 - Realignment schedule still set to begin 2019 with acquisitions and then construction 2022

 - M2019- 102 approval 8/13/2019 to authorize professional services agreement with DDC Engineering. Procurement in final stages and anticipate work to begin this month.

 - » and the expected ROI of the overall public investment.




- Proposed Tech/Co-working Space



Dedicated Master Plan Website:

- Met with a website developer to discuss ideas to create this website to now meet with the Stakeholder Engagement Team to discuss options ideas on how to move forward.
- With LS3P's partnership, there will be opportunities for community & stakeholders to visualize the project(s) as we progress through Plan implementation.

Project Update and Process:

- LS3P has a standing meeting once a week with key City Staff members to update on their Advanced Planning Progress, anything that may be on the horizon, and any potential roadblocks.
- Once we move on to a specific project (i.e. Performing Arts
 Theater) LS3P, key City Staff and specific Project Team will also meet
 weekly to update on the same items above.
- COMMUNICATION IS KEY!

CCU and City of Myrtle Beach Performing Arts Theater Update

- Have had preliminary meetings with City Staff, LS3P, and CCU Staff regarding the Performing Arts Theater.
- LS3P has begun to work on surveying the 3 buildings, look to get updates and start the discussion with LS3P, City Staff, and CCU Team within the next few weeks.
- City Staff, LS3P and CCU will be working in partnership as we move through the planning and design stages of this project.
- When updates are ready we will be bringing that information back to City Council.

EdVenture & City of Myrtle Beach Children's Museum Update Library Team & City of Myrtle Beach New City Library Update

- Will have a preliminary meeting with City Staff, LS3P, and the EdVenture Team and Library Team in regards to their projects within the Downtown Master Plan.
- Goal of these meetings is to have an introductory meeting to discuss ideas, needs, wants..etc. so that LS3P has some background.
- City Staff, LS3P and EdVenture and Library Teams will be working in partnership as we move through the planning and design stages of this project.
- When updates are ready we will be bringing that information back to City Council.

9th Ave. N Building Renovation Plan and PROPOSED Time Line

- Remove signage on buildings with no business activity COMPLETED
- Trees along 9th Ave. N have been trimmed and maintained to provide for better lighting – COMPLETED
- City Staff has been gathering info to develop a plan to renovate the City Owned buildings along 9th Ave. N.
 - Submit an RFP to Purchasing Department to bid out all City Owned buildings for renovations.
 - All buildings will receive roof, asbestos abatement if needed and a CODE READY up fit.
 - Building 509 is the exception as this building will be up fitted as stated above as well as up fitted for the Co-Work Space as seen in the previous slides.

9th Ave. N Building Renovation Plan and Time Line

 City Staff working with the Rogers Lewis Firm to develop a plan to capture the Historic Tax Credits and Abandon Building Credits for the 9th Ave. buildings as a potential funding source for this project

GOAL: By renovating these buildings the goal is to provide a CODE ready building to entice a new business opportunity to occupy and become a part of the Arts & Innovation District.



Other projects related to the Downtown Master Plan -

- Cleaning of Ocean Blvd. Sidewalks
 - Contingent on City Council approval of 2019-43 \$126,000 will be allocated to perform a detailed pressure washing process from 9th Ave. N to 14th Ave. N along Ocean Blvd.
 - This process will remove the gum, gum stains, and seal the concrete to allow for easy removal of anything that is on the sidewalks going forward. On going maintenance will be required to keep the sidewalks from dirt buildup.
 - Project Start Date: October 1, 2019
 - Completion Date: 60 Days after start date









Other projects related to the Downtown Master Plan -

- Ocean Blvd. Bollards City Staff has ordered bollards for replacement of the current bollards along Ocean Blvd.
- Working on a bid for installation to go out within the week.
- Installation to start within the next 30-45 days.
- Funding is already allocated in the Capital Budget.



Grant Opportunities

OZ Grant Fund – SC Department of Commerce – offset costs of obtaining an outside vendor to assist in completion of a competitive OZ prospectus and allow third party vendor to assist governmental entity in determining best projects to pursue or the financial structuring of same - \$12,500 (50% match) due 7/1 . **City was awarded the \$12,500**.

MASC Hometown Economic Development Grant - support those economic development projects that will make a positive impact on a municipality's quality of life. The grant program also promotes and recognizes innovation in economic development practices. - \$25,000 (15% local match) due in October Application in progress. Due Sept. 27, Awarded Oct. 25

Palmetto Pride Litter Prevention Grant — CPTED Projects
(Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design) such as public art, lighting, litter cleanup - \$15,000 (no match) due October 1

Application in progress. Due Nov. 15, Awarded Dec. 15

SC Department of Commerce – researching opportunities for Grant Opportunities.

Grant Opportunities

Rural Infrastructure Authority - Qualified infrastructure projects that improve water, waste water and storm water drainage facilities to address public health and regulatory standards or build capacity to support economic and employment opportunities - due September 9 and March 16.

Maker Cities – Etsy Impact Fund and Master Card Impact Fund – Investing in local communities committed to creative entrepreneurs - \$40,000 (no match) due July 3 – 5 grants awarded nationally. (Met on Monday, June 3 to view webinar and discuss project) Meeting Wednesday, June 12 with work team to complete the grant. SUBMITTED/ Received notification
