



Message from Chief Jared Oliver

2023 was another busy year for the Sandusky Police Department. Our officers handled over 29,000 calls for service in 2023, completing over 13,750 reports. In addition to handling calls for service our Officers focus on providing proactive traffic enforcement in an effort to maintain safe travel for the motoring public. This proactive patrol resulted in over 9,000 traffic stops, issuing in excess of 6,670 warnings and 2,400 citations. Some of the most common traffic violations include speeding, traffic light and sign violations.

Staffing levels fluctuated throughout the year. The department is budgeted for 53 full-time Officers – we currently have 49 full-time Officers. Like many other departments nationwide our focus remains on recruiting the finest Officers to serve our community. My mission as Chief is to employ a diverse workforce that reflects the community we serve.

The Justice Center renovation continued in 2023. The first phase of construction was completed in early November. Our entire operation moved to the north side of the building to allow for the completion of the second phase of construction. The completed renovation is spectacular. The new facility has provided our staff with a building that they are proud of. I can't thank the city commission, the city manager, and the community enough for their support in this project.

Our Officers continued to place a daily emphasis on community policing in 2023. The Officers conduct daily patrols of the neighborhoods; they stop and talk to the residents, play games with the children, and walk the neighborhoods. Officers also conducted thousands of neighborhood, park, and business walks in 2023. Our community Impact Officers alone participated in excess of 700 hours of community events this year.

Some highlights of our community policing initiatives in 2023 were:

Officers assisted OHgo, the Sandusky branch of the NAACP, Care and Share, Project Noelle, Serving our Seniors, Ability Works, the Sandusky City Schools, and many other organizations throughout the year.

We hosted Ice cream socials in our parks and two Bike with the Blue events where our officers taught bicycle safety to the children and then accompanied them on bike ride to local ice cream shops.

We worked with the Parks and Recreation Department to host the annual Touch a Truck event again this year. We also assisted the recreation department with Safety Town and several youth events at our city parks, splash pads and the winter break camp.

Officer Hill-Morton, in conjunction with Sandusky City Schools, again led a highly successful youth flag football league. He and several Officers and Firefighters coached during the four-week program.

We again participated in Cedar Point's Trick or Treat and Trunk or Treat in Perkins Township. Officers also handed out candy in the neighborhoods for the city-wide Trick or Treat on Halloween.

We again assisted with a coat, hat, and glove drive, toy drives, and community food drives this winter for those in need. We also partnered with Meijer's again this holiday season for their Shop with a Hero event.

Please allow me to thank all of you for the kind words, cards, snacks, donations, phone calls, and friendly waves. The support our community shows our Officers is amazing.

We look forward to continuing to foster positive relationships with the community through our community policing initiatives in 2024.




