Meeting called to order 4:03 p.m.

A. Roll Call

a. Mr. Frontera, Mr. Switalski, Mr. Walters and Mr. Merucci are present. Mr. Hogan is absent.

B. Approval of Minutes

a. Approval of Minutes for Regular meeting on June 10, 2020

i. Motion to approve the June Regular meeting minutes was made by Mr. Walters, supported by Mr. Switalski. All approved, none opposed. Motion passed.

C. Approval of Disbursements and Budget Report

a. Disbursement #12

i. Motion to approve disbursement #12 was made by Mr. Frontera, supported by Mr. Switalski. All approved, none opposed. Motion passed.

b. Revenue/Expense Report

i. Motion to approve the revenue/expense report was made by Mr. Switalski, supported by Mr. Frontera. Mr. Walters commented the revenue/expense report is the budget amendment due to items still needing to be put in for end of the fiscal year. Mr. Switalski questioned the building addition & improvements line being adjusted; Mr. Walters explained that the was a difference from the Fitness Court that got rolled over from last fiscal year. Mr. Switalski also questioned the Communications amendment and Printing & Publications amendment; Mr. Lipinski responded that the printing & publications amendment was due to the change in the newsletter and the communications amendment was partly for getting updated phones for SMART. We are waiting on disbursement from SMART. All approved, none opposed. Motion passed.

D. Hearing of the Public – agenda items only

a. No public spoke.

E. Communications

a. Mr. Lipinski shared that the Recreation Authority did cancel the youth baseball/softball program due to the recent spike in covid-19 and behavior we have noticed. Adam did call all participants from the program to explain why we were cancelling the programs.

G. New Business

a. Discussion and request approval of the Employment for Senior Van Transportation Coordinator.

i. Mr. Merucci stated that he had some questions posed to him and has not been able to read over the documents he requested and would like to see action not taken until next month's meeting. Mr. Switalski responded that if the program is running great, if the program is not that we wouldn't agree to the employment. Mr. Lipinski commented that the program did go out of its traditional boundaries and take some of the remaining seniors that needed tax appointments done to the County for assistance; accommodations like this will be made with the expansion of the program. Motion to approve the Employment for Senior Van Transportation Coordinator was made by Mr. Switalski, supported Mr. Frontera. Three approved, one opposed. Motion passed.

b. Discuss Field Rental Policy

i. Mr. Lipinski placed the rental policy in the packets to be able to possibly adjust them for the 2021 season. The Recreation Authority has been approached for having tournaments out at Huron Park, with those rentals there is often an additional charge to have the fields lined and dragged over the weekend. The lining and dragging of the field is done by the Department of Public Services through the given city that the tournament would be held in. Mr. Lipinski is requesting to be able to send those additional funds to the appropriate city even though it is part of our land agreement with the City of Eastpointe and the City of

Roseville. Mr. Walters recommends that the corresponding city should send an invoice to the Recreation Authority so that everything is documented properly. Motion to approve having the Recreation Authority pay and the city sending an invoice the Recreation Authority for the additional funds received for field maintenance during a tournament was made by Mr. Switalski, supported by Mr. Walters. All approved, none opposed. Motion passed.

H. Hearing of the Public

a. No public spoke.

I. Discussion by Director

a. Mr. Lipinski stated that the youth baseball/softball program was canceled. The Summer Day Camp program did start this past Monday, July 6th; there are a number of protocols in place for the safety of the kids and staff. Majority of the Summer Day Camp program is held outside. The census deadline has been extended to October 31st; Mary & Kim attended the class to provide assistance to the seniors. The Seniors are beginning to have some drive-through programs; they are hosting a Takeaway Tuesdays and a Socially Distant Ice Cream Social. In these programs the seniors would just drive by and receive the items. Adult Softball is running beginning next week. The gymnastics program will be completing their Spring session at the Veteran's Memorial Park in Roseville. We will also be hosting the Little Scientists class, Creative Kids and Pound Class out at the park. Sara is waiting on some of our other instructors to see if any more are interested in having an outdoor class at one of the parks. Room and Gym rentals are currently not being done until we get orders from the governor. Nicole Urban from Macomb Community Action contacted in regards to hosting Meals on Wheels beginning September 8th. There was a gentleman that contacted the Recreation Authority in regards to hosting a fitness class out at the Huron Park Fitness Court. Details are still being worked out for class information. Congratulations to Sara for her one-year anniversary and being elected Vice President of NERPA.

Mr. Merucci, Mr. Lipinski, Mr. Adkins, Chris and Dave (from Carlisle-Wortman) were in on the meeting call to review, make changes and discuss the Master Plan.

ATTACHMENT 1 Scope of Work

The document will meet the requirements of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR Guidelines for the Development of Community Park, Recreation, Open Space, and Greenway Plans, 12/20/2016), as well as the standards set by the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA).

The process used to generate the Plan will consist of three phases: background studies, evaluation and plan development.

Background Studies. This phase involves gathering and updating data from the most recent census and other demographic surveys, existing documents, plans, and from field observations. The data is organized into three main categories: community description, recreation inventory, and resource inventory.

Evaluation. The second phase in the planning process considers R.A.R.E.'s parks and recreation services deficiencies and needs. Public meetings and other information gathering efforts take place to collect ideas and concerns from City officials, community stakeholders, staff and residents for the community park and recreation system. Critical to this portion of the process is the identification of issues and the establishment of priorities.

Plan Development. The last phase in the process involves plan development and adoption. Based on the input and needs identified, goals and objectives are formulated, and a realistic action plan developed. Strategies to implement the plan will also be discussed.

The following work plan outlines the tasks described above. Note that tasks are frequently implemented concurrently and often overlap.

TASK 1.0 Project Initiation

Prepare for and facilitate kick-off meeting with R.A.R.E. and cities of Eastpointe and Roseville staff to review work plan and schedule. Discuss public input format and development and distribution of survey materials. Establish a steering committee comprised of Eastpointe, Roseville, and R.A.R.E. representatives. Discuss MDNR community communication requirements and documentation procedures. Collect and review existing documents such as other Park plans, community needs surveys, neighboring community recreation plans and any other pertinent documents.

TASK 2.0 Community Description

- Update the role of parks and recreation in the communities.
- Update community descriptions, demographics, and physical and land use characteristics of the Roseville and Eastpointe using 2010 US Census, 2018 SEMCOG, ESRI, American Community Survey, and other available data resources.
- Review and summarize relevant information from supportive documents including Eastpointe and Roseville recreation and comprehensive master plans, R.A.R.E. budgets and plans, and other relevant materials.

• Update the description of the current administrative structure of R.A.R.E. and its relationship with Eastpointe and Roseville. It will also include a description of volunteer groups and any partnerships with other organizations.

TASK 3.0 Recreation/Resource Inventory

- Update the description of the parks, trails, open spaces, and recreation facilities. This will include individual city facilities, as well as the local and regional parks. An updated map of Eastpointe and Roseville's parks, trails and facilities will be prepared.
- Evaluate opportunities and needs for the community's recreation system.
- Evaluate progress of implementing ADA compliance efforts.
- Update information on previous grant-assisted projects.
- Identify park maintenance and equipment needs with assistance from the Steering Committee and Parks and Recreation Department staff.

TASK 4.0 Public Participation

- Identify national, state, and local park and recreation trends.
- Initiate the community engagement efforts, which will be determined during the initial stages of the project. [Note: The MDNR now requires two forms of public input for all recreation plans)
- Work with Steering Committee to plan and conduct two community engagement efforts (on-line survey, public meeting, workshop, focus groups) to receive input on desired park and recreation facilities and program improvements from residents and community interest groups such as sports organizations, seniors, and other community stakeholders.
- Compile and analyze the input received. Submit and present results to the Steering Committee to discuss modifications and to provide focus ideas for Master Plan development.

TASK 5.0 Master Plan

- Develop draft plan using MDNR and CAPRA guidelines.
- Submit and present draft plan to the Steering Committee for review. Revise as needed.
- Present preliminary draft to Eastpointe and Roseville's Park Commissions and revise plan to reflect comments received.
- Post revised draft on R.A.R.E., Eastpointe, and Roseville websites for the required 30-day public review. Hard copies of the draft will also be made available at the city halls, recreation center, and libraries.
- Receive comments, discuss revisions, and submit for approval to Steering Committee.
- Present Plan to Eastpointe and Roseville City Councils for public hearings and adoption.

ATTACHMENT 2 Project Schedule

The MDNR requires communities to submit recreation master plans prior to February 1 of each calendar year in order to be eligible for grant funding but allows for plans to be submitted to the MDNR website well in advance of that deadline. In a complicated scenario such as this where three separate entities need to support the plan, we have found that aiming for final adoption as early as possible is prudent. We fully intend to meet the required project schedule while remaining within our allotted budget. This schedule as shown below is flexible and can be adjusted to meet your needs.



Per the schedule, we are anticipating 10 total on-site meetings and monthly progress meetings as required. The progress meetings will be held via teleconference to help reduce costs. The City Council meetings and Public Hearings could potentially also be consolidated, which would further help to reduce overall costs. We will work with R.A.R.E. to help identify areas where we can reduce project costs while still adhering to plan requirements.

In our experience, the more time devoted to public outreach, the better the response rate. For this reason, we recommend seeking community input in the form of an online survey as soon as possible. A survey is not required, but it does give community members who might not be able to attend the outreach meetings an opportunity to provide input. An extended schedule would also allow for better photo documentation and would ensure that residents have the opportunity to experience your facilities while making informed decisions regarding community recreation needs.

SENIOR CENTER COVID-19 ACTIVITY ANALYSIS

A two-page summer edition of the Senior Activities Newsletter was sent to 227 seniors the first week of July, 2020. The mailing went to 118 current subscribers and 109 residents of Eastpointe and Roseville who either attend Shape-Up or come to the center on a regular basis. The newsletter was uploaded to the websites of RARE and the City of Roseville.

During the month of July and August, 2020, the Senior Center has scheduled eight outdoor events (six Takeaway Tuesdays and two Socially Distant Ice Cream Social). The Takeaway Tuesday events are based on regular Senior Center activity.

The Takeaway Tuesday events are days items are given away for participants to pick up and take home. Supplies are limited and distributed on a first come, first serve basis. An assortment of novelty ice creams are handed out during the Socially Distant Ice Cream Socials.

The four Takeaway Tuesdays held so far were July 14th – Adult Coloring Pages, July 21st – Gently Used Puzzles from the Pantry, July 28th – Free For All (items collected for our free table), and August 4th – Paperback Books from our Bookcases. The first Socially Distant Ice Cream Social was held on July 15th. In total, the activities had 53 attendees with some coming for more than one event. Twenty-seven people came for 1 activity, 6 came for 2 activities, 2 came for 3 activities, and 2 came for 4 activities.

In addition, all scheduled senior programs, SMART van transportation and drop-in activities will also be canceled. The building will remain open for registrations and inquiries.

Program Payment: Fees are due at time of registration.

Program Registration: A parent/quardian must register anyone under the age of 18 years old.

Registration Deadline: Sometimes programs are canceled because patrons wait too long to register. Most programs, unless otherwise noted, will have a registration deadline of two business days prior to the program start date (example: if the program is scheduled to start on a Friday, registration deadline will be on Wednesday. Monday program start dates will have a registration deadline of the prior Thursday). Please register early to avoid disappointment.

Late Registration Policy: Registration may be taken after the deadline, if in fact, the program has reached their minimum and there is space available. Waiting until the deadline to register does not guarantee you a spot in the program; the program may already be full. Registrations accepted after the deadline will be assessed a \$5 late fee. Recreation Authority Program Cancellation: The Recreational Authority of Roseville & Eastpointe reserves the right to cancel any class or program. In this case, a full refund will be processed. Online or Credit/Debit registrations will be less the processing fee. Classes or programs will be canceled one day prior to the start date of class in order to give registered participants adequate notice. However, if a class is scheduled to start on a Monday, notice will be given on the prior Friday.

Individual Cancellations: Should a participant need to cancel out of a class or program a \$5 processing fee will be held. Online or Credit/Debit registrations will be less the processing fee paid at the time of registration on top of the department processing fee. Sports league refunds will have an additional \$25 uniform fee processed, this uniform is yours and will be available for pick up once it is sorted by the Recreation Authority Center. Participants may cancel out of a class or program and receive a refund until the second week.

Refund Return: A refund check will be processed and mailed 3-4 weeks following the request for the refund.

Deposit: A \$100 deposit is required for Rooms 1, 2, & 3; a \$200 deposit is required for the Activity Center and Multi-Purpose Rooms. No deposit is required for pavilion rentals, full payment is due at the time of booking. Gym rentals may be booked without payment, balance will be due 10 business days (Monday – Friday) prior to rental date.

Set-up Policy for Room Rentals: Basic 4-hour room rentals are able to utilize a set-up time frame of one hour prior to the start time of the rental (example: if your rental is from 4:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. you may come in at 3:00 p.m. to set-up). There is no additional set-up time scheduled for pavilion or gym rentals.

Rental Request Deadline: If a rental is requested within 10 business days of the event date, the rental time must be within the pre-scheduled time for the building or park staff hours of that day. No pavilion rentals may be booked if there is not a pre-determined staff scheduled for that park on the requested date. Rentals booked within 10 business days from the reservation date will be assessed a \$25.00 surcharge.

Cancelation Policy: Room reservations canceled more than 5 business days (Monday – Friday) in advance will be assessed a \$50 processing fee. Pavilions & Gym rentals receive 50% of paid fee back if canceled more than 5 business days (Monday-Friday) in advance. Refund may take 3 – 4 weeks to process and will be mailed to the contact address directly. Cancellations of less than 5 business days (Monday – Friday) in advance will not be issued a refund.



Remaining Balance for Room Rentals: The balance must be paid 10 business days (Monday – Friday) prior to rental. If the rental fee is not paid 10 business days (Monday – Friday) in advance, a \$25 late fee will be assessed. If the balance is paid 10 business days (Monday – Friday) or less – the payment must be in cash, money order – no personal checks will be accepted. All payments must be made during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Items/Services not permitted at Recreation Authority Center: Professional decorators, event planners, DJ's, alcohol, candles, hay and table confetti/glitter are NOT permitted in any room.

Park Alcohol Policy: Alcohol is NOT allowed in Roseville parks. Alcohol is allowed in Eastpointe Parks. Glass is not permitted in any park at any time.

Entertainment Policy for Pavilion Rentals: Any form of additional entertainment (petting farms, inflatables, train) require an additional form to be completed and returned to our office NO LATER THAN TEN BUSINESS DAYS (Monday - Friday) PRIOR TO SCHEDULED EVENT. In addition, we DO NOT ALLOW DJ'S or BANDS to perform in park during individual event rentals. Forms will NOT be accepted within ten business days prior to the scheduled rental.

Entertainment Policy for Recreation Authority Center (Gym rentals only): Inflatables require an additional form to be completed and returned to our office NO LATER THAN TEN BUSINESS DAYS (Monday - Friday) PRIOR TO SCHEDULED EVENT. Forms will NOT be accepted within ten business days prior to the scheduled rental. If your party is having "entertainers" such as clowns, or magicians, a 48-hour notice to the staff is required, however, no additional form is required.

Day of Event: Responsible Party (contract holder) must be on site for the entire rental, the room/gym or pavilion will not be available until renter arrives. Additional names may not be added to the contract.

Deposit Return: Deposit will be refunded and mailed 3-4 weeks following the rental date, provided the condition of the room does not require additional maintenance, renter does not exceed rental period and contract requirements are adhered to. If renter contract requirements are not adhered to, amount withheld from the deposit is made by the discretion of the Recreational Authority.

RENTAL INFORMATION

All Room, Gym and Pavilion rentals must be reserved in person during the Main Office hours (Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.). Rental rates posted are for residents of Eastpointe or Roseville. For any other rates or policies please call Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. or visit our website: rare-mi.org.

Room Rentals

May be reserved 6 months in advance of date. Food and beverage services must comply with local, county and state regulations. No alcohol, smoking, DJ's, candles, confetti/glitter, hay, event planners or personal decorators are permitted in the Recreation Authority Center. Room deposits are required at the time of reservation. Rentals are for a 4-hour block of time with 1-hour prior for setup.

Pavillion Rentals (DJ's, bands, ground fires or vehicles are not permitted on park grounds)

Beginning Monday, February 1st, we will start accepting reservations for the 2021 season. The rental season is between the first weekend in May and the last weekend in September. During the months of May and September, we offer pavilion rentals for Saturdays and Sundays only. Restrooms will only be open during designated party rental times. Rentals are for a 6-hour period of time between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

INFLATABLE/ENTERTAINMENT POLICY FOR RECREATION AUTHORITY CENTER & PAVILION RENTALS

All inflatables and additional entertainment (petting farms, tents, etc) must be through the approved rental companies. Rental groups utilizing one of our pavilions or gyms must complete an additional inflatable or entertainment form and return to the Recreation Authority Center 10 business days (Monday – Friday) prior to their rental in order to be permitted use of inflatables or entertainment. Gym rentals will only be permitted use of inflatables, all other entertainment will not be approved. You must have a paid rental in order to have any inflatables or other entertainment permitted at your event. A vendor list is available on our website (rare-mi.org) or at the Recreation Authority Center.


Trick or Treat Trail


