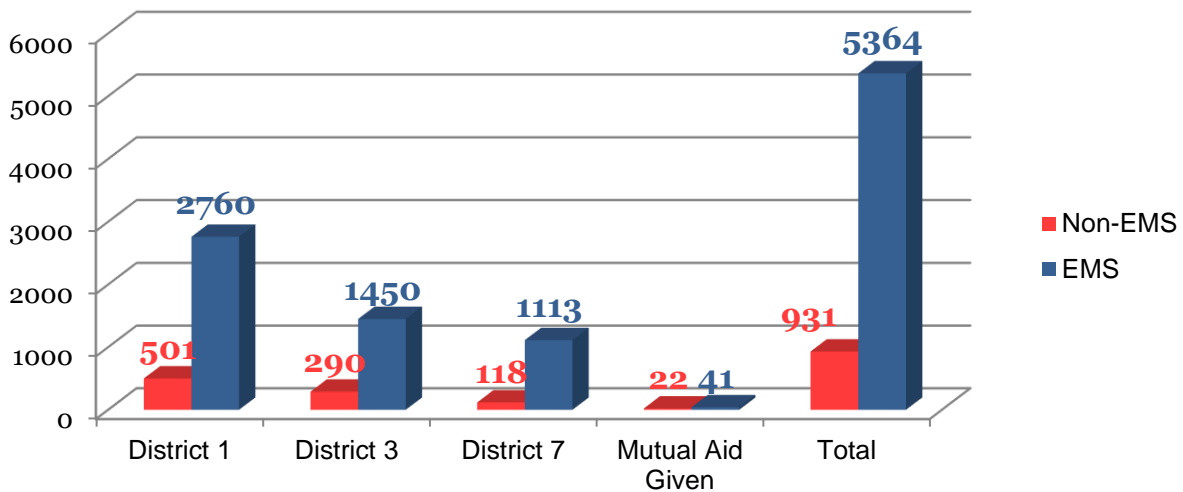

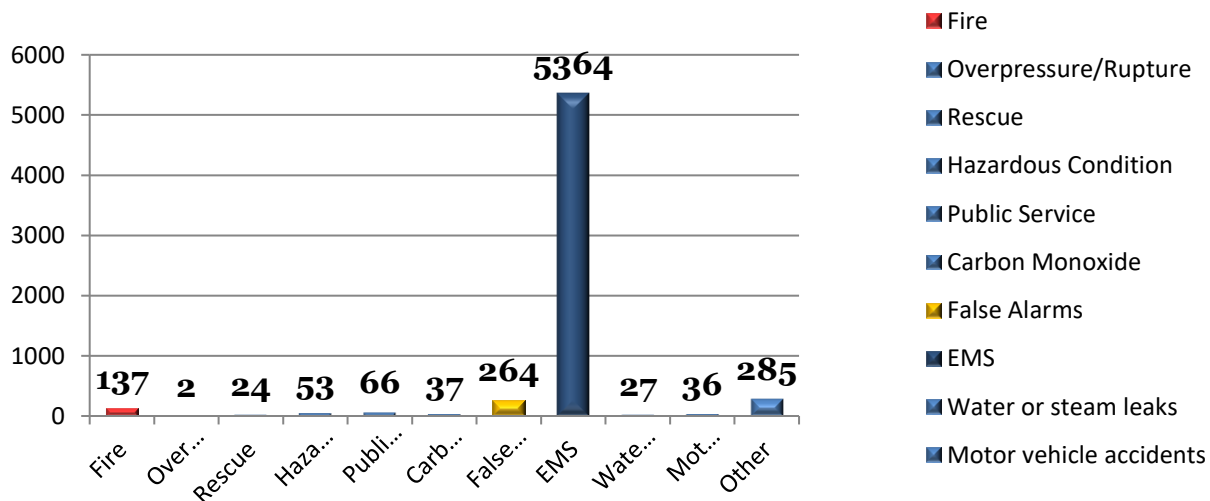


## Operational Reports



There were 6,295 reports generated in 2022. 51.8% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 27.6% and 19.5% respectively. Mutual aid to other areas in Erie County accounted for 1% of all calls.

## Incident Type



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 85.2%. There were 137 fires reported in 2022. False alarms represented 4.2% of all emergent activity. There was an estimated \$1,544,000.00 in fire loss in 2022.



## Community Involvement

Sandusky Fire Department participated in many community activities throughout 2022, totaling 432 hours of non-emergent community involvement.

*Delivered Santa Claus and The Easter Bunny to Washington Park and around city neighborhoods*

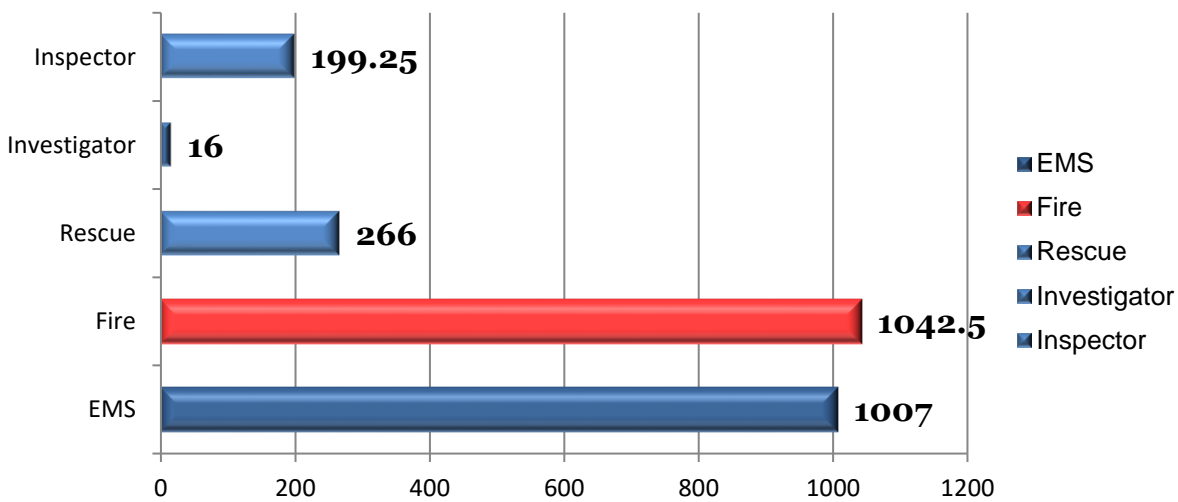
*Worked with The Commons of Providence to hold the annual Firefighters Shoe Fund Breakfast*

*The Firefighter Charity Fund purchased 135 pairs of shoes for fire victims and Erie County children*

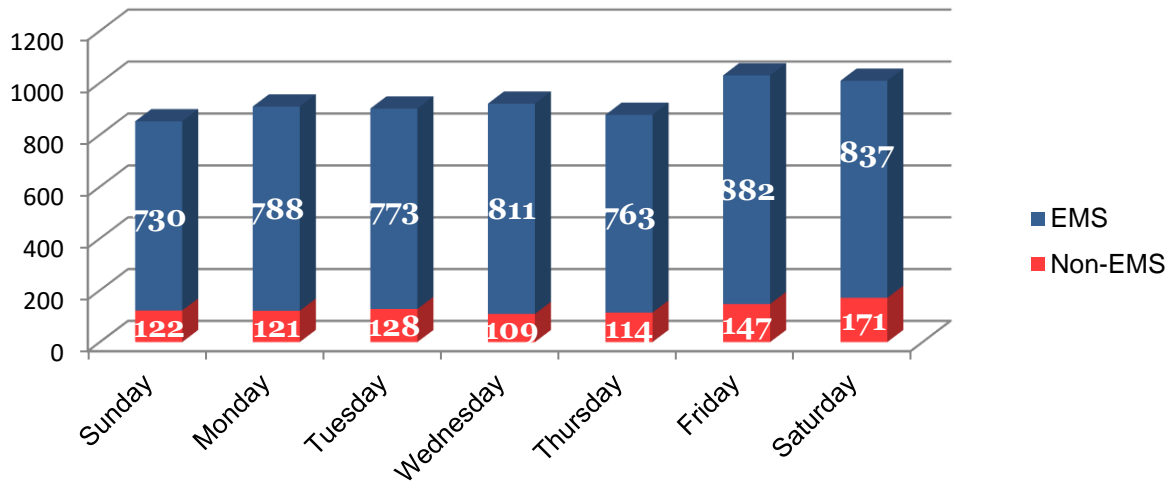
## Training Analysis

## Average Daily Staffing

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 11.9 firefighters in 2022. Any drop in staffing level below 11 firefighters per day was supplemented with voluntary or mandatory overtime call-in of off-duty personnel.

## Mutual Aid

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 63 times. SFD also received automatic aid 18 times and mutual-aid 28 times in 2022 from other agencies within Erie County.
