<u>ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:</u> Legislation authorizing payment to the Treasurer of the State of Ohio, on behalf of the Ohio EPA, for the annual discharge fee for the year 2021, for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Number 2PF00001 for the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Ohio EPA, through the NPDES, requires a permit for all Wastewater Treatment facilities discharging pollutants to a body of water within the State of Ohio to pay an annual discharge fee. Fees are determined by an average daily discharge flow of the following year and set by a flow chart from the Ohio EPA.

For the Calendar Year 2021, the City of Sandusky is required to pay a discharge fee for the operation of the Wastewater Treatment Plant of \$25,900.00 by January 31, 2022. The cost is the same as 2020 when it increased after many years due to an increase of average daily flow processed through the WWTP, resulting from high bay levels flowing back into the system through the outfalls.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION: The total amount of \$25,900.00 shall be paid with Sewer funds and has been appropriated in the O & M Budget for 2021.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED</u>: It is recommended that proper legislation be prepared for payment of the discharge fee to the Ohio EPA at an amount not to exceed \$25,900.00 and that the necessary legislation be passed under suspension of the rules and in accordance with Section 14 of the City so funds can be expended with funds budgeted for in 2021.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO MAKE PAYMENT TO THE STATE OF OHIO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE ANNUAL DISCHARGE FEE FOR NPDES PERMIT NUMBER 2PF00001 FOR THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT FOR THE CY 2021; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.11(L) requires that an NPDES permit holder that is a public discharger pay a fee as specified in the statute based upon an average daily discharge flow and the City's flow and the corresponding fee is delineated on the notification received from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency; and

WHEREAS, the total cost for the annual discharge fee for calendar year 2021 is \$25,900.00 and will be paid with Sewer Funds which have been appropriated in the budget for 2021; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance should be passed as an emergency measure under suspension of the rules in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to make payment to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency for the annual discharge fee for the Wastewater Treatment Plant for the CY 2021 with funds budgeted for 2021; and

WHEREAS, in that it is deemed necessary in order to provide for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, and its citizens, and to provide for the efficient daily operation of the Municipal Departments, including the Department of Public Works, of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, the City Commission of the City of Sandusky, Ohio finds that an emergency exists regarding the aforesaid, and that it is advisable that this **Ordinance** be declared an emergency measure which will take immediate effect in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter upon its adoption; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANDUSKY, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. This City Commission hereby authorizes and directs the Finance Director to make payment to the Treasurer of the State of Ohio as required by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency in an amount **not to exceed** Twenty Five Thousand Nine Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$25,900.00) for the annual discharge fee for NPDES Permit Number 2PF00001 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant for the CY 2021.

WHEREAS, the co-location was undertaken with the understanding that a plan would be developed for regional communications over the next two years and in 2011 plans were developed to bring the Sandusky Public Safety Dispatchers under the employment and supervision of the Erie County Sheriff's Office and subsequently, the Erie County Sheriff's Office has provided these dispatching services since 2012 to present; and

WHEREAS, this City Commission approved the previous contract with the Erie County Sheriff for the Provision of Dispatching Services for the City of Sandusky Police, Fire and Service Departments for CY 2021 by Ordinance No. 21-004, passed on January 11, 2021, at a total cost of \$354,900.38; and

WHEREAS, the proposed contract is for one (1) year commencing on January 1, 2022, and may be extended for thirty-six (36) months by mutual written agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City agrees to reimburse the Erie County Sheriff's Department for the dispatching services an amount not to exceed \$354,900.38 and will be paid as follows:

WHEREAS, this Ordinance should be passed as an emergency measure under suspension of the rules in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to execute the contract with the Erie County Sheriff for the provision of dispatching services for the City's Police, Fire and Service Departments and allow for continued dispatching services through calendar year 2022, as the current contract expires on December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, in that it is deemed necessary in order to provide for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, and its citizens, and to provide for the efficient daily operation of the Municipal Departments, including the Police and Fire Departments, of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, the City Commission of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, finds that an emergency exists regarding the aforesaid, and that it is advisable that this Ordinance be declared an emergency measure which will take immediate effect in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter upon its adoption; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANDUSKY, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized and directed to enter into a one (1) year Contract with the Erie County Sheriff for the Provision of Public Safety Dispatching Services for the City's Police, Fire and Service Departments commencing on January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022, substantially in the same form as Exhibit "1", a copy of which is attached to this Ordinance and is specifically incorporated as if fully rewritten herein, together with such revisions or additions as are approved by the Law Director as not being adverse to the City and as being consistent with carrying out the terms of this Ordinance.

Section 2. If any section, phrase, sentence, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 3. This City Commission finds and determines that all formal actions of this City Commission concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this City Commission and that all deliberations of this City Commission and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 4. That for the reasons set forth in the preamble hereto, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure which shall take

<u>ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:</u> Requesting legislation for approval of Change Order #1 and Final for the 2021 Sewer Lining Project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: This project was awarded to United Survey, INC of Cleveland, OH, at the May 24, 2021 City commission meeting per ordinances 21-079 in the total amount of \$298,074.

This project provided for the lining of habitual "problem areas" along several sewer lines and included one (1) alternate bid. These areas previously required some of the most regular work efforts by City Sewer maintenance crews. Work was completed 10-21-21. This work will increase the speed with which sewer water is carried, which increases pipe capacity and provides long-lasting protection of underground piping. All this, while virtually eliminating regular maintenance and labor costs of root cutting, root "foaming" and routine cleaning/jetting for the next 50 years, which is the life expectancy of this pipe treatment.

Specific locations of this pipe rehabilitation occurred on and between: Warren (Water to Monroe St.), Superior (Venice to 500' South) and Scott St. (Hancock to Franklin).

This final Change Order, a decrease of the contractual award in the amount of \$9,928.50, represents final quantities installed in the field by the contractor. This decrease reflects a combination of actual quantities versus estimated quantities and includes a portion of the contingency amount.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION: This final agreement amendment is a decrease of \$9,928.50, which will revise the original total contract amount of \$298,074 to \$288,145.50 and will be paid from the Sewer Funds.

ACTION REQUESTED: It is requested that legislation be prepared to allow for the approval of the first and final Change Order due to a decrease in work quantities for the 2021 Sewer Lining Project. It is further requested that this be passed in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter so that the contractor can be paid for work already completed in the field and to close out the completed project.
