- 2. Amvets Baseball Update:**
 - a. Megan Stookey and LaMarqus Carr presented on Amvets ball with the following information

 - b. Skate Park-he purchased a 10 by 10 Pergola from Tractor Supply that he would like installed for shade due to the removal of the trees around the park. He would like the city to install or he could install with help from the city.
- ii. Crystal Nash spoke in regards to the WW Ice Skating Rink.
 - a. The current conditions of the ice are unsafe with the vandalism
 - b. Needs a chiller so it has a better surface
 - c. She has to travel to Elyria or Fremont for her kids to skate
 - d. There is a huge interest in ice skating in Sandusky and they would like a place to skate.
