

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT APRIL 2022 MONTHLY REPORT**

During April 2022, the police department responded to 977 Calls for Service, compared to the 1,019 Calls for Service responded to in April of 2021 indicating a 4 percent decrease.

Officers responded to 15 traffic crashes during the month of April, which represents a 12 percent decrease over the 17 responded to in April of 2021. Officers issued 98 total citations during April 2022, which shows 1 percent decrease over the 99 that were issued in April 2021. Officers arrested 5 drivers on DUI charges during April 2022 which shows no change over the 5 DUI's in April 2021.

There were 105 criminal offenses investigated in April 2022, which is a 31 percent decrease when compared to the 152 criminal offenses investigated in April 2021. Among the criminal offenses investigated there was 1 sex offense, 8 assaults, 1 arson, 6 burglaries, 23 thefts, 1 motor vehicle theft, 2 forgeries, 5 fraud, 13 vandalisms, 16 drug investigations, 4 weapons violations, 8 disturbances, 4 family offenses (to include domestic violence and child abuse) and 13 trespasses. The value of property stolen in April of 2022 was \$49,866, which is a 113 percent increase from the \$23,432 stolen in April of 2021. \$19,476 was recovered in April of 2022, which is a 146 percent increase over the \$7,902 recovered in April of 2021. Officers arrested 76 adults and 3 juveniles, for a total of 79 arrests in April 2022. This is 6 less arrests or a 7.06 percent decrease over the total 85 made in April 2021.

In April 2022, the Youth Services Division received 7 youth referrals (2 males and 5 females). Of those 7 youth referrals, 7 were received from the Sterling Police Department, 0 from the parent, 0 received from school, 0 received by LCSO, and 0 received by District Court, 0 received from State Patrol.

Officers responded to 30 calls at local liquor establishments in April 2022, 0 of which was a liquor code violation. 153 calls were reported in April 2021, 0 of which were liquor code violations.

K9 Glock has been phased out of active duty, as he will be retiring in the coming months. While K9 Vader completed 20.50 hours of training with no call outs in the month of April.

Sterling Police Officers and staff completed 314 hours of training during the month of April in 2022.
