

POLICE DEPARTMENT
JUNE 2021 MONTHLY REPORT

During June 2021, the police department responded to 1,209 Calls for Service, compared to the 1,123 Calls for Service responded to in June of 2020. This is a 8 percent increase. The year-to-date calls for service at the end of June 2021 was 5,967 which is 429 calls less the 6,396, experienced at the end of June 2020 or 7 percent decrease.

Officers responded to 21 traffic accidents during the month of June, which represents a 91 percent increase over the 11 responded to in June of 2020. Officers issued 24 penalty assessments during June 2021, which shows 85 percent increase over the 13 that were issued in June 2020. Officers arrested 3 drivers on DUI charges during June 2021 which is a 50 percent increase over the 2 DUI's in June 2020.

Among the criminal offenses reported there were 11 assaults, 8 burglaries, 8 drug investigations, 16 forgeries, 4 motor vehicle thefts, 3 sex offenses, 57 thefts and 11 vandalisms. The value of property stolen in June of 2021 was \$84,189.10, which is a 29 percent decrease over the \$119,006.03 stolen in June of 2020. \$39,241.14 was recovered in June of 2021, which is a 25 percent decrease over the \$52,529.65 recovered in June of 2020. Officers arrested 110 adults and 4 juveniles, for a total of 114 arrests in June 2021. This is 22 more arrests or a 24 percent increase over the total 92 made in June 2020.

In June 2021 the Youth Services Division received 8 youth referrals (1 male and 7 females). Of those 8 youth referrals, 7 were received from the Sterling Police Department, 1 from the parent, 0 received from school, 0 received by LCSO, and 0 received by District Court, 0 received from State Patrol.

Officers responded to 116 calls at local liquor establishments in June 2021, with 105 calls being reported in June 2020.

Sergeant Grant and K9 Officer Glock completed 6.00 hours of training in June 2021. There was 1 canine deployments with Sergeant Grant seen in June 2021.

Sterling Police Officers and staff completed 174.25 hours of training during the month of June in 2021 and 2000.60 hours of training for the year 2021 at the end of June.

June 2020, was the first full month of the COVID-19 pandemic, which included all the state-wide, local, and the Sterling Police Department's directives, orders, procedures and protocols that changed our normal operations during this unprecedented time. The pandemic has changed our numbers and are skewed from normal averages as a result. Overall call load was down which was anticipated as people will be reporting certain crimes/incidents less and are out and about less meaning less traffic accidents, etc., however, some types of calls have increased such as motor vehicle thefts, thefts, Disturbances and others. In addition, while we still respond to all in progress calls, emergency calls, 911 calls, etc. other calls are taken over the phone or online. While the officers are as visible in our community as ever before during the COVID-19 pandemic, proactive calls such as traffic have been reduced in order to protect our officers so it does not spread throughout our agency limiting our ability to provide the necessary emergency response to our citizens.

Public safety remains our top priority and we are balancing all the necessary precautions, protocols and procedures with providing the absolutely critical services to our community that they have come to expect.
