CHAPTER 735 PUBLIC VENDORS

<u>Budgetary Information:</u> There will be a positive budgetary impact from the increase in permit sales and new business. Vending from small locations such as food trucks, stands, and carts is a lower cost, lower risk option than opening a brick-and-mortar restaurant or retail location. These types of businesses often act as incubator spaces for new concepts and new entrepreneurs who, with continued success, later decide to lease a more permanent location within a city. Chapter 735, Public Vending.

<u>Item for Consideration:</u> Proposal for an amendment to the Public Vending ordinance, Chapter 735 of the Codified Ordinance of Sandusky to enable the issuance of 2022 Public Vending Licenses.

<u>Purpose:</u> The Public Vending ordinance sets forth rules and regulations for the sale of food, beverages, or merchandise form a stand or motor vehicle within the City of Sandusky. The proposed changes will enable the Division of Planning to issue 2022 Public Vending licenses and support economic vitality in the city of Sandusky.

<u>Background Information:</u> The existing Public Vending ordinance contains rules and regulations, such as operating hours and vending fees, that have previously necessitated an annual update of the codified ordinances to align with the vendor license each program year. The ordinance also contains outdated and conflicting information across multiple clauses.

<u>Summary of Proposed Changes:</u> The proposed change to the ordinance simplifies language, removes conflicting information, and enables the issuance of annual vendor permits without the need for an annual update to the codified ordinance. The updated ordinance will also allow terms to be enumerated within individual vendor licenses, thereby enabling both context descriptions and specificity needed for the various locations that vendors prefer to set up for sale within the city. Specific changes include:

- Refinement of special events definition
- Simplification of application requirements
- Allowance of fees to be specified annually by staff
- Addition of administrative penalties.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART SEVEN (BUSINESS REGULATION CODE), CHAPTER 735 (PUBLIC VENDORS) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY SANDUSKY, IN THE MANNER AND WAY SPECIFICALLY SET FORTH HEREINBELOW; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the rules and regulations for public vending in the City include the refinement of the special events definition, simplification of application requirements, allowance of fees to be established annual by Staff, and the addition of administrative penalties; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance should be passed as an emergency measure under suspension of the rules in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter to allow staff to begin the issuance of 2022 Public Vending Licenses; and

WHEREAS, in that it is deemed necessary in order to provide for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, and its citizens, and to provide for the efficient daily operation of the Municipal Departments, including the Department of Finance, of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, the City Commission of the City of Sandusky, Ohio finds that an emergency exists regarding the aforesaid, and that it is advisable that this **Ordinance** be declared an emergency measure which will take immediate effect in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter upon its adoption; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANDUSKY, OHIO, THAT:

NEW LANGUAGE APPEARS IN BOLD PRINT LANGUAGE TO BE STRICKEN APPEARS WITH A STRIKE THROUGH IT LANGUAGE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED APPEARS IN REGULAR PRINT

Section 1. Part Seven (Business Regulation Code), Chapter 735 (Public Vendors), of the Codified Ordinances of the City is hereby amended as follows:

735.01 DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this **C**ehapter, the following definitions shall apply:

- (a) "City Limits" means the existing municipal boundaries of the City of Sandusky, Ohio.
- (b) "Public property" means any property in the public right-of-way or parcel owned by the City.
- (c) "Motor vehicle" means any vehicle used for the displaying, storing or transporting of articles offered for sale by a vendor which is required to be licensed and registered by the Department of Motor Vehicles.
- (d) "Stand" means any table, showcase, bench, rack, pushcart, wagon, or any other wheeled vehicle or device which may be moved without the assistance of a motor and which is not required to be licensed and registered by the Department of Motor Vehicles, used for the displaying, storing or transporting of articles offered for sale by a vendor.
- (e) "Vendor" means any person, firm, partnership, corporation or other business engaged in the selling or offering for sale, of food, beverages or merchandise from a stand or motor vehicle.
- (f) "Public streets or sidewalk" includes all public streets, sidewalks, roadways, highways, parkways, alleys, public parks, public parking lots or any other public way.
- (g) "Lunch hours" means vending between the hours of 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM.
- (h) "Regular hours" means vending between the hours of 8:00 AM and 10:00 PM.
- (i) "Late night hours" means vending between the hours of 8:00 PM until 12:00 AM on Friday and Saturdays.
- (j) "Vending" means the act of selling or offering for sale food, beverages, or merchandise from a stand or motor vehicle.
- (k) "Special Eevent(s)" includes, but is not limited to the following: Ohio Bike Week, Sandusky Pride Festival, Fourth of July Stars and Stripes Celebration, Sandusky Community Annual Back to School Rally, National Night Out (Touch-A-Truck), Big Splash Raffle, Sandusky Art Walk, Cruisin, By the Bay Car Show, Dragons and Bacon Fest, North Coast Octoberfest, Firelands 1-Mile Walk/ 5k Run for MS, and Party at the Plaza. means a preplanned event or series of events of less than a week's duration, including block parties or any small neighborhood-based community events, sponsored by a public or private person or entity, which is: (1) located wholly or partially on property which is owned or maintained by the City of Sandusky; or (2) located on any other property and requires for its successful execution, the provision and coordination of

municipal services to a degree significantly over and above that which the City of Sandusky routinely provides under ordinary everyday circumstances.

(I) "Trailer" means every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property wholly on its own structure that is drawn by a Motor Vehicle and/or is not self-propelled.

735.02 LICENSE REQUIRED.

No vendor shall sell, display or offer for sale any food, beverage, goods or merchandise from a stand, **trailer** or motor vehicle without first obtaining a license from the City. Vendors shall only be authorized to operate in the areas indicated in Section 735.08.

EXCEPTIONS - NO LICENSE REQUIRED: An existing business may sell or offer for sale food, beverages, or merchandise from a stand or other temporary display outside the areas indicated in Section 735.08, excluding a residentially zoned districts, for special promotions that are not in excess of three (3) days cumulative during a three (3) month period. Such special promotion request must be made in writing to the **Division of** Planning Department Office at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date for the Sspecial Ppromotion.

Vendors may sell, display, or offer for sale food, beverages, or merchandise from a motor vehicle, trailer, stand, or other temporary display if they are part of a Special Event.

735.03 APPLICATION.

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation or other business desiring to obtain a vendor's license to operate in Sandusky, shall submit an application to the **Division of** Planning Department, on an application form to be provided by the City, together with the appropriate fees as required by Section 735.04. The **Division of** Planning Department shall act within fourteen (14) days of the filing of such application to either issue the requested license or to deny the license.

The application for a vendor's license shall contain all information relevant and necessary to determine whether a particular license may be issued, including, but not limited to the following:

- (a) The name, date of birth, and address of each employee of the applicant, the business name, business address and employer identification number of the applicant, and proof of identity.
- (b) A brief description of the nature, character and quality of the food, beverages, goods or merchandise to be sold, or for which orders are to be taken.
- (c) If employed by another, the name and business address of the person, firm, association, organization, company or corporation, whether it is chartered or licensed to do business in Ohio; the name and address it is chartered or licensed to do business in Ohio; the name and addresses of the statutory agent for service of process, and the address of its principal office or place of doing business in Ohio if different from the address called for above.
- (d) A list of all political subdivisions within which the applicant has engaged in business within the six-month period immediately preceding the date of the application.

- (e) If a motor vehicle is to be used in the vending business, a description of the vehicle together with the motor vehicle registration number and the license number, size of vehicle, photo of vehicle, and the name and address of the registered owner of such vehicle.
- (f) A description and site plan of the proposed location of the vending business, size of vehicle or stand to be used and length of time during which it is proposed the business shall be conducted (if different from the hours of operation contained in Section 735.10), and the written consent of the owner of the property from which it will be conducted (if on private property).
- (g) The applicant shall submit Pproof that each person who operates the vehicle(s) used in vending has a valid Ohio operator's license as required by law.
- (h) The name and address of two (2) reliable persons who may be contacted as to the good character and reputation of the applicant.
- (hi) Each applicant that will be vending food products shall provide Eevidence of a valid food handler's permit or food service permit for the motor vehicle, trailer or stand from which the applicant will be vending from.
- (ij) License does not include the ability to vend during Sspecial Eevents. which last three (3) or fewer days when the vending activity is within the special event boundary and time. If the special event lasts longer than three (3) days the vendor shall have priority in their location subject to paying up to 50% of the special event's vendor's fee for the vendor's location.
- (jk) Vendors are exempt from obtaining a license if they are vending within the special event boundary and obtain authorization through the Sepecial Eevent sponsor. Daily or weekly outdoor vending in excess of seven (7) days cumulative will require compliance with this Chapter.

735.04 FEES.

An applicant for a license under this **C**ehapter shall pay an annual nonrefundable license fee per calendar year, for the period from January to December of each year, or part thereof, as follows: specified by the annual Vendor Program provided by the Division of Planning.

- (a) For a vendor's license to operate within the City Limits as defined in Section 735.01----\$250.00.
- (b) For a vendor's license to operate at a single location on Public Property or Public Streets or Sidewalks as defined in Section 735.01----\$350.00 (Ord. 19-096. Passed 5-28-19.)

735.05 INSURANCE.

No license shall be issued to an applicant who desires to sell any food, beverages, goods, and/or merchandise unless the applicant furnishes proof of an insurance policy, issued by an insurance company licensed to do business in the State, protecting the licensee and the City from all claims for damages to property and bodily injury, including death, which may arise from operations under or in connection with the license, in an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Such insurance shall name as additional insured the City and shall provide that the policy shall not terminate or be canceled prior to the expiration date without thirty (30) days advance written notice to the City.

735.06 ISSUANCE OF LICENSE.

After a proper application has been submitted, the **Division of** Planning Department shall issue a license to the applicant to engage in the selling or offering to sell food, beverages, goods and merchandise, within the City, if he finds the character and business responsibility of the applicant, and his principal employer, if any, to be satisfactory, and not a and proposed vending is found to pose no threat to the public health, welfare and safety of the residents of the City.

Renewal of licenses will be considered on a first come, first served basis. Applications will not be accepted prior to January 15 of each year. The number of licenses available for Public Property and Public Streets or Sidewalk locations will be determined on a yearly basis. For reservable locations, Ccurrent license holders will have a right of first refusal to maintain previous year 's reserved location.

If the **Division of** Planning Department denies the issuance of the license, the **Division of** Planning Department shall notify the applicant, in writing, of the reasons for determination to deny the application. Such notice shall be sent by certified mail to the applicant's address as set forth on his application, or be delivered to the applicant personally, and shall be considered served on the applicant on the date that the notice is mailed or served upon the applicant personally. The **Division of** Planning Department's denial decision may be appealed to the City Manager, who must reply with a written decision of the appeal within fifteen (15) business days.

The applicant may appeal the denial of the application for a permit by the City Manager by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Clerk of the Planning Commission within fourteen (14) days from receipt of the Manager's decision. The Planning Commission shall hear the appeal at its next regular meeting and shall issue a final decision on the appeal within thirty (30) days after the hearing. **The Planning Commission's decision shall be final.** An applicant may appeal the denial of the application for a permit by the Planning Commission by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Clerk of the City Commission within fourteen (14) days from receipt of the Planning Commission's decision.

735.07 LICENSES AND IDENTIFICATION BADGES.

- (a) The license issued to a vendor shall be carried with the vendor while he or she is engaged in the business of vending.
- (b) License shall be used only by the person to whom it was issued and may not be transferred to any other vendor/or person.
- (c) In addition to the license, each vendor shall wear an identification badge, which shall contain the vendor's name and business name. Vendors shall wear the badges in such a way that the badges may be easily read while doing business. If a badge becomes damaged or obscured, the vendor shall immediately replace the badge with a new badge.

735.08 VENDING PERMITTED IN CERTAIN LOCATIONS.

- (a) Vending is prohibited from residentially zoned property, and or from property that is only utilized as residential.
- (b) Vending of goods and services, with a vendor license, is permitted on privately owned property if the location does not conflict with subsection (a), when in the appropriate zone.
- (c) Vending is only allowed in Public Streets or Sidewalks at locations designated by the Planning Department and during lunch hours, unless location is specifically designated by the Planning Department for late night hours, or regular hours.
- (cd) Vending on Public Property, in Public Streets or Sidewalks shall only occur in locations designated by the Division of Planning Department and during regular hours, unless location is specifically designated by the Division of Planning Department for lunch hours, or late night hours.
- (de) Vending locations on Public property will be designated on a map on file in the **Division of** Planning Department.

735.09 PROHIBITED CONDUCT.

No vendor shall:

- (a) Vend within 100 feet of the grounds of an elementary or secondary school between one-half hour prior to the start of the school day and one-half hour after dismissal at the end of the day.
 - (b) Vend within 100 feet of any hospital.
 - (c) Vend within 200 feet of any church while church is in session.
- (d) Sell food or beverages for immediate consumption unless the vendor has available for public use the vendor's own or a public litter receptacle which is available for any patron's use.
- (e) Leave any location without first picking up, removing, and disposing of all trash or refuse remaining from sales made by the vendor.
- (f) Solicit or conduct business with a person who is in a motor vehicle (e.g. a drive thru).
 - (g) Sell anything other than that which the vendor is licensed to vend.
- (h) Set up, maintain, or permit the use of any table, crate, carton, rack or any other device to increase the selling or display capacity of the vendor's stand or motor vehicle where such items have not been described in the vendor's application.
 - (i) Vend without the insurance coverage specified in Section 735.05.
 - (j) No vendor shall vVend on residentially zoned property.
- (k) Operate using more than (1) self-contained vehicle or stand if operating on Public Property or on Public Streets or Sidewalk. No vendor shall use accessory trailers or stands within Public Property or on Public Streets or Sidewalk without permission as documented by the vendor license. Current vendor license holders will be given a two (2) year grandfather period from the date of the adoption of this Ordinance to comply with this subsection.
- (I) Leave any personal property, including but not limited to stand, furniture, or vehicle, at vending location past allowed hours.
- (m) Connect to City utilities if vending on Public Property or on Public Streets or Sidewalk without permission as documented by the vendor license.

735.10 HOURS OF OPERATION.

Vendors shall be allowed to engage in the business of vending daily between the hours of **89**:00 a.m and **10**:00 p.m., unless vending in locations noted in Section 735.08unless location is specifically designated by the Division of Planning for lunch hours, or late night hours.

735.11 SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

Any license issued under this **C**ehapter may be suspended or revoked by the **Division of** Planning Department for any of the following reasons:

- (a) Fraud or misrepresentation in the application for license.
- (b) Fraud or misrepresentation in the course of conducting the business of vending.
- (c) Conducting the business of vending contrary to the conditions of the license.
- (d) Conviction of the licensee of any crime or violation of municipal ordinance or state law involving moral turpitude.
- (e) Conducting the business of vending in such a manner as to create a public nuisance, a breach of the peace or to constitute a danger to the public health, safety or welfare of the public.

On the next business day following the suspension or revocation of a license, a notice of hearing on such suspension or revocation shall be made in writing, shall set forth specifically the grounds for suspension or revocation, and the date, time and place of the hearing. Such notice shall be mailed, certified mail, postage prepaid, to the licensee at the address stated on the application for the licensee at least five (5) days before the date set for the hearing. The written decision of the City Manager made at or after such hearing, with a statement of the grounds therefor, shall be mailed, postage prepaid, to the licensee at the address stated on the application for the license within thirty (30) days after the date of the hearing.

735.99 PENALTY.

- (a) Administrative Penalties. In addition to any criminal penalties that may be imposed pursuant to subsection (c) hereof, any Vendor or person who violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be subject to an administrative fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per day for each violation.
- (b) The Vendor or person in violation may pay the total cost as charged in subsection (a) to the City of Sandusky's Finance Director within thirty (30) days after such penalties are incurred. If the total costs are not paid within thirty (30) days then the City may institute a civil action to recover the costs. In the event the City is required to take legal action to enforce this ordinance, the Vendor or person in violation of the ordinance shall be responsible for all necessary costs relative thereto, including attorney's fees.

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(c) Criminal Penalties. Whoever violates any provision of this Cehapter is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree and shall be fined not less than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).

Each day of operation in violation of this **C**ehapter shall be considered a separate offense.

<u>ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:</u> Legislation approving the submission of three applications to the Erie County Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO), and authorizing the City Manager to execute an LPA Federal Project Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) as required for potential future funding of these projects.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The National Transportation Act has made Federal funds available for use by Local Public Authorities (LPA's like the City of Sandusky) through the Federal Highway Administration which has designated ODOT as the agency to administer FHWA's Federal Funding Programs in the state. The Ohio Revised Code allows ODOT the opportunity to enter into contracts with public authorities like the City of Sandusky to administer the design, qualification of bidders, competitive bid letting, construction, inspection and acceptance of any projects administered by ODOT provided the administration is performed in accordance with Federal and State laws and regulations.

The MPO is accepting applications to fund transportation projects for State Fiscal Year 2026-2027 or possibly earlier if funds become available from cost underruns on currently established projects. The three projects staff is requesting approval to apply for are listed below.

In order to qualify for federal funding through the MPO, the functional classification of the street in the city must classify as an urban collector or above. W. Monroe St. from Camp to Decatur is considered a Minor Arterial street, and both segments of Edgewater/W. Monroe St. and Camp St. are classified as Major Collectors.

All three projects would include milling existing pavements, resurfacing with intermediate and surface courses of asphalt, full depth and partial depth base repairs, as needed, limited curb and gutter improvements, adjustments of manholes, catch basins and valve boxes, new ADA curb ramps as needed and pavement markings.

The Camp Street project includes resurfacing the roadway and over the concrete parking areas South of the Underpass.

The Edgewater/W. Monroe St. and W. Monroe St. projects improvements includes the addition of a Storm sewer, dedicated to taking the roadway runoff and other "clean water" connections from the adjacent properties. This work has been desired for a while in the area of the current "combined" sewer system.

The City has been very successful with obtaining MPO funds for roadway projects. Since its inception in 2003, the MPO has helped to fund the Cleveland Road Delineator Project, Lions Park Bike Path Project Phase II, Monroe Street Resurfacing Project Phase I, Mills Street Reconstruction, Hayes Avenue Underpass, Cedar Point Drive Resurfacing, Camp Street Underpass Rehabilitation Project, Water Street Rehabilitation and Paving Project, First Street Resurfacing Project, Columbus Ave Resurfacing, and Meigs Street Reconstruction.

The MPO now requires the legislative body of communities to supply legislation in support of an application at the time of submittal. The priority of these projects is: First- W. Monroe, Camp to Decatur, Second – Camp Street, Monroe to Perkins Ave., Third – Edgewater/Monroe, Venice to Broadway.

<u>BUDGETARY INFORMATION:</u> The construction estimate for each project is shown above. If awarded, the matching funds would be allocated in the 5-year capital budget for an account with funds available for infrastructure such as CDBG, Issue 8, Sewer Fund, Stormwater Fund, Water Fund, Capital Street Fund or General Fund.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> It is recommended that the necessary legislation be approved and that the necessary legislation be passed under suspension of the rules and in accordance with Section 14 of the City in order to submit applications by April 29, 2022 due date.

Ohio Begins Collecting Law Enforcement Personal Protective Gear for Civilian Humanitarian Aid in Ukraine

(COLUMBUS, Ohio)— Ohio Governor Mike DeWine announced today that the Ohio Department of Public Safety will begin collecting hundreds of pieces of personal protective gear for donation to members of the Ukraine civilian territorial defense.

In March, Governor DeWine requested an inventory from local and state law enforcement agencies on the amount of surplus or expired, but still functional, personal protective gear that could potentially be donated to Ukraine. More than two dozen agencies responded to the query, offering approximately 75 ballistic and riot helmets and 840 pieces of body armor, including vests and plates.

"As Russia continues its unprovoked attack on Ukraine, citizens are stepping up to defend their country with little more protection than the clothes on their backs, and I am grateful to the Ohio law enforcement agencies that didn't hesitate to offer their unneeded gear," said Governor DeWine. "This is Ohio's opportunity to provide civilian humanitarian aid to help the innocent Ukrainians who are voluntarily putting their lives at risk on the front lines. If any other law enforcement agencies have unneeded protective gear, there is still time to take part in this important statewide donation effort."

Delivery of Ohio's donations to Ukraine will be coordinated by the Fund to Aid Ukraine, a non-profit organization based in Parma that is affiliated with the United Ukrainian Organizations of Ohio, a member of the Ukrainian Congress Committee of America.

"We express our gratitude to Governor DeWine, the Ohio Department of Public Safety, and the law enforcement community," said Marta Liscynesky Kelleher, President of United Ukrainian Organizations of Ohio. "This quick response is meaningful and essential to the people of Ukraine fighting each day to defend their country, their freedom, and democratic principles against the brutal and unprovoked invasion by Russia. We appreciate Governor DeWine's leadership in this effort, which can serve as a model for other states to take on similar initiatives."



AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A 2000 GMC G3500 UTILITY VAN AS UNNECESSARY AND UNFIT FOR CITY USE PURSUANT TO SECTION 25 OF THE CITY CHARTER; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2022 FORD 4X4 SUPER DUTY F-250 REGULAR CAB FROM VALLEY TRUCK CENTERS OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM FOR THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2022 FORD 4X4 SUPER DUTY F-250 REGULAR CAB FROM VALLEY TRUCK CENTERS OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM FOR THE SEWER MAINTENANCE DIVISION; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Sewer Maintenance Division currently has a 2000 Chevrolet G20 Cargo Van, with 60,000 miles, that is no longer fit for use for its intended purpose within the division for heavy construction performed on utility repairs and the Fleet Maintenance Chief Foreman is recommending that this van be replaced with a new 2022 Ford 4x4 Super Duty F-250 Regular Cab; and

WHEREAS, the 2000 Chevrolet G20 Cargo Van will be retained and used for lighter construction activities performed by the Horticulture Division; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended to replace this vehicle with a 2022 Ford 4x4 Super Duty F-250 Regular Cab which is available from Valley Truck Centers of Cleveland, Ohio, through the State of Ohio Department of Administrative Services Cooperative Purchasing Program thereby, allowing local political subdivisions to purchase items that have been competitively bid from the successful state vendor giving the City the benefit of the State's negotiated price and eliminating the necessity of formal bidding; and

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized and directed to purchase a 022 Ford 4x4 Super Duty F-250 Regular Cab from Valley Truck Centers of Cleveland, Ohio, through the State of Ohio Department of Administrative Services Cooperative Purchasing Program, Contract #RS1007536, at an amount **not to exceed** Seventy Five Thousand Three Hundred Seven and 00/100 Dollars (\$75,307.00).

PAGE 2 - ORDINANCE NO._____

Section 2. If any section, phrase, sentence, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 3. This Commission finds and determines that all formal actions of this City Commission concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this City Commission and that all deliberations of this City Commission and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.



AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A 1991 GMC G3500 AS UNNECESSARY AND UNFIT FOR CITY USE PURSUANT TO SECTION 25 OF THE CITY CHARTER; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2022 FORD F-450 CHASSIS FROM VALLEY TRUCK CENTERS OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM FOR THE STREETS & TRAFFIC DIVISION; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Fleet Maintenance Chief Foreman has determined that the 1991 GMC C3500 that is used for by the Streets & Traffic Division for maintaining all street and roadway signs, as well as, placing new signs throughout all City facilities and properties, is no longer of any use to the City and is recommending this truck be declared obsolete, unnecessary and unfit for City use and be auctioned on the internet with the proceeds from the sale being deposited in the Issue 8 Capital Fund for Vehicles, Facilities & Equipment; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended to replace this vehicle with a 2022 Ford F-450 Chassis which is available from Valley Truck Centers of Cleveland, Ohio, through the State of Ohio Department of Administrative Services Cooperative Purchasing Program thereby, allowing local political subdivisions to purchase items that have been competitively bid from the successful state vendor giving the City the benefit of the State's negotiated price and eliminating the necessity of formal bidding; and

This City Commission finds and determines that the 1991 GMC C3500, VIN No. 1GDJC34J9ME513297, is unnecessary and unfit for City use pursuant to Section 25 of the City Charter and the City Manager is authorized and directed to dispose of this personal property no longer needed for City purposes through public auction, sale process, or internet auction with the proceeds from

Project

<u>ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:</u> Requesting legislation authorizing the City to accept bids for the 2022 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Sidewalks raised by trees or simply deteriorating from old age throughout the City neighborhoods have become an increasing safety concern for many years. Although the Ohio Revised Code states that maintenance and repair of sidewalks are the abutting property owner's responsibility, the voters have asked via the passage of Issue 8, to have the City perform these repairs with tax dollars generated by their positive vote. In the past, when a residential sidewalk complaint was received by the Public Works Department, staff would investigate the issue and notify the abutting homeowner of their responsibility to maintain and/or repair the sidewalk. While responsibility has not changed, these complaints are now tracked in an Excel spreadsheet and a repair project will be devised annually as long as funds are available. If the sidewalk is heaved by an inappropriate boulevard tree, the tree will be scheduled for removal or root grinding as deemed appropriate by the city's arborist and may be placed on the annual tree removal program. One primary focus annually is on ADA accessibility issues, some of which are reported by the ADA advisory board.

From 2016 - 2019 the City has completed four sidewalk repair and replacement projects, removing and installing roughly 62,362 square feet of sidewalk and 880 linear feet of curb throughout the City. In 2020 the planned sidewalk project was brought to a halt due to the COVID-19 pandemic which placed a freeze on capital spending. Now that we are in a clear financial space for planning capital projects, we are picking up where we left off.

The 2022 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement project includes over 9,875 square feet of sidewalk and 127 linear feet of curb. This includes several residential locations and improvements to heaved slabs within the northwest quadrant of Washington Park. Staff is hoping to complete all needed sidewalk repairs within the park over the next 5 years. Attached is a listing of the locations included in this project.

The contractor will be allowed 90 days from the Notice to Proceed. The engineer's estimate for the 2022 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement Project is \$111,817.58.

BUDGETARY INFORMATION: The engineer's estimate for the 2022 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement is \$111,817.58 which shall be paid for with \$105,000.00 out of Capital Projects Funds (Issue 8 Infrastructure) and \$6,817.58 out of Capital Funds.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> It is recommended that the proposed 2022 Sidewalk Repair & Replacement be approved for bidding and the necessary legislation be passed under suspension of the rules and in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to bid the project, receive competitive prices and complete the safety improvements this construction season. The most competitive prices are typically received at the onset of the construction season.

<u>Items for Consideration:</u> Legislation approving a Grant Agreement with Paper Street Holdings, LLC for the purposes of furthering economic development and commercial revitalization efforts in the City.

<u>Background Information:</u> The 10,000 square foot former bank building at 603 Columbus Avenue has been largely underutilized for over a decade. In January 2022, the property was purchased by local real estate development and management company, Paper Street Holdings, LLC.

Paper Street Holdings seeks to convert single-story building wing that fronts Madison Avenue into three transient rental units. The total cost of construction of the three transient rental units is estimated to be \$272,850.

The Planning Commission approved a conditional use permit to allow transient rental at the property at its meeting on January 26th, 2022. A grant in the amount of \$22,500 was recommended for approval by the Economic Development Incentive Committee at its meeting on March 8th, 2022.

<u>Budgetary Information:</u> The City will be responsible for providing a total of \$22,500 in grant proceeds from the Economic Development Capital Projects Fund on a reimbursable basis. The project will have an ongoing positive impact on the general fund due to increased lodging and property taxes.

<u>Action Requested:</u> It is requested that the proper legislation be prepared to allow the City to enter into a Grant Agreement with the company. It is further requested that this legislation be passed in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to immediately approve the Grant Agreement to ensure the timely completion of the project.

GRANT AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of the	_ day of
, 2022 between the CITY OF SANDUSKY, OHIO (the "City"), a	municipal
corporation and political subdivision duly organized and validly existing under the Constit	ution, its
Charter, and the laws of the State of Ohio, and Paper Street Holdings, LLC ("the Company")	, an Ohio
Limited Liability Company.	

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Company owns the property at 603 Columbus Avenue, Sandusky, Ohio 44870 and further identified as Permanent Parcels #56-01256.000 and 56-01257.000 (the "Property); and

WHEREAS, the Company plans to the one-story building wing along Madison Avenue into three transient rental units, which will repurpose a functionally obsolete and underutilized commercial space and provide additional short-term overnight accommodations for individuals visiting Sandusky; and

WHEREAS, the building improvements at the Property will consist of the construction of three transient rental units at a total cost of \$272,850.00 (the "Project); and

WHEREAS, the Project will increase transient rental accommodations and generate new property any lodging taxes in the City of Sandusky; and

WHEREAS, to induce the Project, the City has agreed to provide economic incentive grants to the Company to assist in the payment of a portion of the costs of the Project as further described in Section 1 hereof; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that this Project pursuant to this Agreement and the fulfillment generally of this Agreement are in the vital and best interests of the City and for the health and safety and welfare of its residents, and are necessary to improve the economic and general welfare of people of the City;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1. City Grant.

The City agrees to grant up to \$22,500.00 in the form of an Economic Development Fund grant to the Company (the "City Grant") toward the costs of the Project, which shall be disbursed upon the completion of the Project. This City Grant shall be disbursed from the 2021 Economic Development Capital Projects Fund (the "Fund"). This City Grant will not increase if the applicant chooses to make additional improvements not contemplated in the grant application. The City reserves the right to make adjustments to the awarded grant amount, if recommended by the Economic Development Incentive Committee, for substantive changes to the project scope only. Construction must be done in accordance with and to the reasonable satisfaction of the City, which includes, but is not limited to, compliance with all Planning, Zoning and Building code regulations, and other applicable codes and regulations of the City, including obtaining permits. Furthermore, the Company agrees to display a sign during construction and for at least one (1) year upon completion of the Project noting the City's support; and

Exhibit "A" The Company shall notify the City promptly following the completion of the Project consistent with this Section and provide the City with any documents it reasonably requests related to Project costs and construction. The City shall then promptly review those documents and inspect the site and let the Company know if it has satisfied the conditions set forth in this Section and, if not, describe what is found to be deficient. In order to receive the City Grant, the Project will need to be completed by December 31, 2022. This date may be extended at the discretion of the City Manager.

The City shall pay the City Grant by check placed in the U.S. regular mail within fourteen (14) days following confirmation of the satisfactory completion of construction to the notice address provided in Section 6 below.

Section 2. Authority to Sign.

The Company and the City both represent that this Agreement has been approved by formal action of the duly authorized representatives of both parties.

Section 3. Assignment or Transfer.

The Company agrees that this Agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express, written approval of the City.

Section 4. Choice of Law.

This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio and the parties hereto agree that any dispute or other matter arising out of the interpretation or operation of this Agreement shall be determined in a Court of competent jurisdiction located within the State of Ohio and County of Erie.

Section 5. Binding Agreement.

This Agreement shall be binding on each of the parties and their respective successors and assigns.

Section 6. Miscellaneous.

(a) <u>Notice</u>. Any notice or communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be deemed sufficiently given if delivered personally or mailed by United States registered or certified mail postage prepaid or by overnight delivery and addressed as follows:

This Agreement is signed by the parties as a final expression of all the terms, covenants and conditions of their agreement and as a complete and exclusive statement of its terms, covenants and conditions and is intended to supersede all prior agreements and understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement.
- (d) <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

ORDINANCE NO.	
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AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$22,500.00 THROUGH THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND PROGRAM TO THE PAPER STREET HOLDINGS, LLC, IN RELATION TO THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 603 COLUMBUS AVENUE; AND DECLARING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14 OF THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, in January of 2022, Paper Street Holdings, LLC, a local real estate development and management company, purchased the 10,000 square foot former bank building at 603 Columbus Avenue and plans to invest an estimated \$272,850.00 to convert the single-story building wing that fronts Madison Avenue into three transient rental units; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the development of the Property with the Project pursuant to this Agreement and the fulfillment generally of this Agreement are in the vital and best interests of the City and for the health and safety and welfare of its residents, and are necessary to improve the economic and general welfare of people of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Incentive Committee met on March 8, 2022, and is recommending to approve a grant to the Paper Street Holdings, LLC, in the amount of \$22,500.00 to assist with project costs; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance should be passed as an emergency measure under suspension of the rules in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter in order to immediately approve the Grant Agreement to ensure the timely completion of the project; and

WHEREAS, in that it is deemed necessary in order to provide for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, and its citizens, and to provide for the efficient daily operation of the Municipal Departments, including the Department of Community Development, of the City of Sandusky, Ohio, the City Commission of the City of Sandusky, Ohio finds that an emergency exists regarding the aforesaid, and that it is advisable that this **Ordinance** be declared an emergency measure which will take immediate effect in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter upon its adoption; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SANDUSKY, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. This City Commission authorizes and directs the City Manager to enter into a Grant Agreement with the Paper Street Holdings, LLC, for financial assistance through the Economic Development Fund Program for the purpose of furthering economic development, substantially in the same form as Exhibit "A", a copy of which is attached to this Ordinance and is specifically incorporated as if fully rewritten herein, together with such revisions or additions as are approved by the Law Director as not being adverse to the City and as being consistent with carrying out the terms of this Ordinance.

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Section 2. This City Commission authorizes and approves the grant funding

to the Paper Street Holdings, LLC, in an amount not to exceed Twenty Two

Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$22,500.00) from the Economic

Development Capital Projects Fund of the City of Sandusky pursuant to and in

accordance with the terms of the Grant Agreement.

Section 3. If any section, phrase, sentence, or portion of this Ordinance is

for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent

jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent

provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions

thereof.

Section 4. This City Commission finds and determines that all formal

actions of this City Commission concerning and relating to the passage of this

Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this City Commission and that all

deliberations of this City's Commission and any of its committees that resulted in

those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all

legal requirements.

Section 5. That for the reasons set forth in the preamble hereto, this

Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure which shall take

immediate effect in accordance with Section 14 of the City Charter after its

adoption and due authentication by the President and the Clerk of the City

Commission of the City of Sandusky, Ohio.
