Myrtle Beach's young people are invited to special meet-and-greet with Olympic Gold Medalist Brittney Reese at 9:00 a.m., Saturday, October 9, at Doug Shaw Memorial Stadium, 705 33rd Avenue North.** Reese is the most-decorated women's long-jumper of all time! Her appearance is part of the Track & Field Development Series from the city's Parks, Recreation and Sports Tourism Department. The goal is to introduce local youth to the sport of track and field and provide current athletes and out-of-season opportunity. A four-time Olympian from Gulfport, MS, Reese won Gold in 2012 at the London Games and followed up with Silver medals in Rio in 2016 and Tokyo in 2021. She has seven world championship titles (three indoor and four outdoor), one world silver medal and 13 USATF national championships. The event October 9 is for High Jump, Long Jump, Triple Jump and Pole Vault. Ages 7-18 are invited; no experience is necessary. Admission is \$10 for the day. If you plan to participate, bring a water bottle, sun screen, athletic apparel, closed-to running shoes (event-specific spikes if you wish), and lots of energy! Participants will be grouped by age and/or experience level, with groups rotating through each event area. Interior construction on the HTC Aspire Hub, a future co-work space on Ninth Avenue North, is coming along nicely, and that's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** Ninth Avenue North is being transformed with building renovations, all part of the city's Arts & Innovation District. HTC is providing \$250,000 for technology and up-fitting of the co-work space. These photos give a sense of how the shared office space will look when finished. Dozens of local entrepreneurs have applied to operate a business from one of the mini hubs. Other buildings on the street also are receiving façade renovations, in keeping with their historic character. Interest is high for leasing or purchasing those spaces.
- 11. Did you know...** That the City of Myrtle Beach's Solid Waste Division collected 39,952 tons of solid waste during the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2021? That's 79,904,000 pounds in all, or 2,443 pounds per capita. The total includes: 63,677,600 pounds of garbage; 8,554,040 pounds of yard waste; 4,238,080 pounds of commingled recyclables; 3,317,940 pounds of bulky junk; 76,800 pounds of scrap metal; 27,380 pounds of electronic waste (computers, monitors, printers and TVs); and 12,160 pounds of commercial cardboard. That's a new city record!

**CONSENT AGENDA** – *The Consent Agenda covers items anticipated to be routine in nature. **Note:** *City laws are known as ordinances. Before a city ordinance can be enacted, it must be introduced (1st Reading) and then approved (2nd Reading). Resolutions are actions through which City Council reinforces or makes policy not rising to the level of law. Motions are related to direction from City Council to city staff to take certain actions.*

**Motion M2021-138 to approve a Special Events Permit to Lynn Makris/BEI – Beach, LLC, for the DeVille Street Festival. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*Events are set for Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., November 1, 2021-January 31, 2022. Festivals include various vendors and entertainment along DeVille Street at The Market*

*Common. The applicant is aware that she must pay for any services provided by the City of Myrtle Beach.*

**Motion M2021-139 to approve a Special Event Permit to Heather Gray/BEI-Beach, LLC, for the Market Common Carriage Rides. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*Events include allowing horse-drawn carriages to carry guests throughout The Market Common beginning October 1, 2021-December 31, 2021. The promoter is asking permission to close two parking spaces on Howard Avenue in front of Dolce Lusso Salon for carriage rider pick-up and drop-off. Expected attendance is 100 riders each evening.*

**Motion M2021-140 to approve a Special Event Permit to BEI-Beach, LLC, for the “Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony and Holiday Events at The Market Common.” The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*Event is scheduled to take place on November 20, 2021, across from the Grand 14 Cinema. The tree lighting event will include partial closings of Reed Street and DeVille Street (as shown on site plan).*

**Motion M2021-141 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to enter into a cooperative agreement with SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) to: fulfill the requirements of the Cooperative Agreement Grant in the amount of \$9,800 received from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR); record the appropriation of such grant funds in the amount approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. No match is required.**

*The grant’s purpose is to allow one staff member, as a representative of the Pee Dee Region Healthcare Coalition, to attend: the National Healthcare Coalition Preparedness Conference in Orlando; the Preparedness Summit in Atlanta; the Florida Governor’s Hurricane Conference in West Palm Beach; the National Hurricane Conference in Orlando; the Hospital Preparedness Program Summit in Columbia; and, the South Carolina Emergency Management Association Conference in Myrtle Beach. The goal is to share the leading practices and lessons learned with the coalition through a written report to increase awareness of current issues and new developments related to preparedness and response activities.*

## **REGULAR AGENDA**

**2nd Reading Ordinance 2021-036 authorizing the sale of vacant parcel to Patrick J. Herrmann for \$5,000.**

*When SCDOT built the overpass where Socastee Boulevard feeds into Farrow Parkway (back gate), the connection of Frontage Road to Socastee Boulevard was terminated, thus creating a parcel of property that has been vacant and is owned by the city. Mr. Herrmann acquired the adjacent property from SCDOT and intends to build an office building and wishes to buy this piece of vacant property from the city. The city does not need this piece of remnant parcel, but due to the underground utilities (water, sewer, etc.), the purchaser will not be able to build on this parcel.*

**1st Reading Ordinance 2021-037 to amend Ordinance 2021-028, the 2021-2022 Budget Ordinance, and Ordinance 2021-035, in order to correct a scrivener's error in the Exhibit J thereof.**

*Exhibit J of the 2021-22 Budget Ordinance (Ordinance 2021-028) was amended by Ordinance 2021-035. Section (ii) of Exhibit J's "Schedule of Building Permit Charges" indicates that Permit Fees are \$0.3075 per square foot. Permit fees should instead be listed as \$0.375 per square foot. The amendment is recommended to correct the scrivener's error and allow the amended rate schedule to remain revenue neutral.*

**Motion M2021-142 to approve a Special Event Permit to Ground Zero/Scott Payseur for "GZi Outreach" on November 3, 2021. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*The event will close Chester Street from 10th Avenue North to Ninth Avenue North, from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. The event includes outdoor movies, corn hole and a "s'mores making area."*

**Motion M2021-143 to approve a Special Event Permit to Ground Zero/Scott Payseur for "Concert at Ground Zero" on November 6, 2021. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*The event will close Chester Street from 10th Avenue North to Ninth Avenue North, from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Closure allows for tents on the street to help add space to the event.*

**Motion M2021-144 to approve a Special Event Permit to BEI-Beach, LLC, for the "A Southern Times Square at The Market Common." The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*The operational hours of this event will be from 9:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m., December 31, 2021-January 1, 2022. The event features: live music on a temporary stage; a movie screen with streaming video; a ball drop at midnight; kids' activities and bounce houses; fireworks at midnight; street performers; and, various vendors. The event grounds will encompass Valor Memorial Garden and various road closures (on-site plan shows closures). This is the ninth year for this event, and fireworks are being launched from the same site as in the past.*

**Motion M2021-145 to approve a Special Event Permit to Crossroads Event Productions for the "Myrtle Beach Jazz Festival," from October 15- 17, 2021, between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and midnight daily. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*The promoter is expecting approximately 5,000 attendees, and the event will include live music, food and various retail/craft vendors. Beer, wine and liquors will also be available for purchase. The event includes a closure on Carver Street between 18th and 21st Avenues North (see plan). The city will provide in-kind services as indicated on the attached event summary.*



**Motion M2021-146 to approve a Special Event Permit to the Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee/Grand Strand Bicycle Club for “Bike the Beach.” The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.**

*Event is scheduled for November 13, 2021, from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Three group rides are part of the event: the Whitt Oliver Metric Century, the Showcase Loop and the Family Fun Ride. Road closures include Ocean Boulevard, between Eighth and Ninth Avenues North, from 7:00 to 10:00 a.m. And, an additional closure on Ocean Boulevard, from Eighth to Second Avenues, for the family ride from 9:00 to 9:45 a.m.*
