- 2. Old Business/Updates.**
  - a. Mills Creek Golf Course**
    - i. High School Team
      - a. 4 teams will be using the course. SBC decided with the difficulty of having access to courses they would do a shot out per division, using the entire course with 6-7 teams participating. Schools may also schedule a few non-conference matches too.
    - ii. Revenue
