Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas

1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached. Myrtle City offices and facilities will be closed Monday, September 5, to observe the Labor Day holiday. *However, solid waste and recycling will be collected on the usual Monday-through-Thursday schedule.* Questions? Call the Public Works Department at 843-918-2160.
2. **Myrtle Beach's rules about dogs, bicycles, tents and canopies on the beach change after Labor Day.** Beginning Tuesday, September 6, dogs and bicycles are allowed on the beach at any hour, although dogs must be on a leash, and you must pick up after your pet and properly dispose of droppings. The hours for dogs and bicycles are restricted again beginning May 1, 2023. Also, tents and canopies are allowed on the beach in-line-with, or behind, the established umbrella line until Memorial Day 2023.
3. **The popular South Carolina's Largest Garage Sale is set for 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Saturday, September 10.** The event takes place at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center, 2101 North Oak Street, and attendee parking costs \$5 per vehicle. Event admission is free!
4. **The fifth annual Tunnel to Towers Foundation Walk and 5K Run is set for 8:00 a.m., Saturday, September 10, at Valor Memorial Garden, 1120 Farrow Parkway.** The foundation memorializes the sacrifice of all first responders on September 11, including Stephen Siller. A 34-year-old firefighter in Brooklyn, Siller responded to the call on September 11 by strapping 60 pounds of equipment and gear on his back and running through the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel, the longest tunnel in New York City (approximately 1.7 miles long), to rescue people in the World Trade Center. Siller gave his life to save

others, and his story inspired the annual Tunnel to Towers nationwide events. To register, see the [Tunnel to Towers 5K Run](#) webpage.

5. **Diamond Youth Foundation’s “I Love Seafood” Festival is set for Saturday and Sunday, September 10-11, 3:00 to 11:00 p.m.** The event takes place at the Burroughs & Chapin Pavilion Place, 812 North Ocean Boulevard, and includes live entertainment, seafood vendors, Food Network stars and live demonstrations. Admission is \$10 and booths offer lobster tails, crab legs, crab cakes, crawfish, oysters, beer and more for purchase. For details, visit <https://www.iloveseafoodfest.com/>.
6. **Everyone is invited to the Unity Memorial in Warbird Park at 1:00 p.m., Sunday, September 11, for the September 11 Remembrance Ceremony.** The event is hosted by the City of Myrtle Beach and Golf Tourism Solutions. The Unity Memorial features a steel beam from the North Tower of the World Trade Center. The beam was presented to Golf Tourism Solutions (Golf Holiday) by a group of retired FDNY firefighters as a “thank you” to the Myrtle Beach community for its hospitality in the months and years following the terrorist attacks. We hope to see you there.
7. **Attention, Myrtle Beach locals, downtown supporters, artists and music lovers... “Nights at Nance” is back!** The Myrtle Beach Downtown Alliance and City of Myrtle Beach cohost this free concert series featuring performances by local and regional bands. Myrtle Beach city staff members were on hand as part of the larger community which feels the effects from this issue.
- 11. Did you know...** That the City of Myrtle Beach does *not* regulate aviation or airspace? Drones are permitted on the north end of the city as long as operators follow all Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) rules and regulations. Myrtle Beach International Airport is a “no drone zone,” and the surrounding area is classified as “Class C” airspace. Drone flights in this area require prior authorization. To view an interactive map with airspace zones, visit the [B4UFLY](#) webpage or download the app. To obtain drone flight permission in controlled airspaces, operators must utilize the [FAA's Low Altitude Authorization and Notification Capability \(LAANC\)](#) process.
