Myrtle Beach marked the 22nd anniversary of the September 11 terrorist attacks with a solemn ceremony at the Unity Memorial, and that's the subject of our Photos of the Week.** Five hundred people gathered at Warbird Park to remember more than 3,000 people who lost their lives and the heroic actions of police, fire and other first responders who rushed to the rescue. Jaesen Moore moved the audience with the national anthem, while the Coastal Shields Pipes & Drums provided "Amazing Grace" for the wreath-laying portion of the ceremony. Speakers from the FDNY and NYPD recalled their actions that day and in the days which followed. The Unity Memorial features a steel beam from the North Tower of the World Trade Center, presented to the Myrtle Beach community on the 10th anniversary of the attacks, in recognition and appreciation of the Grand Strand's hospitality to New York's police and fire departments in the weeks and months of recovery following September 11, 2001. **12. Did you know...** That, in the months following the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, the Myrtle Beach community offered 1,000 free vacations to New York firefighters and police officers and their families? Myrtle Beach wanted to help, and what we could offer was a vacation from the grim work of recovery following the collapse of the World Trade Center towers. In 2002, the Grand Strand's volunteer effort included: 1,100 free hotel rooms at 70 properties; 1,235 free foursomes of golf at 37 courses; 8,200 activity vouchers at 14 amusements and attractions; 7,700 free tickets to performances at six theatres; half-price offers from 32 restaurants; and, fresh flowers in every hotel room for the FDNY and NYPD officers and their families. The vacations alone were worth more than \$1 million at the time (nearly 22 years ago). The Grand Strand also provided weekly welcome receptions at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center for visiting New York firefighters and police officers. These receptions included hors d'oeuvres, refreshments and live music, and local police and fire officials, among others, greeted the New York guests to express our appreciation and support for their efforts.
