INTRODUCTION

PUBLIC ARTS & CULTURE COMMISSION

The City of Sandusky Public Art & Placemaking Plan was adopted in 2018. The plan calls for the Public Arts & Culture Commission to create an annual work plan to set goals and projects each year.

Implementing the Public Art Plan

The Public Art & Placemaking Plan calls for the utilization of attributes within Sandusky to develop projects that will stand the test of time and create memorable experiences. These projects should be highly viable, add to the geographic diversity of the city's public art collection, and maximize interactive opportunities and vantage points.

The projects proposed within this work plan follow the guidance of the goals and principles set forth within the City of Sandusky Public Art & Placemaking Plan.

Annual Approval

The Public Art Work Plan outlines all projects that will be initiated or in progress within the coming fiscal year. The Work Plan is developed annually by the Public Arts & Culture Commission in partnership with the Sandusky Planning Division and submitted to the City Commission as part of the budget for review and approval.

DEVELOPMENT

CREATING THE 2023 WORK PLAN

The 2023 Work Plan was created in September – December, 2022, within **four** regularly-scheduled meetings of the Public Arts & Culture Commission. The four steps to creating the work plan are outlined below.

Session One: Brainstorm

Planning staff facilitated a discussion of the highlights, challenges, and opportunities of the 2022 work plan and brainstorm for 2023 projects. Commissioners confirmed much of the ideas and priorities brainstormed for the 2022 work plan remained relevant.

Session Two: Budget

The commission members discussed what level to continue each of the ongoing programs from 2022 and before, as well as priority projects for 2023. Staff drafted this work plan after session two.

Session Three: Draft Work Plan

Commissioners provided comments on the draft work plan and budget.

Session Four: Finalize

Commissioners provided final comments and edits to the work plan document and moved to adopt the plan on XX DATE.

PROJECTS

2023 PROPOSED PROJECTS & PROGRAMS

The 2023 work plan includes support for ongoing programs and projects to increase the permanent public art on display in the city.

The 2023 Work Plan included seven propose projects and programs. Commission members chose to continue and build on the work prioritized in the creation of the 2022 Work Plan, which were a) prioritized by items that had the largest consensus across the group and b) were determined to have the highest impact for elevating the arts in the community.

The seven proposed projects are:

1. Columbus Avenue Streetscape Art
2. City Hall Gallery
3. Sculpture Purchases
4. Artist Lecture Series
5. ArtBox Program
6. Artist Led Grant Program
7. Lange Trust Sculpture Program

PROJECT 1

COLUMBUS AVENUE STREETScape ART

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

In 2023, the city will complete design process to redesign Columbus Avenue to become Downtown’s Most Vibrant Street (see Downtown Master Plan). Public art will be a critical component of the final streetscape. The Arts Commission will participate in the design process and plans to fund a significant public art component as part of the street redesign or as a stand-alone project when the new streetscape is installed.

BUDGET:

Unknown. Allocation of budget per year for an expected 2024/2025 project timeline. See table:

PROJECT 2

CITY HALL GALLERY

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

In 2021, the Public Arts and Culture Commission created and installed the City Hall Gallery and its inaugural exhibition. The exhibition was on display from September, 2021 to December 2022. The 2022-2023 exhibit will display until fall 2023, when the commission will put out a call for artists for artwork to curate the 2023 – 2024 installation of the gallery.

BUDGET:

\$200 budget for maintenance and equipment to install 2023 gallery in Q3/Q4 2023

PROJECT 3

SCULPTURE PURCHASES

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Commission would like to pursue two or more sculpture purchases in 2023. *A Sign of Love*, currently on display in the traffic circle on Jackson Street Pier, will be pursued for purchase to remain at this location. Additionally, the commission intends to work with the Lange Trust or others to contribute funds to support the purchase of one or more sculptures by Jerzy Jotka Kedziora. In 2022-2023, the Lange Trust of the Sandusky Library brought 20 of these hanging sculptures to Sandusky for a temporary installation titled *Over the Horizon of Lake Erie*.

BUDGET:

\$5,200 A Sign of Love
\$30,000 Select Kedziora allocation

PROJECT 4

ARTIST LECTURE SERIES

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Public Arts & Culture Commissioners would like to elevate the knowledge of public art in Sandusky. A series of artists and/or public art organizations will be pursued to conduct lectures during regular meetings of the commission, either in person or remotely. Topics may include broadening the community understanding of an individual artist's process, how to effectively call for artists, best practices for defining scopes for commissioning art pieces, and community involvement in public art selection.

BUDGET:

\$5,000

PROJECT 5

ARTBOX PROGRAM

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Sandusky ArtBox program was launched in 2022 to showcase the work of local artists and enhance the built environment across the city. The program has 5 projects available in carryover from the 2022 budget and will expand to 5 additional projects for a total of 10 available in 2023. Applications for projects are available on the city website and will be considered in the order they are received by staff.

BUDGET:

\$2,500 carryover from 2022

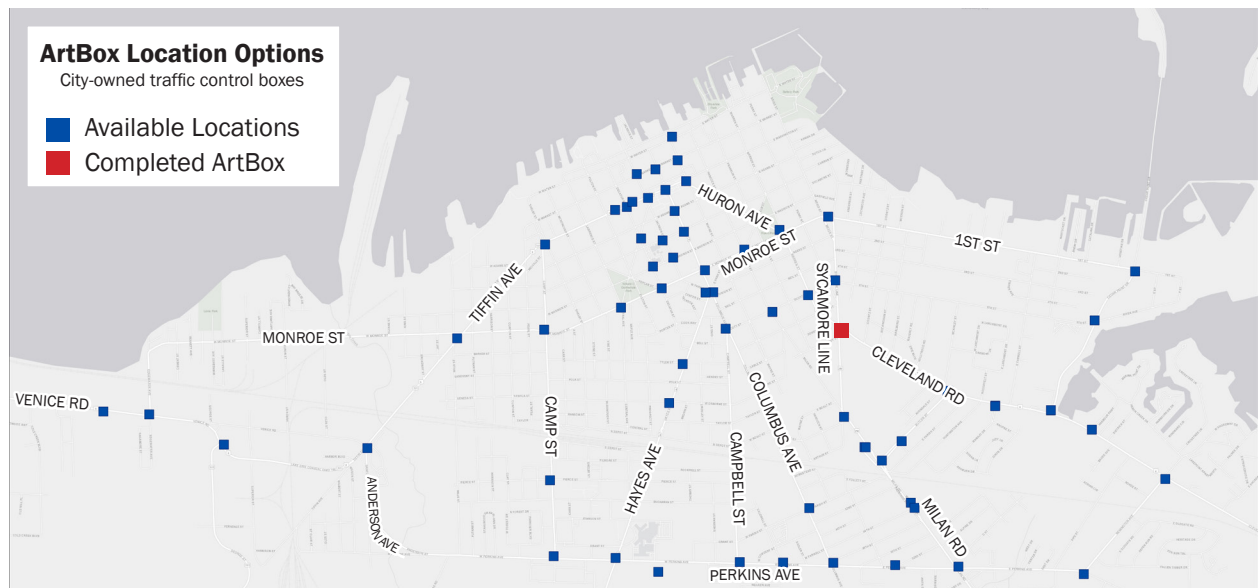
\$2,500 2023

\$500 each (\$200 to the artist for supplies up front and \$300 at completion) for up to ten boxes

PROJECT 6

ARTIST LED GRANT PROGRAM

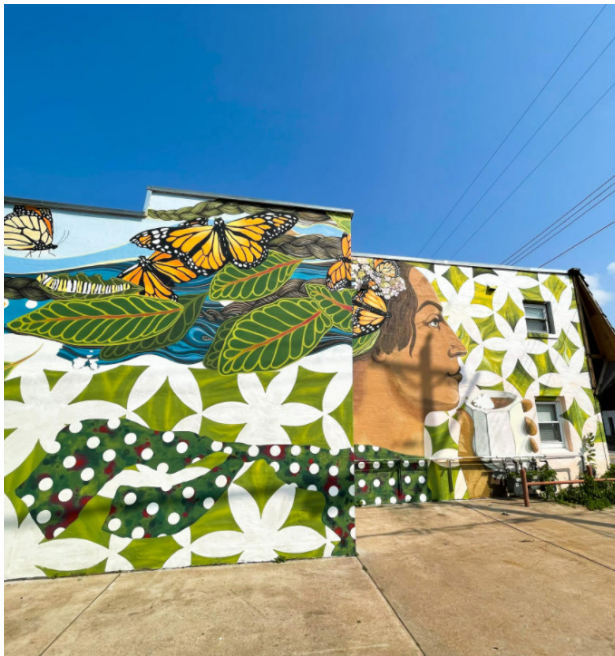
PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Public Arts & Culture Commission invites artists to submit a grant application for the design and installation of a piece of artwork(s) to be placed or viewed by the public. Artists who are interested in applying for the Artist Led Grant Program are encouraged to attend a Public Arts & Culture Commission meeting to discuss their idea(s) with the commission. One or more grants may be funded in 2023, within the total program budget of \$10,000. Submissions are not limited to murals or sculptures.

BUDGET:

\$10,000

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:









Continue to collaborate with the Lange Trust for placement and selection of their annual Midwest Sculpture Initiative. Consider future initiatives that engage the community to visit the sculptures and periodic purchase of sculptures to add to the city’s permanent public art collection.

BUDGET:
