City Commission meeting: Monday, June 12, 2023

DONATIONS

- Sandusky Recreation would like to thank Brown-Crowe & Construction for their donation of 18 broken tee box collectors for Mills Creek Golf Course. The value of the material and labor is \$2,000.

NEW & OLD BUSINESS

ADMINISTRATION

- Staff have been attempting to purchase a new truck for the fleet mechanics department for over a year. Due to inventory and supply issues, and lack of ordering opportunities from manufacturers this has been unsuccessful. The city issued an RFP with proposals due on June 5. Direct notifications of the request for proposals were sent to several vendors, posted in bid rooms, the City's website and was advertised in the Sandusky Register on May 17 and 24. No proposals were received. Late on Thursday afternoon, Fleet Maintenance Chief Foreman Troy Vaccaro learned that there is a small window of opportunity to order the truck chassis but will close before the next city commission meeting. The vehicle being replaced is a 1991. I would like to request a motion to approve an emergency purchase of \$44,634.07 so staff can obtain a purchase order, which is required for the placement of this order. The cost will come from Capital Funds. Formal legislation will be brought forward to the next City Commission meeting.

FIRE

- On June 7th Lieutenant Robert Bott retired from Sandusky Fire Department after 23 years of service. Lieutenant Bott was an integral part of Sandusky Fire Department's water rescue and dive team for most of his career. He led the dive team for many years helping develop it into one of the most active dive rescue teams on the southern shore of Lake Erie. Lieutenant Bott was a well-respected member of Sandusky Fire Department, and we would like to congratulate him and wish him good luck in his retirement.

- The City of Sandusky was notified it has been awarded with the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Governmental Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its 2021 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report. 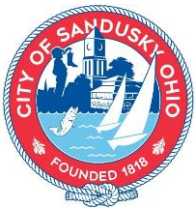

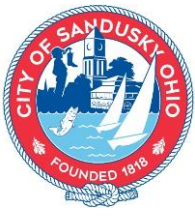

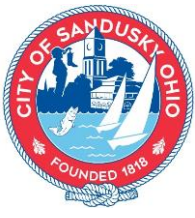

COMPLETED PROJECTS

- **Fire Station 7 Improvements (Roof and Parking Lot)**
 - Contractor: B & B Construction (roof), Precision Paving (Asphalt)
 - Engineer's Estimates: \$38,350 (Roof); \$37,107 (Asphalt Pavement); \$20,073.54 (Concrete Pavement)
 - Award Amounts: \$24,864 (roof), \$38,474.79 (Asphalt pavement)
 - Completion date: Summer 2023
 - Concrete pavement is being bid with the sidewalk program.
 - Roof work slated to begin week of June 1.
 - **Both the parking lot paving and roof repair have been completed.**
- **Monroe Street (West) Drainage Project 1 (Decatur to Fulton St.)**
 - Contractor: Ed Burdue & Co.
 - Contract Amount: \$105,749.16
 - Completion Date: July 3, 2023
 - This project addresses roadway and drainage from Decatur to Central Ave. on W. Monroe St. Said project will convey runoff Westerly in a dedicated storm sewer pipe.
 - Regular and historic flooding reports come from this very area.
 - **Final change order approved at the May 22, 2023, meeting.**

- Service Center Roof, Gutters, Downspouts, Façade, & Masonry
 - Contractor: Garland Inc.
 - Contract Amount: \$530,000
 - Completion Date: April 1, 2023, due to added work
 - Sealing and coating of roof at service center, install gutters and downspouts, upgrade roof hatch and safety rails.
 - All work elements are complete, working on punchlist items.
 - Added work for installation of a larger ridge cap, as the contraction of the metals and joints with the recent arctic blast caused roofing to pull away from existing ridge cap and leaking occurred here. In spite of this additional work, the total cost will stay within the projects contractual amount.
 - **Final change order presented at tonight's meeting.**

- WWTP Secondary Digester #3 Cleaning & Dystor Membrane replacement
 - Digester Contractor: Burch Hydro Inc.-city was notified Burch Hydro, Inc was bought out by Synagro Central, LLC as of 12/31/22. Company is now known as Synagro Central, LLC
 - Digester Contract Amount: \$68,737.68
 - Synagro has completed digester cleaning, Final contract amount: \$37,917.65.
 - **Final change order with Synagro for the Digester Cleaning approved at the May 22, 2023, meeting.**

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

- Bardshar Drainage Project
 - Contractor: D2 Excavating
 - Contract Amount: \$17,676
 - Completion Date: October 2023
 - County Engineers – led and designed for the City drainage on Bardshar Rd. south of the Winery.
 - The roadway in this area has deep ditches, which create unstable shoulders for the pavement.

- Cleveland Rd. Waterline Project
 - Contractor: Ed Burdue Co.
 - Contract Amount: \$298,699.92
 - Construction Completion: December 5, 2023
 - Project to replace 50- to 80-year-old water main lines within the intersection of Cleveland and Cedar Point Dr. To better align with the proposed roundabout.
 - Pushing this work off till fall time to minimize conflict with tourist season.



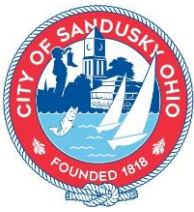
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- Columbus Lift Station Improvements
 - Contractor: All Phase
 - Contract Amount: \$312,895.00
 - Construction Completion: December 16, 2022 (39 weeks, Derailment Dependent).
 - Project to replace existing generator including electrical SCADA and VFD upgrades. Project will involve running city owned fiber from the Sandusky Amtrak/Transit building at North Depot Street to the station.
 - Due to the train derailment, Mosser is working on construction plans for rebuilding the upper level of the station. This work will not be charged to the All Phase contract with the city.

- East Water Street Reconstruction
 - Contractor: Great Lakes Demolition,
 - Contract Amount: \$952,053
 - Construction Completion: May 17, 2024
 - Inspection: K.E. McCartney & Associates
 - Inspection Amount: \$99,999.00
 - This project includes extension of the Sandusky Bay Pathway between Franklin and Meigs Streets, as well as new curbs, bump outs, drainage, and roadway reconstruction. Construction is expected to begin in July of 2023 and be completed by December.
 - **Contract award is being presented at tonight's meeting.**

- Hayes Avenue Corridor Safety Project
 - Contractor: Miller Cable Co.
 - Contract Amount: \$809,400.00
 - Construction Completion Date: March 29, 2024
 - Inspection: K.E. McCartney & Associates
 - Inspection Amount: \$80,912.00
 - LPA Project PID 109523 ERI-SR4-10.66 Hayes Ave
 - This project includes signal and intersection upgrades between Perkins Ave. and Columbus Ave. Project also includes select curb ramp replacements, pedestrian signals and possible restriping at specific locations.
 - **Foundations for new poles has been completed, waiting on deliver of the poles and traffic signals to complete work, expected Fall of 2023. Some concrete work at the intersections will occur between now and when the poles arrive. Watch for press releases as work affects traffic.**

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- Mills Street High-Rate Treatment
 - Contractor: Great Lakes Construction
 - Contract Amount: \$33,570,075.00
 - Completion Date: October 2024 (substantial completion), May 2024 (final completion)
 - Inspection: City staff & Stantec
 - Inspection Amount: \$1,642,466.88
 - As the final project included in the City's NPDES permit as part of the 2015 negotiations with Ohio EPA, the City will be designing and installing a 16 MGD high-rate treatment (HRT) system with a goal of dramatically reducing overflows that result during large rain events when the capacity of the wastewater treatment plant cannot handle the flow. The project will include diversion of wastewater from the west side interceptor, expansion of the existing bar screen process, HRT equipment evaluation, possible replacement and expansion of the ultraviolet disinfection system, and possible relocation of ballfields from Sprau to Amvets Parks. Staff has worked with local youth baseball league to relocate the ball field to a desired alignment and size on the former Amvets site.

- Monroe Street Reconstruction (Decatur Street to Meigs)
 - Contractor: Erie Blacktop Inc
 - Contract Amount: \$749,134.27
 - Completion Date: October 31, 2023
 - Inspection: K.E. McCartney & Associates
 - Inspection Amount: \$76,996.00

 - This project involves ADA complaint curb ramps, pavement repair, base repair and resurfacing from Decatur Street to Meigs Street along Monroe Street.

- Perkins Avenue Waterline replacement and Roadway Improvement Project
 - Contractor: Speer Bros. Inc.
 - Contract Amount: \$5,411,227.34
 - Inspection: In-House
 - Construction Completion: December 1, 2023
 - Construction anticipated to begin: April 1, 2023
 - Project planned to replace bad 6" water main with 8", resurface the North half of roadway from the old YMCA to 52nd. Replacing bad sidewalks and curbs along this segment also.
 - **Waterline work progressing with some curb and sidewalk replacement and restoration complete West of Hayes Ave.**

 - Replacement controls of the main and backup generator at the Water Plant
 - Have had a few instances of inconsistent power regulation upon power outages. Actual generators themselves are being analyzed to ensure they are mechanically sound.

 - Due to the manufacturer no longer making some parts, this project is just a replacement of the existing ultraviolet disinfection system at the wastewater pollution control plant with a few alterations to the channel to accommodate the new equipment.

 - Contract amount: \$271,920.00
 - Completion date: March 24, 2023-will require a time extension-TBD
 - Replacement of five existing variable frequency drives
 - Submittals for VFDs were approved, all five VFDs has been delivered
 - Contractor is moving forward to replace 2 of the 5 VFDs before water demand increases for the summer. The remaining 3 VFDs will be replaced after Labor Day.

 - This project includes reconstruction of Warren between Water and Monroe Streets, except for the new portion between Market and Washington. Includes new pavement, curbs, drainage system, sidewalk and multi-use path.
 - **Work is expected to begin in August of 2023, staff is currently working with the contractor to solidify a schedule. Completion will likely be pushed into spring of 2024.**

 - Construction proposed for late 2023
 - Work will include reducing most of Butler Street from 3 lanes to 2 between Milan and Cleveland Rd. Replacing concrete with asphalt pavement, adding new curbing. Section repairs beyond Milan Rd. will be added as funding permits.
 - Geotechnical information being gathered to make appropriate full depth asphalt pavement design.
 - **Stage 2 plans are currently being reviewed in-house. Hope to have biddable set of plans by late summer.**

 - ODOT Safety funding will pay for 95% of project. Includes traffic signal and striping upgrades, sidewalks, turn-lane extensions and intersection improvements between Remington Avenue and Sycamore Line.
 - Property Acquisition in progress for additional right of way for the project. **Offers have been made on all but 4 parcels of land.**

- Cleveland Rd. (E.) Drainage and Sidewalk Project
 - Consultant: CVE (Chagrin Valley Engineering)
 - Preliminary & Detail design: \$139,757
 - Detail Design proposed for Mid-2023.
 - Construction: planned for 2026, after the larger Cleveland Rd. Safety project is complete.
 - Address 80-year-old drainage and lack of sidewalks on the South side of Cleveland Rd. East of Harbour Parkway to E. Shoreway Dr.

- Follett Street and Mills Street Elevated Water Tank Inspection & TTHM Removal System Project

 - Consultant: Environmental Design Group
 - Contract Amount: \$2,057,845.73
 - Design Completion Date: April 2024
 - This project includes development of final design documents including permitting, acquisition and all other aspects required to prepare construction documents as detailed in the Landing Park conceptual plan approved by City Commission in December 2017. This includes the Sandusky Bay Pathway from the East Corporation Limit through Sports Force Park to Cedar Point Drive. The project will provide direct access to the East Sandusky Bay (the Back Bay) and the easternmost terminus of the Pathway within city limits. Funding for the design of the project is made possible with Tax Incentive Financing on nearby parcels.
 - Staff is working with ODOT to establish a mutually agreeable schedule and to split this project along appropriate boundaries to accommodate federal funding that has been allocated for all of pathway between Rye Beach Road and Cedar Point Drive.

- Monroe Street (West) Improvement Project (Camp Street to Broadway Street)
 - Consultants: Mott MacDonald
 - Contract Amount: \$150,500
 - Design Completion: October 1, 2024
 - LPA Project PID 113957; ERI-CR-0500-01.37
 - Total Project Const. Est: \$1,589,298.64
 - This project addresses roadway and drainage from Camp Street to Broadway Street. Project has already received ODOT funding for FY 2025. Specifically entails roadway resurfacing, installation of a new storm sewer line and limited sidewalk and curb repairs.
 - Alignment selected for general routing of new storm sewer. Storm sewer to be sized to accommodate future connections to neighborhoods with a history of flooding near Fulton and Decatur.
 - Stage 2 Plans sent on to ODOT for commentary.

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- This project addresses roadway and drainage from Camp Street to Decatur Street. Project was awarded ODOT funding for FY 2026. Specifically entails roadway resurfacing, installation of a new storm sewer line and limited sidewalk and curb repairs.
- Recently awarded ODOT funds, via the MPO for this project.
- Scope of Services prepared for ODOT, precursor to selecting a design firm.
- Had field review of project with ODOT, MPO representatives on 1/17/23.

- Monroe Street (West) Drainage Project 2 (Broadway St. to Mills Creek)
 - Consultants: Bramhall – Survey, In-House Design
 - Contract Amount: \$9,100 – survey & base mapping
 - Design Completion: Spring 2023
 - Total Project Est: **\$840,000**
 - This project addresses carrying drainage from Broadway St. and releases it 1600' West into Mills Creek near the existing bridge. This project separates sewers and puts road runoff directly into the bay. Currently, this runoff goes the Wastewater treatment plant and gets treated as sewage. No road work is included in this.
 - Project slated to begin in early 2024, per Capital Plan.
 - Preliminary design is complete.

- Sandusky Bay Pathway Acquisition and Partial Design
 - Consultant: Environmental Design Group
 - Contract amount: \$2,092,513.00
 - Completion date: Spring 2024
 - A Conceptual Master Plan adopted in June 2018 detailed a multi-use coastal trail that stretches along the waterfront from the east corporation limit to the west corporation limit.
 - This project includes acquisition of needed properties, encroachments and easements along First Street, Pier Track, Water Street and anything needed between King Street and Venice Road.
 - Final design of the sections from Cedar Point Drive to Meigs Street and from King Street to Venice Road is included.
 - Wayfinding and branding of the Sandusky Bay Pathway has been finalized.
 - The railroad agreement has been approved and the crossings at Monroe and Edgewater are being designed.



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- Water Model Update
 - Consultant: Stantec
 - Design Contract Amount: \$180,031.00
 - Completion date: **Staff reviewing draft report.**
 - Our last citywide model was completed in 2006. The new model will reflect system improvements since the last model was completed. Said model is a helpful tool in predicting flows, pressures at virtually any given point within the distribution system. Ultimately this data is of value to Contractors, Builders, and Developers and can be a tool to guide future capital design projects where there may be deficiencies within the system.
