

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

### SEPTEMBER 2022 MONTHLY REPORT

During September 2022, the police department responded to 1053 Calls for Service, compared to the 1043 Calls for Service responded to in September of 2021 indicating a 1 percent increase. The year-to-date calls for service at the end of September 2022 were 8735 which is 636 less calls than 9371 at the end of September 2021, which is a 7 percent decrease.

There were a total of 19 crashes reported to the police department during September 2022, this represents a 73 percent increase over the 11 responses in September of 2021. Officers issued 88 citations during September 2022, which shows no increase or decrease over the 88 citations that were issued in September 2021. Officers arrested 1 driver on DUI charges during September 2022 which represents a 75 percent decrease over the 4 DUI's in September 2021.

There were 88 criminal offenses investigated in September 2022, which is a 40 percent decrease when compared to the 147 criminal offenses investigated in September 2021. Among the criminal offenses investigated:

The value of property stolen in September of 2022 was \$33,085, which is an 82 percent decrease from the \$182,816 stolen in September of 2021. \$14,220 was recovered in September of 2022, which is an 83 percent decrease over the \$86,086 recovered in September of 2021. Officers arrested 51 adults and 2 juveniles, for a total of 53 arrests in September 2022. This is a 36 percent decrease over the total 81 arrests made in September 2021.

Officers responded to 51 calls at local liquor establishments in September 2022, 0 of were a liquor code violation. With 64 calls were reported in September 2021, 0 of which were liquor code violations.

K9 Glock has been phased out of active duty, as he will be retiring in the coming months. While K9 Vader completed 0 hours of training with no call outs in the month of September. K9 monthly training is temporarily out of service as the K9 handler is on light duty.

Sterling Police Officers and staff completed 283 hours of training during the month of September in 2022.
