October 2021 Monthly Report

During October 2021, the police department responded to 1,061 Calls for Service, compared to the 1,037 Calls for Service responded to in October of 2020. This is an 2 percent increase. The year-to-date calls for service at the end of October 2021 was 10,435 that is 426 calls less than 10,861, experienced at the end of October 2020 or 4 percent decrease.

Officers responded to 12 traffic crashes during the month of October, which represents a 48 percent decrease over the 23 responded to in October of 2020. Officers issued 63 total citations during October 2021, which shows 34 percent decrease over the 95 that were issued in October 2020. Officers arrested 5 drivers on DUI charges during October 2021 which is a 67 percent increase over the 3 DUI's in October 2020.

Among the criminal offenses reported there were 5 assaults, 12 burglaries, 2 drug investigations, 2 forgeries, 1 motor vehicle thefts, 7 sex offenses, 20 thefts and 12 vandalisms. The value of property stolen in October of 2021 was \$40,390, which is a 25 percent decrease over the \$53,722 stolen in October of 2020. \$6,655 was recovered in October of 2021, which is a 63 percent increase over the \$4,089 recovered in October of 2020. Officers arrested 72 adults and 0 juveniles, for a total of 72 arrests in October 2021. This is 6 less arrests or a 9 percent decrease over the total 79 made in October 2020.

In October 2021 the Youth Services Division received 29 youth referrals (25 males and 4 females). Of those 29 youth referrals, 29 were received from the Sterling Police Department, 0 from the parent, 0 received from school, 0 received by LCSO, and 0 received by District Court, 0 received from State Patrol.

Officers responded to 49 calls at local liquor establishments in October 2021, 1 of which was a liquor code violation. 106 calls were reported in October 2020, 0 of which were liquor code violations.

K9 Glock with Officer Chartier and K9 Vader with Corporal Sherwood completed 120 hours each of training in Ashland, Ohio by K9 Working Dogs International, LLC for Patrol, Tracking, Criminal Interdiction and Narcotics Detection during the month of October. K9 Glock also completed 4 hours 50 minutes of training once back from Ohio with 3 call outs. While K9 Vader completed 28.87 hours of training once back from Ohio with 2 call outs.

Sterling Police Officers and staff completed 450.60 hours of training during the month of October in 2021, and 3,134.45 hours of training year to date.
