

#### SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIAL / ISSUE ANALYSIS

Based on discussions previously conducted by the County History, Facts & Issues: Commission, staff was instructed to prepare an application for amendment to the Land Development Code that would allow long term parking of recreational vehicles on county right-of-way under certain conditions. An amendment to the Land Development Code requires a public hearing before the Planning Board and a public hearing before the County Commission. The Planning Board held a public hearing on April 4, 2013 and recommended approval of the amendment to the County Commission with changes to the proposed language for clarification purposes. The recommended changes are included in the board packet in a bold underline and strikethrough format. A public hearing notice for the hearing before the County Commission was ran in the local newspaper on April 5, 2013, a copy of which is also included in the packet.

Staff respectfully requests that the Board hold the public hearing to consider adoption of an ordinance amending the Taylor County Land Development Code.

Following are the changes recommended by the Planning Board for the long term RV parking language that was endorsed by the County Commission on the original application. The recommended changes are in bold underline, and strikethrough format:

- (4) Long Term Parking. No person shall site a vehicle or recreational vehicle on a county right-of-way in excess of 24-hours unless and until a permit has been issued by the board of county commissioners, or their designee, authorizing such use. The following criteria shall be utilized for consideration of approval for such use:
  - a. Whether the property abutting the request site is owned by the applicant.
  - b. Whether the abutting property exhibits an existing nonconformity due to flood induced erosion that prohibits onsite parking.
  - c. Whether such use will not negatively impact safe traffic circulation.
  - d. Whether clear zones adjacent to travel lanes will be maintained.

Exception. Parking on right-of-way during a voluntary or mandatory evacuation.

- (5) Issuance of Permit. Any permit issued by the County pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889 shall define the following:
  - (a) Duration of the Permit, if any.
  - (b) Easily identifiable physical description (no legal description necessary) of the geographical bounds to which the Permit applies.
  - (c) Vehicle(s) or Recreational Vehicle(s) for which the Permit applies.
- (5) Any person or entity wishing to appeal the County Administrator's decision regarding permitting may appeal to the Board of County Commissioners. Appeals shall be made by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Planning Department within 30 days of the County Administrator's decision.
- (6) Any person or entity wishing to appeal the County Administrator's decision regarding permitting may appeal to the Board of County Commissioners. Appeals shall be made by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Planning Department within 30 days of the County Administrator's decision. The Board of County Commissioners may, on its own initiative, at any time, review, amend, or revoke, any Permit issued pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889.
- (7) Temporary Suspension of Permit During Evacuations. Any permit issued pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889 shall be deemed temporarily suspended during any period in which any rule, regulation, statute, executive order, or other governmental directive is in effect causing voluntary or mandatory evacuations of an area in which such a Permit is issued for, and shall not under any circumstance be used to interfere with governmental operations during such voluntary or mandatory evacuations.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2013-\_\_\_\_**

AN ORDINANCE OF TAYLOR COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE TAYLOR COUNTY LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, AS AMENDED; AMENDING SECTION 42-889, ENTITLED RIGHTS-OF-WAY, SUBSECTION (e), ALLOWING LONG TERM PARKING OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES ON PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 125.01, Florida Statutes, as amended, empowers the Board of County Commissioners of Taylor County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Board of County Commissioners, to prepare and adopt land development regulations;

WHEREAS, Sections 163.3161 to 163.3248, Florida Statutes, as amended, the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act, requires the Board of County Commissioners to prepare and adopt regulations concerning the use of land or water;

WHEREAS, an application for an amendment, as described below, has been filed with the County;

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of Taylor County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Planning Board, has been designated as the Local Planning Agency of Taylor County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Local Planning Agency;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3174, Florida Statutes, as amended, and the Land Development Code, the Planning Board, serving also as the Local Planning Agency, held the required public hearing, with public notice having been provided, on said application for an amendment, as described below, and at said public hearing, the Planning Board, serving also as the Local Planning Agency, reviewed and considered all comments received during said public hearing concerning said application for an amendment, as described below, and recommended to the Board of County Commissioners approval of said application for an amendment, as described below;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 125.66, Florida Statutes, as amended, the Board of County Commissioners held the required public hearing, with public notice having been provided, on said application for an amendment, as described below; and at said public hearing, the Board of County Commissioners reviewed and considered all comments received during said public hearing, including the recommendation of the Planning Board, serving also as the Local Planning Agency, concerning said application for an amendment, as described below;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and found that approval of said application for an amendment, as described below, is consistent with the purposes and objectives of the comprehensive planning program and the Comprehensive Plan;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and found that approval of said application for an amendment, as described below, will further the purposes of

the Land Development Code and other ordinances, regulations and actions designed to implement the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and found that approval of said application for an amendment, as described below, would promote the public health, safety, morals, order, comfort, convenience, appearance, prosperity or general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Taylor County, Florida, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to an application, LDC 13-01, by the Board of County Commissioners, to amend the text of the Land Development Code, Section 42-889, entitled Rights-of-way, Subsection (e)(4), is hereby added to read, as follows:

- (4) Long Term Parking. No person shall site a vehicle or recreational vehicle on a county right-of-way in excess of 24-hours unless and until a permit has been issued by the board of county commissioners, or their designee, authorizing such use. The following criteria shall be utilized for consideration of approval for such use:
  - a. Whether the property abutting the request site is owned by the applicant.
  - b. Whether the abutting property exhibits an existing nonconformity due to flood induced erosion that prohibits onsite parking.
  - c. Whether such use will negatively impact safe traffic circulation.
  - d. Whether clear zones adjacent to travel lanes will be maintained.

<u>Section 2.</u> Pursuant to an application, LDC 13-01, by the Board of County Commissioners, to amend the text of the Land Development Code, Section 42-889, entitled Rights-of-way, Subsection (e)(5), is hereby added to read, as follows:

- (5) Issuance of Permit. Any permit issued by the County pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889 shall define the following:
  - (a) Duration of the Permit, if any.
  - (b) Easily identifiable physical description (no legal description necessary) of the geographical bounds to which the Permit applies.
  - (c) Vehicle(s) or Recreational Vehicle(s) for which the Permit applies.

<u>Section 3.</u> Pursuant to an application, LDC 13-01, by the Board of County Commissioners, to amend the text of the Land Development Code, Section 42-889, entitled Rights-of-way, Subsection (e)(6), is hereby added to read, as follows:

(6) Any person or entity wishing to appeal the County Administrator's decision regarding permitting may appeal to the Board of County Commissioners. Appeals shall be made by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Planning Department within 30 days of the County Administrator's decision. The Board of County Commissioners may, on its own initiative, at any time, review, amend, or revoke, any Permit issued pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889.

<u>Section 4.</u> Pursuant to an application, LDC 13-01, by the Board of County Commissioners, to amend the text of the Land Development Code, Section 42-889, entitled Rights-of-way, Subsection (e)(7), is hereby added to read, as follows:

(7) Temporary Suspension of Permit During Evacuations. Any permit issued pursuant to Paragraph (e)(4) of Sec. 42-889 shall be deemed temporarily suspended during any period in which any rule, regulation, statute, executive order, or other governmental directive is in effect causing voluntary or mandatory evacuations of an area in which such a Permit is issued for, and shall not under any circumstance be used to interfere with governmental operations during such voluntary or mandatory evacuations.

<u>Section 5</u>. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance is declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be void, unconstitutional or unenforceable, then all remaining provisions and portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 6</u>. Conflict. All ordinances or portions of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 7</u>. Effective Date. Pursuant to Section 125.66, Florida Statutes, as amended, a certified copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the Florida Department of State by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioner within ten (10) days after enactment by the Board of County Commissioners. This ordinance shall become effective upon filing of the ordinance with the Florida Department of State.

<u>Section 8</u>. Authority. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted by Section 125.01, Florida Statutes, as amended, and Sections 163.3161 through 163.3248, Florida Statutes, as amended.

- 1. **Approval of March 7, 2013 Minutes:** Michael Lynn, brings the meeting to order stating that the first order of business is to consider approval of the draft minutes from the March 7, 2013 meeting. Dale Rowell makes a motion to approve the March 7, 2013 minutes as written; Pam Wessels seconds the motion; the motion passes by unanimous vote.
- 2. Land Development Code Public Hearing: Michael Lynn opens the public hearing consisting of an application to amend the Land Development Code (LDC) with language that would allow long term parking of vehicles and recreational vehicles on public rightof-way under certain conditions. Danny Griner explains that the application was being proposed by the County Commission and was a result of discussions held during previous County Commission meetings. Michael Lynn asks for clarification on how this issue came to be and what the impacts of the amendments would be. Danny Griner states that he was not in attendance at the County Commission meetings, but speculated that the language was proposed due to the issues surrounding use of right-of-way on Ezell Beach Drive that the county has experienced in recent years. Dale Rowell questions the impacts of allowing this permitted use on both sides of a right-of-way, would there be enough room to accommodate both sides, or, would one request be denied based on lack of rightof-way width. Dale then asks how the amount of right-of-way to be used would be determined. Danny Griner states that the amount of right-of-way would be described on the required permit, but further states that he was not sure of the impacts of requests for permits on both sides of a right-of-way and how that would be handled. Dale Rowell then states that he does not have a problem with the amendment. Michael Lynn states that he does not think there will be any negative impact from the amendment. Pam Wessels confirms that recreational vehicles allowed by this amendment would still have to be highway ready at all times. Ray Curtis questions the amendment language and the reason behind the amendment. Michael Lynn responds using Ezell Beach as an example where property owners lost use of their property due to storm damage and could not rebuild due to the lots being deemed to be on State owned jurisdictional waters, further stating that this change would allow them some use of their property. Ray Curtis states that he recommends changes to the language to clarify the intended use of vehicles in this provision, further stating that the mandatory evacuation language is unclear in his opinion. Michael Lynn states that the evacuation language as written is unclear to him Ray Curtis then recommends that language be added that provides minimum information requirements for the required permit and agrees to prepare draft language for consideration by the County Commission. Dale Rowell makes a motion to recommend approval of the amendment to the County Commission with the language changes recommended by Ray Curtis; Barry Wilson seconds the motion; the motion passes by unanimous vote.



#### SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIAL / ISSUE ANALYSIS

History, Facts & Issues: Florida state courts are in crisis. The following is taken from the Florida Bar Web Page as of today April 10, 2013.

"Two years of budget cuts have undermined adequate and equitable funding of the court system, forcing layoffs and hiring freezes. In addition, by legislative formula, filing fees paid by court users do not directly go to fund the courts. On top of budget cuts and restricted revenue, caseloads have ballooned as the economy faltered. The result: Citizens are experiencing unreasonable delays in having their cases heard and resolved."

Over a decade ago the counties sought an amendment to Article V - Judiciary, of the Florida Constitution in an effort to stem the cost of the court systems. The results have not produced the savings to the counties that were anticipated.

Dear Commissioner Feagle,

First I would like to thank you for your ongoing support of the courts. We are sincerely grateful for the partnerships we share with the boards of county commissioners, clerks of court, and sheriffs in the Third Judicial Circuit. It is through our collaborative efforts that we best serve the citizens of the seven counties in our circuit.

As you may know, the clerks of court in Florida are under a mandate to implement e-filing statewide. The next step toward an electronic court is conversion of many of the functions of the courts and judges. Such a transition will reduce the costs and increase the productivity of the courts as we move toward a paperless court in which documents move through the system electronically rather than in paper files. Supreme Court of Florida Chief Justice Polston has made it clear to the twenty circuits that we are expected to make this transition as soon as possible, but definitely not later than the end of his term in July 2014.

The Supreme Court of Florida has established standards that must be met by judicial bench applications in the trial courts, and we have examined the options available. We considered the up-front costs of each option, as well as ongoing maintenance and staffing requirements. The option we have determined to be most cost effective for the Third Judicial Circuit is Mentis Technology Solution's aiSmartBench, which is a document retrieval and management system, with calendaring, docket management, and case management functionality.

The cost of implementing this system is \$300,000, the cost of which we have prorated among the seven counties in our circuit based on population. This proration was determined in the same manner as our annual facilities/technology/communications budget request to the counties. The prorated share for your county is \$35,456.39. The Chief Judge has determined this to be an appropriate expenditure for court

innovations funds if available in your county. We are asking for an appropriation to be made as soon as possible so that we can enter into a contract with Mentis and be placed on their implementation schedule. This amount should be paid into the technology fund in Hamilton County in the same manner as the annual facilities/technology/communications funding, although in a lump sum rather than quarterly payments.

In addition to Taylor County's prorated share of the overall costs, we have been advised by Mentis that an additional \$65,000 will be necessary in order to adapt the aiSmartBench application and make it compatible with the Duprocess system used in Taylor County's civil division. Because this additional cost is specific to Taylor County, we are seeking a total of \$100,456.39 from Taylor County (\$35,456.39 prorated share + \$65,000).

Here is our State Attorney Budget Request for your fiscal year 200 FOUNTY, FLORIDA
9/30/13). Enclosed are Attachments "A", "B", "C", and "D" explaining how your assessment was derived.

Our request this year again is tempered by the continuing difficult economic times we all face, and we are pleased to report that our request this year calls for only slight increases over last year. Our request this year is \$155,000 for Information Technology (I.T.) and \$234,074 for Facilities.

The Facilities request is for our lease in our main office in Live Oak (which increased as expected according to our lease agreement) and for telephone charges. As in the past, we assess 20% of these costs to all seven counties based on each county's population percentage of the circuit. The remaining 80% is assessed to the four counties served out of the Live Oak main office based on their population percentage of these four counties. A calculation of that assessment is also enclosed.

This year, the I.T. request is not only for on-going technology costs such as computer replacement, training, software & software maintenance, cell phones, and a partial reimbursement of I.T. salaries, but also includes required additional expenses we will incur to implement our "E-Filing" system.

As we noted last year, "E-Filing" is upon us. Florida Statute 27.341 requires each State Attorney to electronically file court documents with the clerk of the court, and electronically receive court documents from the clerk of the court. The development and implementation of our mandated E-Filing capability, on top of our continuing need to update and maintain our current I.T. needs, is presenting a challenging burden on already limited resources.

It is expected that the Florida Supreme Court will mandate that all Clerks be able to accept E-Filing in criminal cases by December 31, 2012, and that mandated E-Filing for all State Attorneys will be no later than nine months after that.

During the past year, we have worked closely with the FACC and their Director of Information Technology, Melvin Cox, as well as the I.T. staffs of the other 19 Florida State Attorney offices to prepare for this legislative mandate. Our office has already started purchasing some of the additional hardware and software needed to meet this challenge; however, we still have additional items needed which we will be purchasing in the upcoming year. Once all the necessary equipment is in place, we will have to train our staff on its proper use in order to fully comply with the new law.

The FPAA was required to file a report with the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by March 1, 2012 describing the progress that each of the State Attorney offices has made toward implementation of the E-filing requirement. This Report was timely filed, and pointed out the remaining obstacles facing all our State Attorney offices, including the need for additional budget authority. A copy of the report is available at your request.

This I.T. assessment is derived from circuit population percentages for each county. It should be noted that this request does not require the counties to fund many of our I.T. needs for which the counties would otherwise be responsible under Section 14 of Article V of the Florida Constitution.

We respectfully request that <u>separate</u> checks be issued monthly for (i) the Facilities Budget, and (ii) the I.T. Budget, and forwarded to this office. This is necessary due to the fact that our Facilities Account and our I.T. Account are maintained by different Clerks.

I want to thank you for past, current, and future support of this office. I feel we are truly partners in our on-going effort to provide a safe living environment for the citizens of the Third Judicial Circuit. Your support helps make that possible, and for that I thank you. I assure you that we have limited our request as much as possible in order to minimize the impact on each of our counties. I pledge to continue to do what I can to limit our assessments to the least amount possible each year.

I continue to look forward to working with each of you in the future as we move ahead to provide a just and cost effective judicial system in our Circuit.


