**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
BAYFRONT CORRIDOR COMMITTEE
THURSDAY, AUGUST 5, 2021 AT 7:30 A.M.**

PRESENT:

Also, in attendance were City Engineer
Aaron Klein, and Administrative
Assistant Kristen Barone.

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Bill
Semans. The Minutes of the July 1, 2021
meeting had been circulated and upon
motion by Joe Hayberger, joined by Kevin
Zeiber, the Minutes were approved as
submitted.

OLD BUSINESS:

- MEIGS STREET/JUSTICE CENTER

Mr. Klein reported that all work was
underway by the contractor RL Bowen to
coordinate the work at the Justice Center

and the Police Department at 222 Meigs Street. The breakdown of the area to occupied is Sandusky Municipal Court 40% and the Sandusky Police Department 60% including contributions by the Court and based upon square footage and the needs of each.

- CAUSEWAY WETLANDS

Mr. Klein reported that the plan is ready to go out for bids. This is a part of the Sandusky Bay Initiative which includes 3 projects and this part is number 2. This includes a atone revetment wall around the perimeter after which the foliage will be replanted. Boater safety is also very important. This includes the area north of the high bridge near Kaferloo Island.

- SANDUSKY BAY PATHWAY

Mr. Klein reported that a grant application has been submitted to the Feds for \$18 million for multimobile and to fill in the landing at Cedar Point Drive.

- THE LANDING

Mr. Klein reported that The Landing is moving forward and we are working with Marci Kaptor's office for a \$4 million grant for the work. The City is still in the acquisition phase but moving forward. If the grant is approved there will be a delay to permit the requisite planning.

- WEST END CONNECTIVITY

Mr. Klein reported that the project is being finalized. .

- COMMUNITY INPUT AND DISCUSSION
THE JACKSON STREET PIER

McKenzie It was apparent to those who have utilized and enjoyed Jackson Street Pier that the ingress and egress is narrow, intentionally. The design contributes to that safety by requiring vigilance by drivers and pedestrians.

It was also pointed out that many positive comments had been received from those who had not visited in the past several years how vibrant and engaging the City had become all of which is a tribute to not only the current occupants of City government but bridging back to the previous forward thinking employees and administrators.
