1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached.
2. **Myrtle Beach will issue hurricane-repair permits at no cost.** During Tuesday's meeting, the Myrtle Beach City Council granted a waiver on building permit fees for any repairs associated with damage from Hurricane Ian. Property owners won't have to pay a permit fee to fix hurricane damage, although they still need to apply for and receive a building permit – to make sure the work is performed correctly. The fee waiver is good for repairs permitted during the next 30 days. It can be extended, if Council wishes.
3. **With City Council's approval of Motion [M2022-141](#), the City of Myrtle Beach offers a new [Facility Renaming Policy](#) form online.** The form allows users to submit requests for naming or renaming public spaces in honor or in memory of: individuals, families, significant events or associations/groups. Options include a memorial bench or tree with plaque, public facilities (parks, buildings, etc.) or memorial installations.
4. **The City of Myrtle Beach thanks customers for their patience as our crews continue to collect storm debris.** Presently, the majority of the knuckleboom fleet continues to collect storm debris on the north end of city limits, with one truck collecting bulk material. Staff will continue to work Saturdays to speed up collections. Below is a general schedule for the next few days. The goal is for crews to return to regular schedules beginning the week of October 24. Questions? Call the Solid Waste and Recycling Division at 843-918-2160.

- **Friday, October 14** – Five trucks are covering the Dunes and 72nd Avenue North areas.
- **Saturday, October 15** – Four trucks will cover 62nd through 67th Avenues North, between Kings Highway and Highway 17 Bypass, and one truck will collect bulk waste in The Market Common area.
- **Monday and Tuesday, October 17-18** – Four trucks will return to the Dunes area and one truck will work the south end to collect bulk waste.
- **Wednesday, October 19** – Four trucks will finish collections in the Dunes area and one truck will continue to collect bulk waste from the south end, moving north.
- **Thursday and Friday, October 20-21** – Crews will catch up on bulk waste collections and address any areas with remaining storm debris.

- 21. Did you know...** That Myrtle Beach was the site of a German prisoner of war camp during the latter years of World War II? Approximately 600 prisoners of war were first housed at a P.O.W. camp near Cane Patch Swash beginning in mid-1944. The camp was later moved to the Myrtle Beach Air Base, in barracks which the P.O.W.s helped to build. While here, the P.O.W.s also worked on local construction and agricultural projects. The Myrtle Beach camp was one of 20 permanent P.O.W. camps and eight temporary ones in South Carolina during the war years. (*Credit for this information goes to Greetings from...
