<u>ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:</u> Requesting legislation for approval of Change Order No. 1 and Final for the Pierce Street Reconstruction Project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: This project was awarded to Erie Blacktop, Inc. at the August 12, 2019 city commission meeting per ordinance 19-134 in the amount of \$356,879.71.

This project provided for the Reconstruction of Pierce Street, from Thomas to Campbell Street and resurfacing of Pierce St. from Thomas to Hayes Ave.

Change Order No. 1 and Final, a deduct in the amount of \$19,084.83, represents final quantities installed in the field by the contractor. See attached summary sheet of all quantities.

ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION: Legislation approving Change Order #1 & Final for the 2018 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement project for Precision Paving, Inc.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: All sidewalk work was completed in a timely fashion in 2018, but the contractor was unable to perform concrete repairs on the external face and surface on the Meigs Street Pier due to high bay elevations and weather conditions that began towards the end of 2018. All materials purchased to complete this work have exceeded their expiration date and can no longer be used. Therefore, both parties have agreed to non-perform this remaining task and the City will not be responsible to pay for unused materials. The final quantities for the 2018 project are on the attached final change order.

In additional to residential sidewalk repairs, this project included all of the new concrete at Central Park, ADA-accessible curb ramps at the Amtrak and Sandusky Transit station and sidewalks in front of the Harborview Senior Living on Franklin Street.

<u>BUDGETARY INFORMATION</u>: The original contract with Precision Paving, Inc., was for \$150,986.70. Change Order #1 & Final decreases the contract by \$36,150.20 to a total of \$114,836.50, resulting in a 23.9% savings. The full project, including retainage for work performed, was paid in full in 2018 from Capital Parks and Recreation funds, Sandusky Neighborhood Initiative funds, and Issue 8 infrastructure funds. No additional payment will be required to close out this project.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED</u>: It is recommended that an Ordinance be passed approving Change Order #1 and Final for a reduction of \$36,150.20 for Precision Paving, Inc., from Milan, Ohio and that the necessary legislation be passed under suspension of the rules and in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter to close out the project immediately and release the contractor's bond and insurance.

ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION: Requesting legislation authorizing the the expenditure of funds for roof, brick siding and masonry repair work at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Plant Dewatering Building through a joint purchasing program, authorized by the Ohio Revised Code, section 9.48 "joint purchasing program". U.S. Communities (AKA OMNIA Partners) Government Purchasing Alliance is a free government purchasing cooperative with the purchasing power of up to 90,000 public agencies. U.S. Communities offers materials, vehicles, supplies and services. U.S. Communities has been providing government and school procurement resources since 1996. U.S. Communities is endorsed by both the County Commissioners Association of Ohio and the Ohio Association of School Business Officials. The City is Member Number 2417304. In this instance of using the joint purchasing platform, materials will be supplied by the Garland Company of Cleveland, OH, with Brick siding and masonry repair services being provided by Western Specialty Contractors of Cleveland, Ohio and roofing installation and repair services being provided by Alumni Roofing Co. of Lexington, OH.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Wastewater Treatment Plant dewatering building is a circa 1958 building that has taken on minimal renovations through the duration of its life. In 2017, the metal roofing portion of the Dewatering building was installed. Despite this replacement, there is still water intruding into the Dewatering building in other areas. A report commissioned by the City earlier in 2019 and developed by Poulos and Schmid Design Group revealed multiple entry-points for water along this building. A design specification detailing the locations and types of work to remedy these problems, and seal the outside brick before more extensive damage happens has been developed by Poulos and Schmid Design group.

This project will tuck-point areas of eroding and failing mortar in the brick façade of the building. Caulk will be replaced in areas where it has weathered and degraded over time and become inflexible, which has torn and separated, allowing water to intrude into the inner walls, causing damage to the break room area of the building. Repairs will also be made to the lentils surrounding doors and windows around the building. The flat gravel roof portion, showing the most extensive damage, would need to be removed and a vapor barrier added, then be covered with a new roof membrane and the 2017 metal roof would be coated to protect it and waterproof the exposed metal fasteners.

This purchase would include all items and work listed on the attached proposal, including a 30-year warranty on the new roof and a 10 year warranty on all wall materials and a 2 year warranty on workmanship.

Purchases would be made in accordance with U.S. Communities Government Purchasing Alliance, which allows local political subdivisions to purchase items that have been competively bid from a successful vendor thereby giving the City the benefit of the programs competively bid price and eliminating the necessity of formal bidding by the City.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION: The total cost for this repair work is \$199,966, which includes materials, delivery, installation, warranties and contingencies, and will be paid from the Sewer Fund. The funds for this work have been included in the last rate increase.

ACTION REQUESTED: It is requested that legislation be approved for the expenditure of funds for roofing removal replacement and repairs, brick siding and masonry repairs and a new in-wall drainage system from the Garland/DBS, Inc. of Cleveland, OH, through The U.S. Communities Government Purchasing Alliance; using Garland/DBS Inc. Master Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (MICPA) # PW1925 and that the necessary legislation be passed under suspension of the rules and in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to repair the current damage and prevent future damage to the building and the electrical and control systems housed within the building.

ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION: Requesting legislation authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for upgrades and licensing from Rovisys Automation & Information Solutions of Aurora, Ohio.

Also requesting legislation authorizing the City Manager to purchase Dell hardware from Dell Computer Inc. of Round Rock, TX through the State of Ohio Department of Administrative Services Cooperative Purchasing Program (Contract #534109).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Our water plant SCADA system, which is the monitoring and control system that allows operators to effectively run the facility and show real-time information, including flows, chemicals, alarms, and many other parameters, has been on the refresh list for a while now and the time has come to carry out some much-needed upgrades. The hardware is between five and seven years old and is prone to failure. Our current software versioning for both the computer operation and the control software is past its support cycle and neither can be upgraded without the other at this point.

Proposed Solution:

We will purchase a virtual server to carry the processing cycles and the logging requirements for day to day operations. We will purchase new workstations for the operators to oversee and manage the plant in a reliable manner. At the same time, we will purchase an up to date version of our control software and have our existing configurations upgraded and cleaned up in line with current best practices. This software will be installed across the new hardware to provide the best and most reliable controls available and ensure all of our reporting requirements. With the purchase of new hardware we will complete this project without interruptions to daily operations.

In 2018, RoviSys was selected through a qualifications process to upgrade the SCADA system at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant and in order to maintain consistency and continuity at the plants, RoviSys was selected perform the upgrades at the BIWW plant.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION: The total cost for the upgrade software licensing and services from Rovisys is \$43,219, and the price for the hardware from Dell is \$16,413.73. The total cost for this project is \$59,632.73 and will be paid from the Water Fund.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> It is recommended that the proper legislation be prepared authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for services and upgrade licensing from Rovisys Automation & Information Solutions of Aurora, Ohio, and authorizing the City Manager to purchase Dell hardware from Dell Computer Inc. of Round Rock, TX . It is requested that this legislation take effect in full accordance with Section 14 of the City

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH ROVISYS, OF AURORA, OHIO, FOR THE UPGRADE OF THE SUPERVISORY CONTROL AND DATA ACQUISITION (SCADA) SYSTEM AT THE BIG ISLAND WATER WORKS (BIWW) PLANT; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Big Island Water Works Plant (BIWW) and Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) currently runs software to control their SCADA systems, which are the monitoring and control systems that allow operators to effectively run the facilities and shows real-time information, including flows, chemicals, alarms, and many other parameters; and

WHEREAS, the Wastewater Treatment Plant's SCADA system was upgraded in 2018 and the BIWW SCADA system is currently in need of upgrades as the hardware is between five (5) and seven (7) years old and the current software versioning for both the computer operation and the control software is past its support cycle and cannot be upgraded without hardware upgrades; and

3 Option A - iFIX Upgrade

The new iFIX server will be configured and setup in parallel with the existing server which alleviates cutover risks and system downtime. An additional benefit of this approach is that Sandusky personnel will have an opportunity to ensure existing functionality is available on the upgraded system.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A VIRTUAL SERVER AND FIVE (5) WORKSTATIONS FROM DELL MARKETING L.P. OF ROUND ROCK, TEXAS, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM TO BE USED FOR THE UPGRADE OF THE SUPERVISORY CONTROL AND DATA ACQUISITION (SCADA) SYSTEM AT THE BIG ISLAND WATER WORKS PLANT; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Big Island Water Works Plant and Wastewater Treatment Plant currently runs software to control their SCADA systems, which are the monitoring and control systems that allow operators to effectively run the facilities and shows real-time information, including flows, chemicals, alarms, and many other parameters; and

WHEREAS, the Wastewater Treatment Plant's SCADA system was upgraded in 2018 and the BIWW SCADA system is currently in need of upgrades as the hardware is between five (5) and seven (7) years old and the current software versioning for both the computer operation and the control software is past its support cycle and cannot be upgraded without hardware upgrades; and

WHEREAS, the Dell virtual server and workstations from Dell Marketing L.P. of Round Rock, Texas, are available through the State of Ohio Department of Administrative Services Cooperative Purchasing Program, thereby, allowing local political subdivisions to purchase items that have been competitively bid from the successful state vendor giving the City the benefit of the State's negotiated price and eliminating the necessity of formal bidding; and

ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for 2020-2021 property, casualty, and liability insurance with Rinehart Walters-Danner Insurance Agency of Mansfield, Ohio, and to expend funds in an amount not to exceed \$325,000.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION:

The annual cost has become part of the annual operating budget and the City of Sandusky's total cost for 2020-2021 will be an amount not to exceed \$325,000. The insurance year is December 1, 2020 through November 30, 2021. The City accepted six (6) proposals, which were evaluated by a selection committee. Upon the completion of an interview and scoring process, the selection committee determined that Rinehart Walters-Danner Insurance Agency had the best proposal. This proposal will save the City \$115,000. The prior year ordinance was passed by the City Commission on November 25, 2019 (Ordinance No 19-194) that covered the period December 1, 2019 through November 30, 2020, for an amount not to exceed \$440,000.

The cost of insurance is not to exceed \$325,000 which includes the premium cost of \$314,745 plus a contingency of \$10,255 for special events if needed. Based on exposures, the cost will be distributed to the General Fund (\$208,000), Street Fund (\$33,800), Water Fund (\$40,625), and Sewer Fund (\$42,575).

ACTION REQUESTED:

The City Commission is requested to approve legislation to authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Rinehart Walters-Danner Insurance Agency for the property, casualty, and liability insurance package for 2020-2021 and authorize payment at an amount not to exceed \$325,000. It is requested that the City Commission enact the required legislation under suspension of the rules in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter to avoid any lapse in coverage.
