply for a grant from the Palmetto Pride Watergoat Program; record the appropriation of such grant funds in the amount that may be approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. No match is required.

The Watergoat Grant Program is aimed at providing trash barriers to be used in streams, canals, ponds and lakes to control and mitigate debris. The barrier system is designed to operate successfully in fast-moving fluctuating waters while capturing a high amount of debris. The installation location of the barriers has not been determined, but the system will provide efficient and effective litter control and maintenance to a needed location within the city.

Motion M2022-115 to approve a Special Event Permit to Ground Zero/Scott Payseur for the "Michael W. Smith Outdoor Concert" on October 8, 2022, from 5:00 to 10:00 p.m. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event will close: Chester Street, from Ninth Avenue North to 10th Avenue North; the eastbound lane of 10th Avenue North; and, the alley behind Ground Zero. Closures will occur between 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 7, through midnight on Saturday, October 8. One lane will be left clear for emergency vehicles.

Motion M2022-116 to approve a Special Event Permit to Ground Zero/Scott Payseur for the "GZi Outreach" event on October 26, 2022, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event will close Chester Street, from Ninth Avenue North to 10th Avenue North, from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. The event includes BMX trick riders, cornhole and a s'mores making area.

Motion M2022-117 to approve a Special Event Permit to Coastal Broadcasting for the "Waves of Praise Gospel Festival" on September 2-3, 2022, between the hours of 4:00 and 11:00 p.m. on Friday and 12:00 to 11:00 p.m. on Saturday. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The promoter anticipates 10,000 attendees. The event will include live music, food and retail vendors.

REGULAR AGENDA

2nd Reading Ordinance 2022-034 approving the execution and delivery by the City of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, of a lease between the city, as lessor, and Bayview Resort Holdings, LLC, as lessee, with respect to 10 parking places at the Fifth Avenue North street end in the City of Myrtle Beach.

We have encouraged many of our hotels along Ocean Boulevard to be mindful of backing up traffic into the boulevard during peak check-in and check-out periods. To accommodate our request, Bayview has asked to lease 10 spots in the Fifth Avenue North street end. These conversations have been going for a while, and the rate listed in the lease is based on 2019-20 collections. Our general policy has been to set the lease rate at 90% of the prior year's collections.

The lease is for one year. The city can terminate the lease if we determine a public need exists, including the need for additional public parking. They will be allowed to place signage on these lots.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-035 to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Myrtle Beach, Appendix A Zoning Article 14 zoning districts, to allow auto parts stores in the MUM zoning classification.

The applicant has a potential auto parts retail tenant willing to occupy a portion of the former Food Lion plaza space on Hwy 501. The applicant is hoping to fill the remainder space with a tenant that offers groceries for sale. Motor vehicle part stores are permitted in the Highway Commercial (HC1, HC2), Light Manufacturing (LM) and Wholesale/Manufacturing (WM) zoning districts. MU-M is a form-based zoning district with a variety of permitted uses and strict design guidelines. Motor Vehicle Part Stores are regulated separately and differently than Motor Vehicle Repair and Maintenance businesses. Approval of this request would not result in automobile repair shops in MU-M. On July 19, 2022, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (6-0).

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-036 to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Myrtle Beach, Appendix A Zoning Article 15 Conditional and Accessory Uses and Special Exceptions, to: allow developments in MU-H (Mixed Use – High Density) Districts to install required parking on adjacent property zoned RMH (Multifamily Residential High Density); clarify the code regarding parking lot proximity to the primary use; and, strengthen landscape buffering requirements.

Applicant wishes to demolish the Mariner Hotel and develop a commercial product that requires additional parking. The property is split zoned between MU-H along Ocean Boulevard and RMH in the rear. Currently, parking lots are only allowed in the RMH under two circumstances:

- *An accessory to an RMH use (example is a parking lot in an apartment complex)*
- *An accessory to an abutting or adjoining use in an MU-M district (example is a restaurant in MU-M with parking on an adjoining lot in an RMH district)*

The request is to allow the same for a use in an abutting or adjoining MU-H district. The ordinance also recommends strengthening the landscape buffer requirements to the parking lots that abut, or share a property line with, the MU property to which it is an accessory. The

ordinance, if adopted, would double the size of the required landscape buffer. On July 19, 2022, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (6-0).

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-037 to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Myrtle Beach, Appendix A Zoning Article 14 Zoning Districts and 15 Conditional Uses, to: add golf cart rentals as a conditional use in the Amusement (A), Entertainment (E), and Highway Commercial (HC) Zoning Districts; and, align the city zoning code with changes in state law regarding golf cart registration requirements.

Due to the popularity of moped rentals, the city put in place regulations regarding the location and operations of moped rental establishments. In recent years, the city has seen a similar trend in short-term golf cart rentals. The city's Zoning Code currently does not specifically address golf cart rentals, and it has been applying moped rental regulations to golf cart rental establishments. Since golf carts are no longer viewed as the same as mopeds, staff suggests adding "golf cart rental and sales establishment" to the code as a Conditional Use with the same conditions as "moped rental and sales establishment," and to adjust those conditions accordingly. On July 19, 2022, Planning Commission voted to recommend approval (6-0).

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-038 confirming the assessment roll related to the Myrtle Beach Downtown Improvement District; and, other matters relating thereto.

The purpose of the Municipal Improvement District (MID) is provision for, and funding of, various public improvements for the benefit of the current and future users of the real property located within the district set forth in Resolution 2022-017 (adopted on April 12, 2022).

The proposed public improvements consist of the following:

- *Ambassador Program*
- *Events and Marketing*
- *Special Projects*
- *Planning and Research*

This ordinance officially confirms the assessment roll, which identifies the parcels subject to the assessment within the Municipal Improvement District. Property Owner Notices and the Advertised Notice of Completion provided that objections to the assessment must be made in writing to the City Manager on or before August 10, 2022. A public session and public hearing will occur on Thursday, August 11, at 11:00 a.m. in Council Chambers, Ted C. Collins Law Enforcement Center, 1101 North Oak Street, at which Council will make a final decision on each such objection.

Based upon City Council's decision in response to any written objections and input received at the August 11 public session, City Council will determine any corrections to the assessment roll for second reading and final confirmation.

Motion M2022-118 to approve a Special Event Permit to Native Sons Promotions for the "Myrtle Beach Food Truck Festival" to be held March 31-April 2, 2023. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event will be held at Burroughs & Chapin Pavilion Place and will include food trucks, beer and wine sales, live music and a kid zone. The event includes a closure of Ocean

Boulevard, between Eighth and Ninth Avenues North, from 8:00 a.m. on Friday through 12:00 a.m. on Sunday.

Motion M2022-119 to approve grants to outside agencies listed 1-16 as outlined on Attachment A for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.

As presented, the Fiscal Year 2022-23 budget includes \$215,000 to support agencies that provide services aligned with Council's strategic vision. The effect of this motion is to allocate \$185,000 of those funds among the 16 applicants.

Motion M2022-120 to approve a \$30,000 grant to the Grand Strand Boys and Girls Club as outlined on Attachment A for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.

This motion allocates \$30,000 to the Boys and Girls Club, an outside agency. This is a companion action to the motion above.
