SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIAL / ISSUE ANALYSIS

History, Facts & Issues: Due to the deteriorating condition of the paint on the windows and exterior walls of the Administrative Complex, staff sent out quote sheets to 9 local contractors and ran a notice in the local newspaper. The quote included an option to repair & repaint just the windows and an option to repaint the entire exterior. The amounts of the quotes received are as follows:

WITNESSETH, that the County and the Contractor for the consideration stated herein agree as follows:

1. SCOPE OF WORK. The Contractor shall perform all tasks required to be performed and shall provide and furnish all the labor, necessary tools, expendable equipment and all utility and transportation services required to perform and complete in a workmanlike manner all the work required in connection with the window painting and repair. The Contractor agrees to provide all materials in association with the painting and repairs in accordance with the quote submitted for the project and clean up and legally dispose of all associated trash and debris. The following is a general description of the project elements:

Clean, prepare, prime, repair, replace failed glazing and repaint thirty (30) exterior windows and trim. Contractor will provide all equipment, paint, and other supplies necessary to correctly perform the contract work according to industry standards. Contractor shall comply with any and all state and federal laws and regulations relating.

<u>Staff</u>: the Contractor shall employ sufficient staff to complete the aforementioned tasks and such employees will be easily identifiable through some type of recognizable means, (i.e. uniforms designating a corporate logo and employee name or a photo identification badge with a signature of a corporate principle.)

2. THE CONTRACT PRICE. The County shall pay to the Contractor for the performance of this contract, subject to any additions or deductions provided therein, in current funds, the sum of: FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED & FIFTY DOLLARS (\$4,850.00)

Additional repairs, when deemed necessary, shall require a separate Purchase Order based on an amount agreed upon by the contractor and Taylor County.

- 3. **DURATION OF CONTRACT.** The Contract shall take effect upon final execution and terminate six (6) months from that date. This contract shall not be extended for more than thirty (30) days, unless otherwise agreed in writing.
- 4. **ASSIGNMENTS.** This contract shall not be subletted, transferred, assigned or otherwise conveyed by the Contractor without prior written approval of the County.
- 5. **TERMINATION OF CONTRACT.** The County reserves the right to terminate or suspend the contract in whole or in part at any time the interest of the County requires such termination or suspension. The County shall notify the Contractor in writing of such action with instructions as to the effective date of termination or suspension or specify the stage of work at which the action is to be taken. The Contractor will be paid for all work satisfactorily performed and any reasonable termination expenses that can be documented. Work performed payment will be based on bid item prices, which include or should have included profit and overhead. No profit or overhead will be allowed for work not performed.

If the County determines that the performance of the Contractor is not satisfactory, the County shall have the option of: (a) immediately terminating the contract, or (b) notifying the Contractor of the deficiency with a requirement that the deficiency be corrected within a

specified time. Failure to correct such deficiencies in the specified time will result in the Contractor being declared in default and the contract may be terminated.

If the contract is terminated for cause before performance is completed, the Contractor shall be paid for the work units satisfactorily accomplished and accepted at the contract unit price.

6. **DEFAULT OF CONTRACT.** If the Contractor fails to begin the work detailed under the Contract, or fails to perform the work with sufficient workmen and equipment or with sufficient materials to assure the prompt completion of the contract, or performs the work unsuitably or neglects or refuses to remove materials or discontinues the prosecution of work, or fails to resume work which has been discontinued within a reasonable time after notice to do so, or becomes insolvent or is declared bankrupt, or files for reorganization under the bankruptcy code, or commits any act of bankruptcy or insolvency, either voluntarily, or, involuntarily for a period of ten calendar days, or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or fails to comply with contract requirements, minimum wage payments or EEO requirements, or for any reasonable cause becomes unsatisfactory in the opinion of the County, the County will give notice in writing to the Contractor or his surety of such delay, neglect, or default.

If the Contractor, within a period of ten calendar days after the notice described above, shall not proceed to correct the conditions of which complaint is made, the County shall, have full power or authority, without violating the contract, to take the prosecution of the work out of the hands of the Contractor and to declare the contract in default.

7. **PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY.** The Contractor shall preserve from damage all property associated with, or which is in the vicinity of, or is in any way affected by the work. This applies to public and private property and/or utilities.

Any damage occurring to such properties shall be immediately repaired at the expense of the Contractor.

- 8. HOLD HARMLESS AND INSURANCE. To the extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, defend and save and hold harmless, the County, all of its officers, agents or employees from all suits, actions, claims, demands, liabilities of any nature whatsoever arising out of, because of, or due to breach of this agreement by the Contractor, its sub-contractors, agents or employees or due to any negligent act or occurrence of omission or commission of the Contractor, its subcontractors, agents, or employees. Neither Contractor nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused or resulting from the sole negligence of the County or any of its officers, agents or employees.
- 9. GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE. The Contractor shall maintain general liability insurance of at least \$1,000,000.00 per person and property damage insurance of at least \$50,000.00 each occurrence, holding the County harmless for the contractor's negligence, and list the County as additionally insured under the contractor's coverage.

Certificates of such insurance shall be filed with the County <u>prior to beginning work</u> <u>under this contract</u> and shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection.

10. WORKER'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE. The Contractor shall provide Worker's Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida and in amounts sufficient to secure the benefits of the Florida Worker's Compensation Law for all of its employees. Workers Compensation exemptions will be accepted upon providing a current certificate, Articles of Incorporation, and a signed Taylor County Workers Compensation Hold

Harmless Agreement. The Contractor shall insure that the employees of a subcontractor are covered by similar insurance.

- 11. **PERMITS, RULES & REGULATIONS.** It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to secure all permits necessary to conduct the work in accordance with required regulations and to notify all applicable utilities or parties affected by the Contractor's operations. The Contractor shall further be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of this contract. The Contractor agrees to abide by all applicable State and Federal Laws, rules and regulations.
- 12. ACCESS TO RECORDS. The Contractor agrees to provide access to those records, books and documents that pertain to this project during the project period and for a three (3) year period thereafter.

History, Facts & Issues: Taylor County Facilities Maintenance staff prepared quote sheets for pest control services for the Taylor County Courthouse, Tax Collector/Driver's License Office, Historical Society, Administrative Complex, Shady Grove Community Center, Supervisor of Elections Office and Steinhatchee Community Center. The quote sheets allowed a submittal deadline of May 28, 2019 and were mailed to eight (8) pest control vendors, resulting in five (5) respondents. The lowest quote received was from Live Oak Pest Control in the amount of \$1,945.00. A 5% adjustment to the quote as a non-local bid equaled \$2,042.25, which, is still less than Messick Pest Control, the lowest local vendor, at \$2,220.00.

Based on the results of the quote requests, staff decided to enter contractual services with Live Oak Pest Control for the locations specified.

6. **DEFAULT OF CONTRACT.** If the Contractor fails to begin the work detailed under the Contract, or fails to perform the work with sufficient workmen and equipment or with sufficient materials to assure the prompt completion of the contract, or performs the work unsuitably or neglects or refuses to remove materials or discontinues the prosecution of work, or fails to resume work which has been discontinued within a reasonable time after notice to do so, or becomes insolvent or is declared bankrupt, or files for reorganization under the bankruptcy code, or commits any act of bankruptcy or insolvency, either voluntarily, or, involuntarily for a period of ten calendar days, or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or fails to comply with

contract requirements, minimum wage payments or EEO requirements, or for any reasonable cause becomes unsatisfactory in the opinion of the County, the County will give notice in writing to the Contractor or his surety of such delay, neglect, or default.

If the Contractor, within a period of ten calendar days after the notice described above, shall not proceed to correct the conditions of which complaint is made, the County shall, have full power or authority, without violating the contract, to take the prosecution of the work out of the hands of the Contractor and to declare the contract in default.

7. **PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY.** The Contractor shall preserve from damage all property associated with, or which is in the vicinity of, or is in any way affected by the work. This applies to public and private property and/or utilities.

Any damage occurring to such properties shall be immediately repaired at the expense of the Contractor.

- 8. HOLD HARMLESS AND INSURANCE. To the extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, defend and save and hold harmless, the County, all of its officers, agents or employees from all suits, actions, claims, demands, liabilities of any nature whatsoever arising out of, because of, or due to breach of this agreement by the Contractor, its sub-contractors, agents or employees or due to any negligent act or occurrence of omission or commission of the Contractor, its subcontractors, agents, or employees. Neither Contractor nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused or resulting from the sole negligence of the County or any of its officers, agents or employees.
- 9. GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE. The Contractor shall maintain general liability insurance of at least \$1,000,000.00 per person and property damage insurance of at least

\$50,000.00 each occurrence, holding the County harmless for the contractor's negligence, and list the County as additionally insured under the contractor's coverage.

Certificates of such insurance shall be filed with the County <u>prior to beginning work</u> <u>under this contract</u> and shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection.

- 10. WORKER'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE. The Contractor shall provide Worker's Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida and in amounts sufficient to secure the benefits of the Florida Worker's Compensation Law for all of its employees. Workers Compensation exemptions will be accepted upon providing a current certificate, Articles of Incorporation, and a signed Taylor County Workers Compensation Hold Harmless Agreement. The Contractor shall insure that the employees of a subcontractor are covered by similar insurance.
- 11. **PERMITS, RULES & REGULATIONS.** It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to secure all permits necessary to conduct the work in accordance with required regulations and to notify all applicable utilities or parties affected by the Contractor's operations. The Contractor shall further be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of this contract. The Contractor agrees to abide by all applicable State and Federal Laws, rules and regulations.
- 12. ACCESS TO RECORDS. The Contractor agrees to provide access to those records, books and documents that pertain to this project during the project period and for a three (3) year period thereafter.

The Board requested and received bids for the FDOT Green Street Sidewalk Local Agency Program Project from Arena Avenue to Howard Street on January 18, 2019. These bids were opened on January 22, 2019, and found to exceed the available budget sufficiently enough to prompt FDOT to request rebidding. The Project was re-bid with a second round of responses received on May 3, 2019. On May 6, 2019, the three bids received were opened and distributed to the Bid Committee for review. These bids were reviewed and the results of that review are as follows:

Of the three bids received, LAS Contracting Copr. was found to be the lowest cost proposal. Their proposal, however, did not include information pertaining to their business license nor their registration with E-Verify. Staff suggests it would be acceptable to validate these items once an award is approved but prior to contract execution. Notwithstanding, LAS is currently pre-qualified with the FDOT for sidewalk and drainage work.

The Bid Committee presented its bid review to FDOT for direction with the funding and award of this Local Agency Program project. FDOT is currently addressing future maintenance responsibility with the City of Perry for their respective portion of the project. Once that is resolved, the project will be able to move forward toward addressing the budgetary shortfall. Absent FDOT providing additional funding, the only remaining options are to (1) supplement with Taylor County funds or (2) terminate the project.

1) Award the Green Street Sidewalk LAP Project to LAS Contracting Corp. contingent on sufficient funding being allocated to the project and receiving remaining information.



School board thanked for its support of career technical education (CTE)

recognition "National Career Technical Education (CTE) Month," the Taylor County School Board passed a resolution and recognized student members of a SkillsUSA, a partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce for years to come.

Big Bend Technical College (BBTC) SkillsUSA Team President Drayton Pegg and several of his fellow officers appeared before the school board at its Feb. 5 workshop to publicly thank the school board for recognizing February as "Career and Technical Education Month" and to share information about program.

"SkillsUSA helps each student excel by providing programs. educational events and competitions that support career and technical education - or CTE - in the nation's classrooms," Pegg told the school board.

"Our local chapter has 23 members, of which 16 will be competing in the regional contest in Pensacola. We will compete in the postsecondary Health Science Quiz Bowl, post-secondary and secondary welding and our post-secondary diesel mechanics team has already been selected as champions and will be headed to the state competition in April. where we all hope to join them to compete after

winning at regionals," Pegg added.

Pegg thanked the school board for their support of CTE programs at BBTC, Taylor County High School and Taylor County Middle School, and introduced some of his fellow SkillsUSA officers, including: Parliamentarian Ricky Hatcher, Treasurer Mara Johnson and Secretary Eunice Brown, recognizing Reporter Krista Jones and Vice-President Samantha Lundy, who were unable to attend the meeting.

Director Jodi BBTC Tilman pointed out some of the benefits of offering CTE courses, that students enrolled in CTE courses had higher average GPAs (3.08) than other high school students (2.71), were less likely to be chronically absent (8.9% compared to 15.3%), had less disciplinary actions (5.8% to 12.5%), had a far lower drop-out rate (0.2% to 1.8%) and were far more likely to earn a diploma (96.7% compared to 73.3%), according to a 2016-17 Career and Professional Academy Enrollment and Performance Report.

The proclamation passed by the school board stated in part: "Whereas, the efforts of career and technical educators, businesses and industry stimulate growth and vitality of our local, state and national economies by preparing graduates for careers that are forecast to experience the

largest and fastest growth in courses. the next decade; and
