PEDDLERS LICENSE

A 'PEDDLER' IS ANY PERSON WHO GOES FROM PLACE TO PLACE, TRAVELING BY FOOT, WAGON, CAR, ETC, OFFERING THE GOODS THEY ARE CARRYING FOR SALE. THIS INCLUDES HAWKERS, HUCKSTERS AND ICE CREAM VENDORS. (Section 14-361)

<u>FEES:</u>	License	\$200.00 per day (Maximum of \$2,000.00 per year)
	Investigative fee	\$ 60.00 per person
	Fingerprinting	Must be completed by State Registered Agency
	I.D. Cards	\$ 2.00 each card (3 required)

The non-refundable Investigation and Fingerprinting Fees for each member age 18 and older are due at the time of application. **Applicant must make an appointment with the Detective Bureau for fingerprinting at 734-281-4215.**

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Applications provided by the City Clerk's Office must be filled out completely.
2. Applicant must present a driver's license or valid picture ID.
3. Copy of the proof of insurance, registration and a description of each vehicle to be used together with a copy of each driver's license. Ice cream trucks and other vehicles will require a police vehicle inspection to ensure they are in good working order.
4. Three (3) small recent photographs of the applicant. The ID Cards must be carried on the person(s) at all times when working within the City.

RESTRICTIONS:

1. Peddlers may not engage in business before 9:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. or sundown, whichever occurs first.
2. Peddlers do not have exclusive rights to any location in the public streets and are not permitted a stationary location.
3. Peddlers can not operate in an area where operations might impede traffic or inconvenience the public.
4. Peddlers cannot use loud speakers, sound amplifiers, blow horns, ring bells or use any other sound device on any street, alley, park or public place in the City.
5. A Peddler's license is not transferable and must be shown to any police officer upon request.

A license may be denied for misrepresentation or false statements, violation of the Code of Ordinances, conviction of crime or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or conducting business in an unlawful manner affecting health safety or general welfare of the public.
