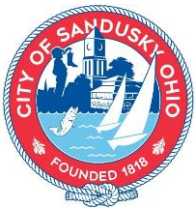
#### PLANNING DEPARTMENT

I would like to ask for a motion to allow Sandusky Recreation to apply for grant funds through the Wightman-Wieber Charitable Foundation.



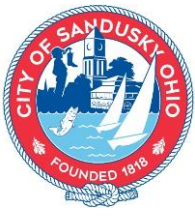

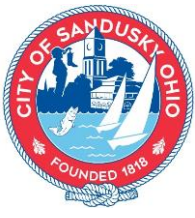

  - Ohio Edison has set a new pole & transformers for proposed electrical upgrades
  - Revised delivery date of generator is February of 2023
  - Due to the train derailment, the station is currently being re-evaluated.
  
- Follett Street and Mills Street Elevated Water Tank Inspection & THHM Removal System Project

  - Engineer's Estimate: \$250,000.00
  - **Permission to bid was sent to February 13<sup>th</sup> city commission meeting for approval**
  - Completion date: Summer 2023
  - Complete EPA required 5yr interior & exterior inspections on both tanks. Contractor will also replace ventilation units and active mixers, 3" conduit piping system and spray nozzles on both tanks.

- Mills Street High-Rate Treatment
  - **Contractor: Great Lakes Construction**
  - **Contract Amount: \$33,570,075.00**
  - **Completion Date: October 2024 (substantial completion), May 2024 (final completion)**
  - **Inspection: City staff & Stantec**
  - **Inspection Amount: \$1,642,466.88**
  - As the final project included in the City's NPDES permit as part of the 2015 negotiations with Ohio EPA, the City will be designing and installing a 16 MGD high-rate treatment (HRT) system with a goal of dramatically reducing overflows that result during large rain events when the capacity of the wastewater treatment plant cannot handle the flow. The project will include diversion of wastewater from the west side interceptor, expansion of the existing bar screen process, HRT equipment evaluation, possible replacement and expansion of the ultraviolet disinfection system, and possible relocation of ballfields from Sprau to Amvets Parks. Staff has worked with local youth baseball league to relocate the ball field to a desired alignment and size on the former Amvets site.

  - Contractor: Erie Blacktop Inc
  - Contract Amount: \$749,134.27
  - Completion Date: October 31, 2023
  - Inspection: K.E. McCartney & Associates

  - LPA Project PID 110322 ERI-CR-0504-00.49 (Monroe St)
  - This project involves ADA complaint curb ramps, pavement repair, base repair and resurfacing from Decatur Street to Meigs Street along Monroe Street.
  - Construction anticipated in spring of 2023
  
- Monroe Street (West) Drainage Project 1 (Decatur to Fulton St.)
  - Contractor: Ed Burdue & Co.
  - Contract Amount: \$105,749.16
  - Engineer's Estimate: \$108,000
  - Start Date: April 1, 2023
  - Completion Date: July 3, 2023
  - This project addresses roadway and drainage from Decatur to Central Ave. on W. Monroe St. Said project will convey runoff Westerly in a dedicated storm sewer pipe.
  - Regular and historic flooding reports come from this very area.
  - No road work is included in this.

  - Contract Amount: \$5,411,227.34
  - Inspection: In-House

  - Construction anticipated to begin: April 2023
  - Project planned to replace bad 6" water main with 8", resurface the North half of roadway from the old YMCA to 52<sup>nd</sup>. Replacing bad sidewalks and curbs along this segment also.
  
- Service Center Roof, Gutters, Downspouts, Façade, & Masonry
  - Contractor: Garland Inc.
  - Contract Amount: \$530,000
  - Completion Date: **Spring 2023, due to added work**
  - Sealing and coating of roof at service center, install gutters and downspouts, upgrade roof hatch and safety rails.
  - All work elements are complete, working on punchlist items.
  - Added work for installation of a larger ridge cap, as the contraction of the metals and joints with the recent arctic blast caused roofing to pull away from existing ridge cap and leaking occurred here. In spite of this additional work, the total cost will stay within the projects contractual amount.
  
- 2022 Sidewalk Project
  - Contractor: Kreimes Company
  - Construction Cost: \$121,116.33
  - Completion Date: **Spring 2023, due to added work.**
  - A three-week extension was granted due to the demand issues on concrete, project completed November 8<sup>th</sup> with the replacement of the mid-block crossings on Hayes Ave near Firelands South Campus. We are still working through final punch list items with the contractor, such as, boulevard restoration.
  - **Added crosswalk at Buchanan & Campbell, which will be done in spring of 2023.**

  - Submittals for VFDs were approved, **three** of the five VFDs has been delivered

  - Contractor: TBD (**Bid opening March 2, 2023**)
  - Contract Amount: TBD (EST. \$3,169,476.47)
  - Completion Date: December 1, 2023
  - This project includes reconstruction of Warren between Water and Monroe Streets, except for the new portion between Market and Washington. Includes new pavement, curbs, drainage system, sidewalk and multi-use path.
  
- 2022 CDBG Parking Lot Paving
  - Contractor: Smith Paving and Excavating
  - Contract Amount: \$39,642
  - Completion Date: June 1, 2023 – It is anticipated that this project will be completed in the spring because timing of concrete and asphalt won't allow for this construction season
  - This project will resurface Daly's parking lot and add landscaped islands. Overall project potential to add 6 parking spaces. Light pole bases and conduit have been installed by City staff, awaiting opening in schedule of concrete contractor.
  - Smith Paving is reporting that the concrete pads and islands will be constructed in March of 2023. Based on this, paving should occur soon after asphalt plants open in April/May.
  
- WWTP Secondary Digester #3 Cleaning & Dystor Membrane replacement
  - Digester Contractor: Burch Hydro Inc.-city was notified Burch Hydro, Inc was bought out by Synagro Central, LLC as of 12/31/22. Company is now known as Synagro Central, LLC
  - Digester Contract Amount: \$68,737.68
  - Digester Completion date: April 7, 2023
  - Dystor Contractor: Evoqua
  - Dystor Contract Amount: \$570,000
  - Dystor Completion date: April 7, 2023
  - The membrane on the Dystor unit has a tear in the fabric at a location where the entire membrane must be replaced. Sludge cleaning and disposal of Secondary Digester #3 is required prior to replacement of the membrane.

  - Work will include reducing most of Butler Street from 3 lanes to 2 between Milan and Cleveland Rd. Replacing concrete with asphalt pavement, adding new curbing. Section repairs beyond Milan Rd. will be added as funding permits.

  - ODOT Safety funding will pay for 95% of project. Includes traffic signal and striping upgrades, sidewalks, turn-lane extensions and intersection improvements between Remington Avenue and Sycamore Line.

  - Consultant: CVE (Chagrin Valley Engineering)
  - Preliminary & Detail design: \$139,757
  - Detail Design proposed for Mid-2023.
  - Construction: planned for 2026, after the larger Cleveland Rd. Safety project is complete.
  - Address 80-year-old drainage and lack of sidewalks on the South side of Cleveland Rd. East of Harbour Parkway to E. Shoreway Dr.

  - This project involves installing sidewalk on the north side of Perkins from Milan Road to Remington Avenue. Perkins Avenue will be resurfaced from the end of ODOT's east to Remington Avenue. Bramhall will be notifying property owners of survey work that will begin shortly.
  - Construction anticipated in spring of 2025
  
- East Water Street Reconstruction
  - Consultant: EDG
  - Contract Amount: \$85,856.00 (Amendment #1 to Sandusky Bay Pathway)
  - Design Completion Date: April 2023
  - Inspection: K.E. McCartney & Associates
  - Inspection Amount: \$99,999.00
  - This project includes extension of the Sandusky Bay Pathway between Franklin and Meigs Streets, as well as new curbs, bump outs, drainage, and roadway reconstruction. Construction is expected in July of 2023.
  
- The Landing – Final Design & Permitting
  - Consultant: Environmental Design Group
  - Contract Amount: \$2,057,845.73
  - Design Completion Date: April 2024
  - This project includes development of final design documents including permitting, acquisition and all other aspects required to prepare construction documents as detailed in the Landing Park conceptual plan approved by City Commission in December 2017. This includes the Sandusky Bay Pathway from the East Corporation Limit through Sports Force Park to Cedar Point Drive. The project will provide direct access to the East Sandusky Bay (the Back Bay) and the easternmost terminus of the Pathway within city limits. Funding for the design of the project is made possible with Tax Incentive Financing on nearby parcels.
  - Staff is working with ODOT to establish a mutually agreeable schedule and to split this project along appropriate boundaries to accommodate federal funding that has been allocated for all of pathway between Rye Beach Road and Cedar Point Drive.

  - This project addresses roadway and drainage from Camp Street to Broadway Street. Project has already received ODOT funding for FY 2025. Specifically entails roadway resurfacing, installation of a new storm sewer line and limited sidewalk and curb repairs.
  - Alignment selected for general routing of new storm sewer. Storm sewer to be sized to accommodate future connections to neighborhoods with a history of flooding near Fulton and Decatur.
  
- Monroe Street (West) Improvement Project (Camp Street to Decatur St.)

  - Design Completion: TBD

  - This project addresses roadway and drainage from Camp Street to Decatur Street. Project was awarded ODOT funding for FY 2026. Specifically entails roadway resurfacing, installation of a new storm sewer line and limited sidewalk and curb repairs.
  - Recently awarded ODOT funds, via the MPO for this project.
  - Scope of Services prepared for ODOT, precursor to selecting a design firm.
  - Had field review of project with ODOT, MPO representatives on 1/17/23.
  
- Monroe Street (West) Drainage Project 2 (Broadway St. to Mills Creek)
  - Consultants: Bramhall – Survey, In-House Design
  - Contract Amount: \$9,100 – survey & base mapping
  - Design Completion: Spring 2023
  - Total Project Est: \$TBD
  - This project addresses carrying drainage from Broadway St. and releases it 1600' West into Mills Creek near the existing bridge. This project separates sewers and puts road runoff directly into the bay. Currently, this runoff goes the Wastewater treatment plant and gets treated as sewage. No road work is included in this.

- Sandusky Bay Pathway Acquisition and Partial Design
  - Consultant: Environmental Design Group
  - Contract amount: \$2,092,513.00
  - Completion date: Spring 2024
  - A Conceptual Master Plan adopted in June 2018 detailed a multi-use coastal trail that stretches along the waterfront from the east corporation limit to the west corporation limit.
  - This project includes acquisition of needed properties, encroachments and easements along First Street, Pier Track, Water Street and anything needed between King Street and Venice Road.
  - Final design of the sections from Cedar Point Drive to Meigs Street and from King Street to Venice Road is included.
  - Wayfinding and branding of the Sandusky Bay Pathway has been finalized.
  - The railroad agreement has been approved and the crossings at Monroe and Edgewater are being designed.
- Water Model Update
  - Consultant: Stantec
  - Design Contract Amount: \$180,031.00
  - Completion date: March 15, 2023
  - Our last citywide model was completed in 2006. The new model will reflect system improvements since the last model was completed. Said model is a helpful tool in predicting flows, pressures at virtually any given point within the distribution system. Ultimately this data is of value to Contractors, Builders, and Developers and can be a tool to guide future capital design projects where there may be deficiencies within the system.

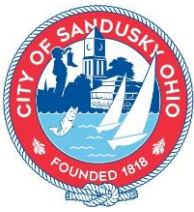

- The City of Sandusky received 11 proposals from the RFQ issued for services related to the development of a proposed Recreation and Community Center. An internal team of 5 staff members from various departments reviewed and scored the proposals. Interviews with the firms that scored the highest were recently held and subsequent preliminary conversations regarding scope of services and project costs have commenced. The RFQ stressed that the site must be centrally located and large enough to contain most, if not, all the programs envisioned by the Residents, Commissioners and City staff and that the new facility includes both indoor and outdoor recreation programs and events. Citywide community engagement will be critical component to the site selection and site program confirmation. Legislation requesting contracting services is expected to be presented to the City Commission in March 2023.
