

Message from Chief John Orzech





Hello friends and crazy cousins!

At the beginning of 2015, I was tasked to accomplish three primary goals for the police department. These goals were developed with Commissioner Naomi Twine, as the police department liaison to the City Commission. Those three goals were the implementation of Body-Worn Cameras, diversity training, and expanded recruitment of personnel. The police department accomplished all of these goals set forth and much more.

Body-Worn Cameras (BWC's) has been the catch phrase throughout the nation for law enforcement and the communities we serve. With a generous donation from the Randolph J & Estelle M. Dorn Foundation, these cameras were purchased. We implemented our BWC's in June. Each officer has a BWC assigned to them. The Toledo Buffalo Soldiers, under the leadership of Earl Mack provided Cultural Competency training to the entire department. The Buffalo Soldiers hosted a public forum and school program on "What to do when stopped by the police?" The diversity and cultural competency training was very informative and well received by the officers, the public and the school children. In collaboration with the Civil Service Clerk, Deb Leslie, and the Civil Service Commission, the National Testing Network (NTN) has become the testing site for officers seeking full-time employment with the department. The NTN format doubled our previous candidate pool and increased minority candidates taking the test.

Training and educational opportunities for the officers has been a priority, since my appointment as Chief. In 2012, the department logged 900 hours of training. In 2014, we increased to 2,406 hours and in 2015 our officers logged 3,335 hours. The State of Ohio, in 2015, only required four hours of mandatory training for each officer. I believe that the more we train, the better prepared our officers are in dealing with the many intricacies of this profession. Some of the inclusive training for each officer at the department was Verbal Judo – Tactical Communications, First aid & CPR, legal updates and the mandatory instruction on Domestic Violence – Lethality Factors. Officers attended specialized training on many other topics as well.

A launch of our Community Impact Officer (CIO) position started in 2015, with the funding created from the passage of Issue 8, was approved by the voters at the end of 2014. Officer Eric Costante was selected to fill this critically important role. The CIO is similar to the Community Policing philosophies of the past, getting officers into the community. Officer Costante performs neighborhood walks, downtown walks in the businesses, and works closely with housing and code enforcement on the elimination of blight. The CIO is focused on the problems in the neighborhoods and developing strategies to fix them. So far it has been a very positive program, which we look to expand in 2016.

Our department and officers continue to remain focused and cognizant on the relationship the police department has with the community. The National Night Out – Touch a Truck event was a huge success this year once again. In addition we've attended many community events, passing out trinkets such as the red, white and blue fiber optic lights to over 500 kids on the 4th of July, 500 finger flashlights, 500 glow bands, 1,500 Trick-or-Treat bags and 4,000 pieces of candy during Halloween. Community engagement and involvement has been and will continue to be important to us, as we continue to serve and protect this community.

In 2016, the department will be focused on how we can positively impact the Bi-Centennial Strategic Plan. Safety of the community is paramount for the continued revitalization of our city. We look forward to working with our community business partners, citizens, and other city staff as we look to celebrate the cities Bi-Centennial in 2018.








SPD Budget Pie Chart





SPD Revenue Chart





Traffic Enforcement Graph




Written Warnings Pie Chart







Throughout the years Justice has contributed to numerous drug finds, money forfeitures, and criminal apprehensions. In 2014 Justice received the 'Meritorious Award' for his bravery apprehending



an armed suspect who was threatening police with a gun. The training and courage instilled in Justice reflected his heroism that day. Without his assistance this dangerous situation could have resulteded tragically.
