### **ANITA CHAPMAN SCHOLARSHIPS**

Applicants must be year-round residents of Richmond and High School graduates. The awards may be used for education or training at a four or two year college, graduate school, vocational school, or technical school or in any other full-time education program considered appropriate by the scholarship committee. Academic achievement and community contributions are key to success in winning this award. The Anita Chapman Scholarship Fund was established on August 25th, 1971, in memory of Anita Chapman, a Richmond resident and mother of three who died at the age of 34. The purpose of the fund is to assist deserving Richmond young people with their education beyond high school, and they may apply during any educational year. At least two awards are given annually, and winners are not barred from applying in subsequent years.

### **MORRAY AWARD**

Maze and Jerry Morray retired to Richmond where they enjoyed their dream house, grew their own vegetables, supplemented passive solar heating with wood from their own woodlot, and enjoyed skiing at Jiminy Peak. Jerry served on the Planning Board. The Chapman Scholarship guidelines apply to this award which will also consider financial need.

### **SARAH MACDONALD SCHOLARSHIP**

Sarah MacDonald was a Richmond one-room schoolhouse teacher and set up special classes to teach English to the Italian men who came to work at the iron smelting furnace in the southern part of town and their wives. The scholarship in her name was established by Dorothy Boyle of Richmond and given for the first time in 1987. The Chapman guidelines apply to this award.

### **JOYCE C. SPENCE AWARD**

Joyce Spence was a young mother and Richmond resident when she died in 1988. She was secretary of the Parent-Teacher Organization and active in its fundraising projects. The PTO established the scholarship in her memory in 1988, and the first award was given in 1989. The Chapman guidelines apply to this award.

### **WILLIAM A. AND HAZEL B. DICKSON SCHOLARSHIP**

The William A and Hazel B. Dickson Scholarship was established in the Fall of 1999 in memory of William Dickson and in honor of his wife Hazel. Longtime residents of Richmond, the Dicksons have made countless contributions to the community over the years. A combination of memorial donations and contributions from Dickson family members made it possible for the first scholarship to be awarded in 2000. The Dicksons specified that home schooling students would be eligible for this scholarship as well other high school graduates. In other respects, the Chapman guidelines apply. The fund will be invested and administered by the Chapman directors.

### **VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT/MALNATI FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP**

The Volunteer Fire Department/Malnati Family Scholarship fund was established in memory of Michael J Malnati and Martin D Malnati Sr. in 1997, the Malnati Scholarship became part of the Richmond Scholarship group. Established in 1984, the scholarship is supported annually by the Volunteer Fire Department barbeque. The Malnati Scholarship follows the Chapman guidelines.

### **HELEN AND HAROLD KINGSLEY SCHOLARSHIP**

Helen Kingsley was a native of Richmond, educated in the one room schoolhouse. She was the town clerk for many years. Harold Kingsley worked at General Electric for more than 40 years and served as Fire Chief in Richmond. Harold held many of the Line Officer Positions and was a perfectionist in all he did.

### **GEORGE KINGSLEY SCHOLARSHIP**

George Kingsley was in the Navy for four years. For 40 years he worked for Berkshire Frosted Foods managing various positions under several owners until he retired. He was a top notch fighter in the Richmond Fire Department for 35 years.

For many years, the Kingsley brothers were members of the Richmond Volunteer Fire Department. It was a time when special phones rang to call volunteers to a fire. They were there to answer emergency calls and to help at the annual Volunteer Fireman's chicken barbecue. With family support two scholarships have been established in their honor.
