



# **Police: Brother shot in the chest by sibling at Eastpointe park**

An Eastpointe man is recovering after being shot in the chest by a relative at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Park on Saturday night, according to police.

Police reported officers were flagged down about 8 p.m. by the victim at the park on Schroeder Avenue and Stephens Road. The victim's car had three bullet holes in it, police said Sunday in a news release.

The victim told investigators he had been talking to his brother when the discussion escalated into an argument. According to the release, the brother pulled out a gun and fired several times, striking the victim in the chest.

Police said the victim was transported to an area hospital where he is reported to be temporary serious condition. They did not say what the two men were arguing about.

The suspect was later arrested in the area of Hayes Road and Harper Avenue on Detroit's east side, officers said in the release.

Names of the suspect and victim were withheld by police. Information will be submitted on Monday to the Macomb County Prosecutor's Office for a determination on criminal charges.
