**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
BAYFRONT CORRIDOR COMMITTEE
THURSDAY, JUNE 4, 2020 AT 7:30 A.M.
HELD REMOTELY BY WAY OF
MICROSOFT TEAMS MEETING**

PRESENT:

Members: Chair Carl McGookey, Dr. Bill Semans, Joe Hayberger, Mike Zuilhof, and Secretary Kevin Zeiher.

Also present were City Manager Eric Wobser, City Engineer Aaron Klein, and City employees Greg Voltz.

This virtual meeting was called to order by Carl McGookey at 7:35 AM. Lacking a quorum, no official action was taken.

STAFF UPDATE
OLD BUSINESS:

City Engineer Aaron Klein presented updates on the following projects:

JACKSON STREET PIER RECONSTRUCTION

The pier has been open to pedestrians only but no vehicles. Work was progressing on the structures: Pavilion, ticket house and foundations for the Homeland Security

building were underway. Mr. Zuilhof congratulated Mr. Klein and the City staff for the outstanding result of the makeover of Jackson Street Pier. These comments were echoed by all in attendance.

Vehicular traffic is expected by the end of next week or by June 20th.

Flooding on the northern end with wave action was dealt with by way of the backflow preventers in place with zero water near the pavilion.

SHORELINE DRIVE RECONSTRUCTION

Asphalt had been applied to the both sides of the road, with west bound traffic only. Mid-June or several more weeks should get the project closer to completion. The final touches of signage, plantings, trees and the dumpster enclosures are still in the works. The goal is July 4th with two way traffic at that time.

THE LANDING

Mr. Klein reported that the City is working through the title issues and clear up acquisition. Budgetary concerns are also being considered.

WEST END UTILITY AND CONNECTIVITY

This project will provide pedestrian pathways by way of sidewalks both on the north side and the south side of Venice Road in the highest residential areas with connecting cross walks. Progress was

shown while Cedar Point was closed, but work still needs to be done.

Mr. Hayberger also inquired about the sidewalks and utilities on Venice Road serving the residential areas.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Zuilhof commented on the need for a City Scape after all of the work that has been done. Mr. Voltz commented that was in item for discussion.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Bayfront Corridor Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 8:19 AM upon motion by Dr. Semans, joined by Mr. Hayberger.
