12. **A friendly reminder that political signs are allowed as temporary signage without a permit, but only on private property.** Per [Myrtle Beach City Code](#), temporary political signs can be no larger than four square feet and no taller than four feet in height. No limit on the number exists, but they must be on private property. Political signs are not allowed in

medians, on utility poles, on city property or anywhere in the public right-of-way. City staff will pick up illegally placed signs on public property. Temporary political signs can be posted no more than 45 days before the election, and must be removed within five days after the election (or runoff, if one is needed). Looking ahead, the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) will host a public information meeting to discuss the US 17 Business Safety Improvements Project on Thursday, October 26, 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. The meeting takes place at Myrtle Beach Middle School, 3101 North Oak Street. Representatives will be on hand to cover proposed changes to US 17 Business (portion of Kings Highway), between 29th Avenue South to 27th Avenue North. The project's purpose is to reduce the frequency, and severity, of crashes. Plans include new pavement markings, high visibility crosswalks, concrete medians for access management, ADA ramps, leading pedestrian intervals (LPI) at crosswalks, upgraded equipment and new sidewalks. Myrtle Beach unveiled recent improvements to the Oak Street Cemetery last Sunday, and that’s the subject of our Photos of the Week.** The Neighborhood Services Department welcomed new signage, benches, landscaping and fencing, and thanked cemetery staff for the upgrades. Located just off Oak Street behind the Myrtle Beach Convention Center, the

historic African American cemetery has nearly 250 graves, dating from the early 1900s to the present. Veterans from World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War are buried here. For the first time ever, a sign facing the Convention Center identifies the property for passers-by. The city acquired the land in 1992 as part of the Convention Center expansion and has conducted research to identify the grave sites and their occupants. This was part of the Beachside Chats event on Sunday, which also included an appearance and talk by Eleanora Tate, a former Myrtle Beach resident who wrote *The Secret of Gumbo Grove*.
