AN ORDINANCE OF TAYLOR COUNTY, FLORIDA WHICH ALLOWS GOLF CARTS AT INTERSECTION OF COUNTY ROAD 30 AND COUNTY ROAD 356, SPECIFICALLY AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE 2ND ACCESS DRIVE TO THE BUILDING LOCATED AT 3201 FOLEY ROAD DIRECTLY ACROSS FROM THE ENTRANCE TO THE BUCKEYE PARK SAME BEING LOCATED IN COUNTY, TAYLOR FLORIDA, AND ORDINANCE BEING PURSUANT TO CHAPTER **PLACING** 316.212 FLORIDA STATUTES, REQUIREMENTS WITH MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR OPERATING GOLF CARTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY **AND** PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TAYLOR COUNTY, FLORIDA THAT:

- **Section 1.** It is in the interest of the citizens of Taylor County, Florida to allow golf carts at the crossing 375 feet south of the intersection of County Road 30 and County Road 356. The crossing is placed at the 2nd access to the drive to the building located at 3201 Foley Road directly across from the entrance to the Buckeye Park.
- **Section 2**. The Board of County Commissioners of Taylor County hereby finds that golf carts, if operated properly, may travel over the road and intersection mentioned in Section 1 of this Ordinance.
- Section 3. Golf carts may be operated between the hours before sunrise and after sunset if equipped with, at a minimum, headlights, brake lights, turn signals, a windshield, and red reflective devices on the front and rear of the golf cart. Golf carts that do not meet the above standards shall only be permitted to operate between sunrise and sunset, and those golf carts must be equipped pursuant to Section 4 below.
- **Section 4.** Golf carts must be equipped with efficient brakes, reliable steering, safe tires, a rearview mirror, and red reflector warning devices in both front and rear.
- Section 5. Golf carts must yield to regular motor vehicles when it is apparent that the traffic congestion is occurring and shall in every event, yield to police and emergency vehicles.

Steinhatchee Boat Ramp is heavily used year round and is the only public boating facility in Steinhatchee. The boat ramp has been an extremely successful public - private partnership effort and in less than two years has become the busiest boat ramp in Taylor County. Due to the public demand and great need for a boat ramp in Steinhatchee, though fiscally constrained it was a County priority to purchase a site which would provide easy access to the Gulf and the Steinhatchee River. In 2011, with funding assistance provided by Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) Sport Fish Restoration - Boat Access Grant, the County purchased the 5.2 acres site now known as Steinhatchee Boat Ramp. This site is located directly at the mouth of the Steinhatchee River and the Gulf. In addition to the FWC grant, the Steinhatchee Waterfronts Florida Partnership Program spearheaded local fund raising efforts and donated \$15,000 towards the acquisition. Two of the key employers in Taylor County (Buckeye Technologies and Foley Land and Timber) donated \$100,000 towards the construction of the boat launch area. With funding assistance provided through a Coastal Partnership Initiative Grant, the County constructed a paved parking area on the launch side of the site and a picnic pavilion landscaped with native Florida vegetation. Recreational fishing and boating has an annual economic impact of more than \$14M on Taylor County which is critically important as the County is designated as one of "critical economic concern" and a "Rural Area of Opportunity". Per Taylor County Tourism Development Authority, and the Boating Access and Economic Valuation in Taylor County, Florida, more than 170 jobs are generated locally by tourism and activities related to boating and fishing. 85.7% of the boat ramp users are from out of County with 33.3% being from out of State. Per the Economic Valuation, 83.5% of the expenditures made by visitors who are using the boat ramp remain within the County. Having essential and adequate amenities and facilities such as restrooms is critical for continued economic growth and development generated by recreational boating and fishing in Steinhatchee. On a previous site inspection of the boat ramp, FWC staff made the recommendation to County staff to construct restrooms with showers at the boat ramp. Having facilities to "clean up" at after a day of boating encourages visitors to stay longer and enjoy restaurants, shops, and local events and activities. In addition to providing access to both fresh and saltwater fishing, the boat ramp is only nine nautical miles from the Steinhatchee Reef. This artificial reef system with a renowned productive underwater ecosystem offers a diversity of angling opportunities year round. The boat ramp is located at the mouth of the Steinhatchee River and the coastal waters in this area is known as Dead Man's Bay. The mix of freshwater and saltwater at Dead Man's Bay has created an abundant supply of fish and the area is nationally reowned for scalloping in the summer months. Per www.visitflorida.com Steinhatchee is often referred to as "The Best Kept Secret in Florida". With this, providing essential amenities such as restrooms and safe parking is important economically not only for Taylor County but also for the State of Florida.

Due to the high use of the boat ramp, the portable toilets must be pumped frequently to remove waste and hazardous materials. The portable toilets are treated with biocides to prevent odor. Biocides contain chemicals potentially hazardous to the environment and humans, with formaldehyde and other harsh chemicals being a key component in many deodorizers used for portable toilets. In addition to the contamination that could result in the pumping process, portable toilets are by no means coastal friendly and are biologically hazardous to the coastal habitat. The proposed restrooms will be constructed to sustain coastal weather Authority. Water and Sewer Municipal System which will have no negative environmental impacts. The restrooms will be constructed to sustain coastal weather hazards, thus alleviating the possibility of toxic materials and solid waste contamination from portable toilets in a weather event. The restrooms will be constructed to be energy efficient and environmentally friendly with low water demand plumbing fixtures and motion activated energy efficient lighting. Recycled materials will be used when possible. The paved parking area fills to capacity quickly on weekends and through out the entire week during the busy months of April through September. Boater overflow currently parks across the street on two acres which are part of the project site or along the street. Improvements to this area will offer an organized, designated area which will provide more parking spaces and protective measures to the environment and coastal habitat. The parking improvements will be placed where so needed to provide for sedimentation controls near the waterfront and launch area. No animal species or endangered vegetation will be impacted by the project.

Currently the paved parking area frequently fills to capacity, particularly on weekends and during the months of April through September. Truck and trailer overflow park on two acres across the street from the boat launch which are part of the 5.2 site. The improvements will have designated parking areas with wheel stops and signage. This will provide for much safer parking in an often very congested area. There will be a designated pedestrian crossing with a sidewalk providing additional safety measures. There will be boater safety educational signage installed adjacent to the parking area to ensure all boaters have access to the signage. The new restroom facility will provide handicap accessibility, being a great deal safer and more user friendly than a portable toilet for those with disabilities. The restrooms will have automatic low water demand plumbing fixtures and motion activated lighting

It has been brought to the attention of the Taylor County School Board about the need to review the traffic control signs and the speed limit on Highway 30 going to the Georgia Pacific mill. The concern comes from the increased number of log trucks now serving the plant and the concern that the Plant's east gate sometimes gets backed up with trucks having to wait on the highway to get into the mill.

These safety concerns have generated conversation about what could be done to enhance the safety protocols for trucks serving Georgia Pacific, Georgia Pacific's east gate, as well as local traffic that includes the Taylor County School District buses that travel that road.

This letter serves as a request to support the request to add any traffic control signage and review the current speed limit with considering lowering it for the safety of all that share this highway. If this could help prevent an accident, whether it be adults or school children, it would be worth the time to review the requests and concerns.

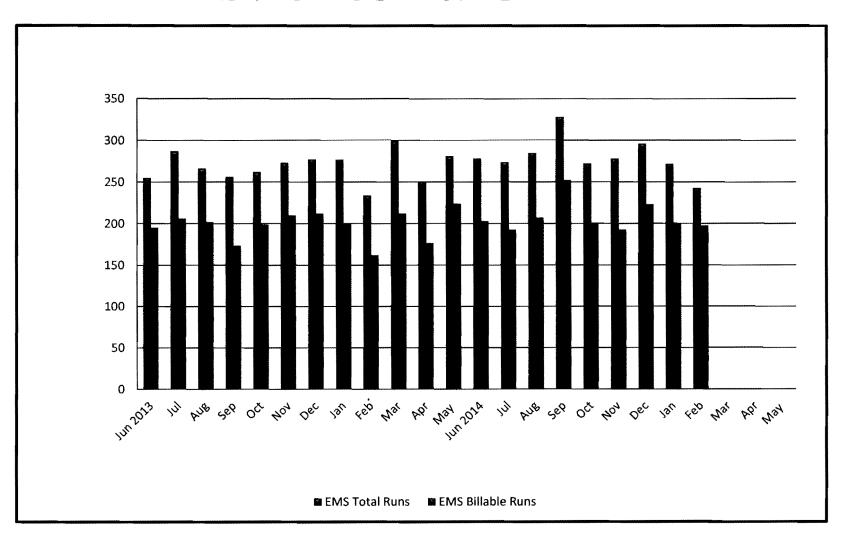

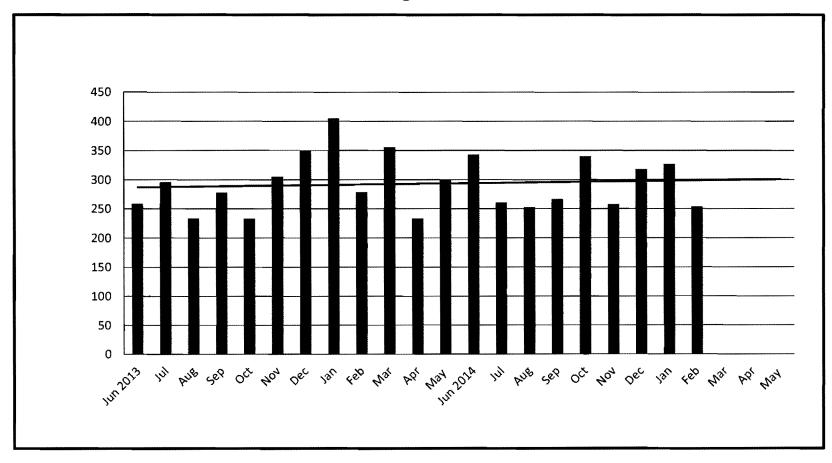

DMH Trending Graphs EMS Ambulance Runs

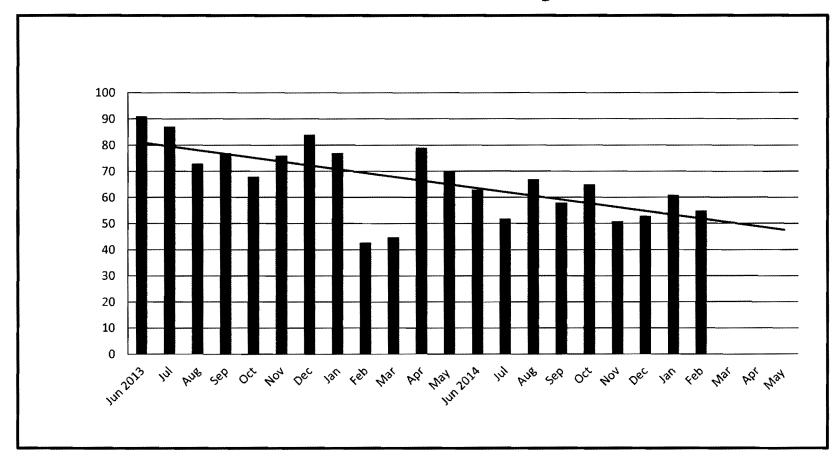


DMH Trending Graphs Acute Patient Days



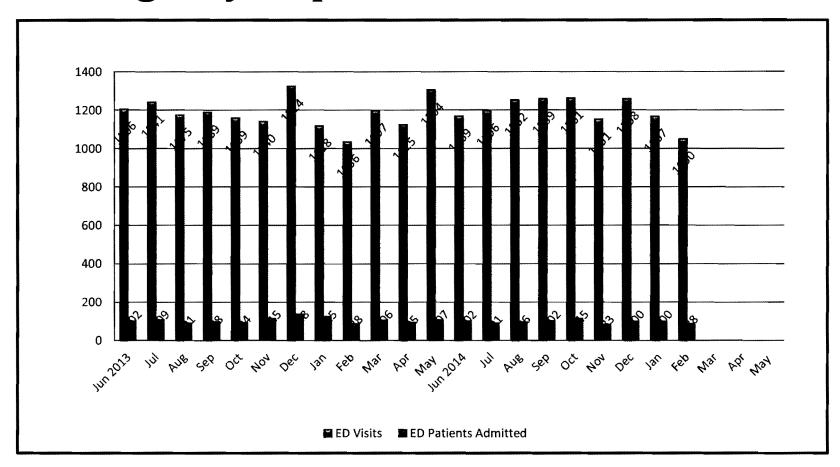

DMH Trending Graphs Observation Patient Days



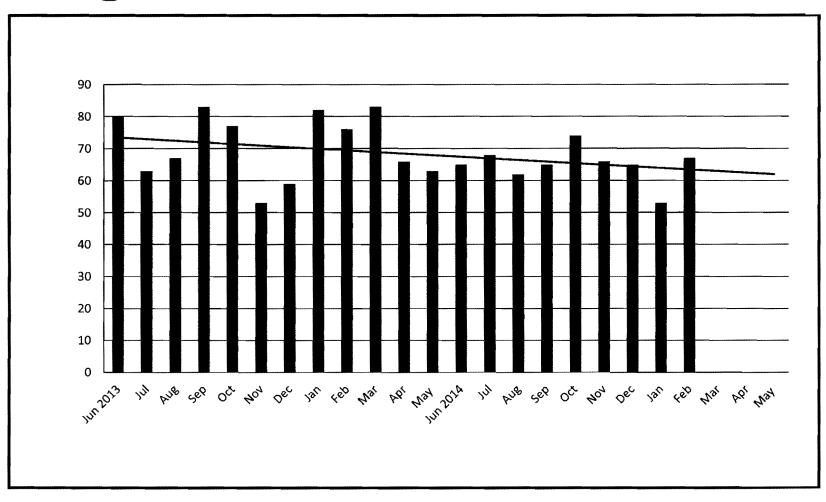

DMH Trending Graphs Emergency Dept. Visits and Admissions

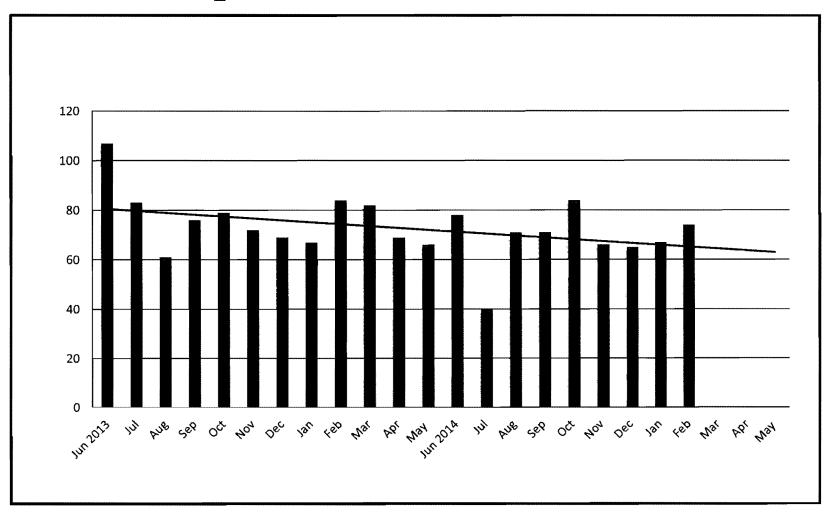

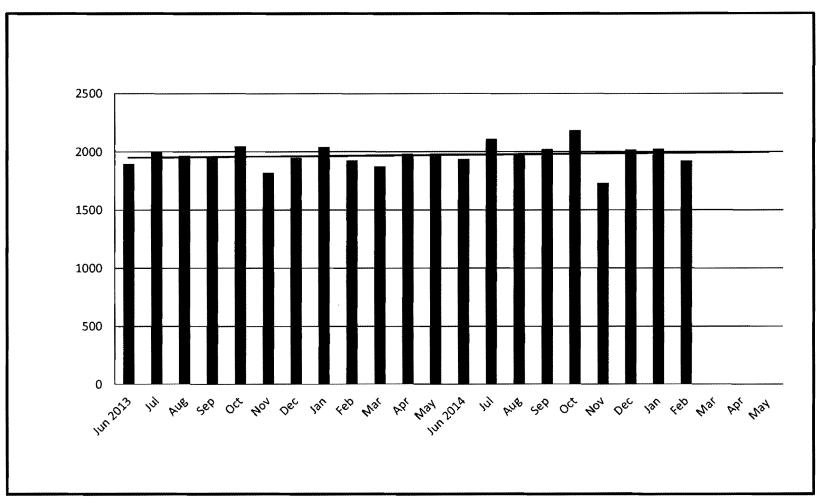
DMH Trending Graphs Surgical Procedures



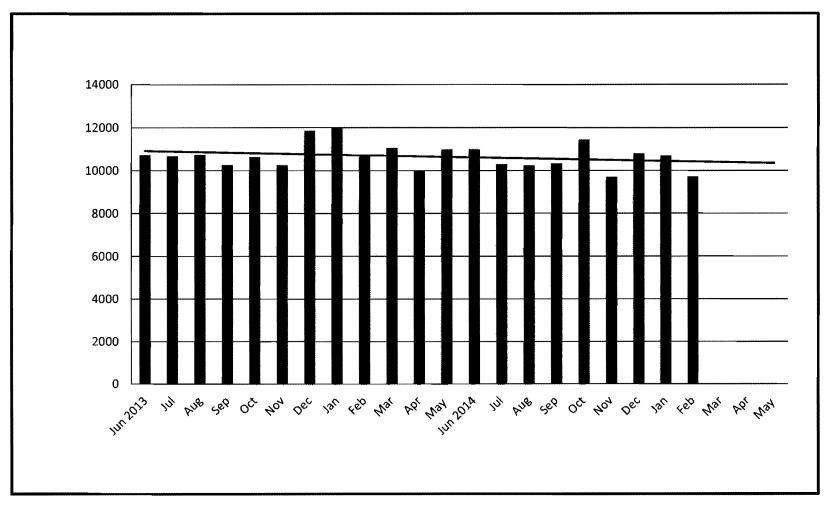
DMH Trending Graphs Endoscopic Procedures



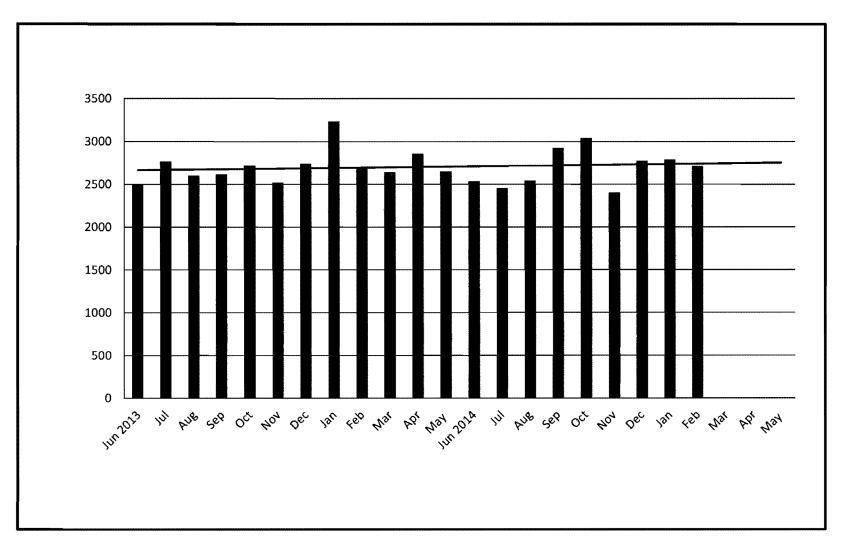
DMH Trending Graphs Radiology Procedures



DMH Trending Graphs Laboratory Procedures



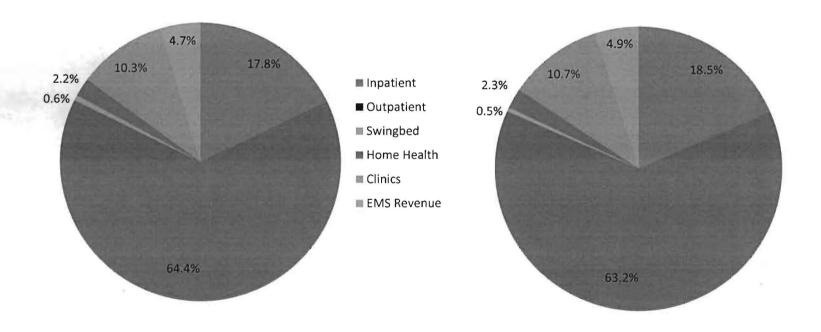
DMH Trending Graphs Clinic Office Visits



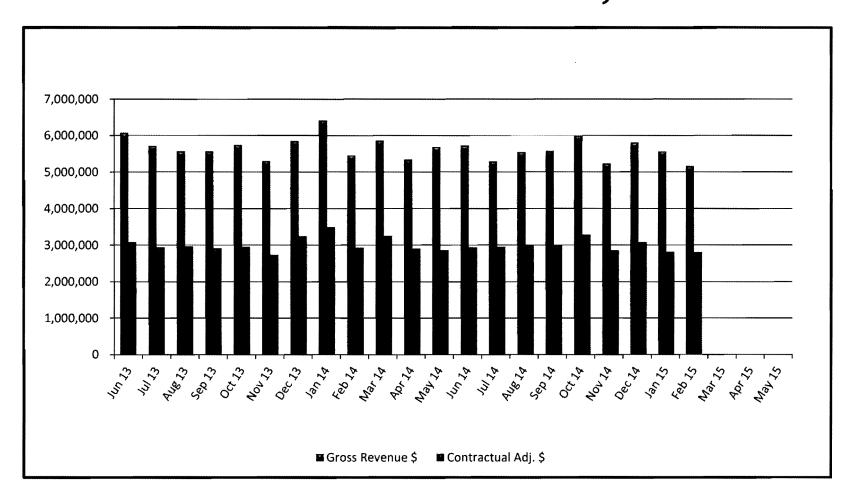
DMH Trending Graphs Year-to-Date Gross Revenue

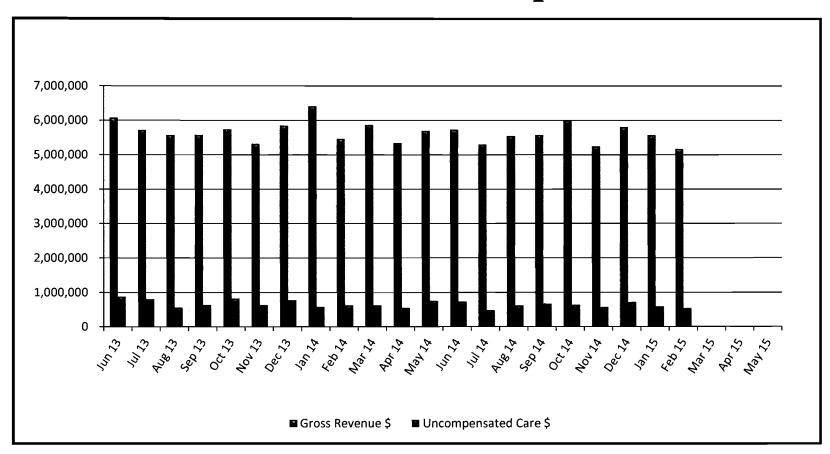


DMH Trending Graphs Gross Revenue vs. Contractual Adjustments

1. **SCOPE OF WORK.** The contractor shall provide all equipment and materials in strict accordance with the specification of the County and other documents herein mentioned which are a part of this Contract in connection with the following

"THE LEASING OF FORTY FIVE (45) ± ACRES TO BE ESTABLISHED AND HARVESTED AS HAY AT THE PERRY – FOLEY AIRPORT."

The forty five $(45) \pm$ acres field is to be established and harvested as perennial pasture/hay <u>Coastal Bermudagrass</u>.

Hay is typically harvested in early June or late May, again in early August and again in early October as weather permits. It is the successful bidder's option to harvest hay either as rolls or square bales.

The successful bidder is required to establish the forty five $(45) \pm$ acres hay field which includes the planting/sprigging of Coastal Bermudagrass.

The successful bidder is required to fertilize the forty five $(45) \pm$ acres at each hay cutting. The successful bidder is required to provide the County all information as to the type of fertilization and micro nutrients used at each cutting. Non-compliance with these requirements is grounds for contract termination.

Years 2018, 2019, and 2020 will be leased at <u>\$87.00</u> per acre for an annual payment of <u>\$3,915.00</u> due by September 30 of each year.

Years 2021, 2022, and 2023 will be leased at <u>\$87.00</u> per acre for an annual payment of <u>\$3,915.00</u> due by September 30 of each year.

This agreement will be for a period of nine (9) years.

If for some reason the successful bidder is unable to fertilize and harvest hay for an entire season the annul lease fee is still due to the County unless there is prior written consent from the Taylor County Board of Commission.

The successful bidder may not sub-lease the acreage.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (hereinafter the "AGREEMENT"), by and
between the Suwannee River Water Management District, a special taxing district organized
under Chapter 373, Florida Statutes, whose address is 9225 CR 49, Live Oak, Florida 32060,
(hereinafter the "DISTRICT"), and Taylor County, whose address is 201 E. Green Street, Perry,
Florida, 32347 (hereinafter the "COOPERATOR"), is entered into this day of
, 2015.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, COOPERATOR and DISTRICT (collectively the "PARTIES") desire to engage in projects that enhance the DISTRICT's water supply, water quality, flood protection and/or natural systems; and

WHEREAS, the COOPERATOR has identified to the DISTRICT a certain project that the COOPERATOR wishes to accomplish which will enhance the DISTRICT's water supply, water quality, flood protection and/or natural systems; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has evaluated such project and agrees that such project would enhance the DISTRICT's water supply, water quality, flood protection and/or natural systems; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has funds available and wishes to assist in the funding of such project provided that it is given certain assurances; and

WHEREAS, the COOPERATOR desires that financial assistance of the DISTRICT in funding such project; and

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement concerning the above and it is the mutual desire of the PARTIES to commit such agreement to writing and thereby create a legally enforceable contract between the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The COOPERATOR has proposed a certain project (hereinafter the "PROJECT") to enhance the DISTRICT's water supply, water quality, flood protection and/or natural systems.
- 3. A description and scope of the PROJECT is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
- 4. The DISTRICT has evaluated the PROJECT and finds that the PROJECT is a worthwhile project and believes that the PROJECT will enhance the DISTRICT's water supply, water quality, flood protection and/or natural systems. The DISTRICT agrees to

assist the COOPERATOR in completing the PROJECT by partially funding the cost of the PROJECT.

- 5. The DISTRICT's funding of the PROJECT, including total estimated cost of the PROJECT and the total funds to be paid by the DISTRICT is shown on Exhibit "B".
- 6. The DISTRICT's obligation to fund the PROJECT is contingent on the COOPERATOR accomplishing certain things and meeting certain goals, to the satisfaction of the DISTRICT including preparing plans, obtaining permits, inspections, deliverables, milestones, retainage, when the COOPERATOR may send invoices, etc. is shown in exhibits.
- 7. The terms under which the DISTRICT will be obligated to pay its share of the funding of the PROJECT, including, inspections, deliverables, milestones, retainage, when the COOPERATOR may send invoices, etc. is shown in Exhibit "C".
- 8. Upon the DISTRICT's payment of funds as set out herein the COOPERATOR will be required to complete the PROJECT as provided herein.

MISCELLANEOUS

9. The PARTIES agree that the following persons are the designated Project Managers and are to have direct, primary, and continuing responsibility for the work under this AGREEMENT. The COOPERATOR's Project Manager shall have the authority to interpret this AGREEMENT for the COOPERATOR and act to give all approvals for the COOPERATOR.

The COOPERATOR shall maintain books, records and documents directly pertinent to performance under this AGREEMENT in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles consistently applied. The DISTRICT, or its authorized representative, shall have access to such records for audit purposes during the term of this AGREEMENT and for three years following completion.
- 11. The COOPERATOR shall secure and obtain all local, regional, state, federal, and any other permits (including permits from the DISTRICT) required for activities listed herein and shall adhere to all permitting requirements.
- 12. Nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be construed as either limiting or extending the statutory jurisdiction of any of the signatories hereto.
- 13. The provisions of this AGREEMENT are for the sole and exclusive benefit of the PARTIES, and no provision of this AGREEMENT will be deemed for the benefit of any other person or entity.

COST SHARE REIMBURSEMENT: Upon completion of the installation of equipment and materials as set out in Exhibit "A", the DISTRICT shall reimburse the COOPERATOR the maximum cost share reimbursement set out in Exhibit "B". Provided, that for the COOPERATOR to be entitled to such reimbursement, the COOPERATOR shall:

- 1. Comply with all requirements of this AGREEMENT, including, without limitation, the completion of the improvements within the time provided. Provided that the DISTRICT may, at its sole discretion, grant an extension of time for completion for good cause shown.
- 2. Invoice the DISTRICT for the amounts due under this AGREEMENT on a monthly basis or as agreed to by both parties, until project is complete or until DISTRICT's portion of funding has been allocated. Such invoice shall contain copies of all invoices and cancelled checks to vendors showing the amount paid for all materials which are being reimbursed by the DISTRICT and the date of installation of such items. Such invoice must also include the following certification, and the COOPERATOR hereby agrees to delegate authority to its Project Manager as identified in this contract, to affirm said certification:

"I hereby certify that costs requested for payment, as represented in this invoice, are for the improvements as specified in the project in accordance with the agreement between the Suwannee River Water Management District and Taylor County, No. _______, are allowable, allocable, properly documented, and are in accordance with the approved budget and scope of work."

- 3. All installations and/or retrofits to be completed within 90 days from the execution of this agreement.
- 4. Upon completion of construction, provide to the DISTRICT a letter certifying that the project improvements as described in Exhibit "A" have been installed in compliance with vendor specifications and according to plans and per any required permits or approvals.

At all times during this contract term, the DISTRICT, through its staff and agents shall have the right to, from time to time, enter the applicable real property and inspect the improvements in a reasonable manner and at reasonable times with prior notification to document compliance with this contract.

Upon receipt of an invoice from the COOPERATOR, DISTRICT staff shall have the right to visit the site to verify the purchase of materials and installation as described in Exhibits "A" and "B".

Reimbursement payments shall be processed and payable no later than 45 days after the receipt of the COOPERATOR's invoice and information as specified in the agreement.

EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

THIS EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT (hereinafter, "AGREEMENT") made and entered into this 21st day of April, 2015, with a first day of employment of May 15, 2015, by and between Taylor County, Florida, a political subdivision of the State of Florida (hereinafter, "County"), and Dustin M. Hinkel (hereinafter, "Employee").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the County desires to employ the services of said Employee as County Administrator of Taylor County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to (1) secure and retain the services of the Employee and to provide inducement for him to remain in such employment, (2) to make possible full work productivity by assuring the Employee's morale and peace of mind with respect to future security, and (3) to provide a just means for terminating the Employee's services at such a time as he may be unable to fully discharge his duties due to disability or when the County may otherwise desire to terminate his employment; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to accept employment as County Administrator of said County; and

WHEREAS, the Employee and the County desire to set forth in writing their understanding with respect to the Employee's employment by the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>EMPLOYMENT, DUTIES, AND AUTHORITY</u>.

A. The County hereby agrees to employ said Employee as County Administrator of Taylor County to perform the functions and duties as specified below. In this position, the Employee will have the powers of County Administrator, subject to the control of the Board of County Commissioners of Taylor County, Florida (hereinafter, "Board"). The Employee will be primarily responsible for carrying out all

orders, ordinances and resolutions of the Board. The Employee shall serve as chief administrative officer of the County and the administrative head of County government.

- B. The Employee shall execute his duties under the direction of the Board and shall be responsible to the Board. The Employee shall work as directed by the Board and shall not be directed by an individual Commissioner. However, any Commissioner may meet with the County Administrator to discuss his or her concerns.
- C. Employee agrees to devote his full time, attention and best efforts to the performance of the employment hereunder. Employee will not, during the term of this AGREEMENT, directly or indirectly engage in any business, either as an employee, employer, consultant, principal, corporate or in any other capacity, whether or not compensated, without prior written consent of the County.
- D. The Employee, as detailed in Chapter 125.74, Florida Statutes, as County Administrator, is responsible for the administration of all departments responsible to the Board and for the proper administration of all affairs under the jurisdiction of the Board. The Employee, by way of enumeration and not by way of limitation, has the following specific powers and duties:
 - (1) To administer and carry out the directives and policies of the Board and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the Board to assure that they are faithfully executed.
 - (2) To report to the Board on action taken pursuant to any directive or policy within the time set by the Board and provide an annual report to the Board on the state of the county, the work of the previous year, and any recommendations as to actions or programs the administrator deems necessary for the improvement of the county and the welfare of its residents.
 - (3) To provide the Board, upon request, with data or information concerning county government and to provide advice and recommendations on county government operations to the Board.
 - (4) To prepare and submit to the Board for its consideration and adoption an annual operating budget, a capital budget, and a capital program.

- (5) To establish the schedules and procedures to be followed by all county departments, offices, and agencies in connection with the budget and supervise and administer all phases of the budgetary process.
- (6) To prepare and submit to the Board after the end of each fiscal year a complete report on the finances and administrative activities of the county for the preceding year and submit his recommendations.
 - (7) To supervise the care and custody of all County property.
- (8) To recommend to the Board a current position classification and pay plan for all positions in county service.
- (9) To develop, install, and maintain centralized budgeting, personnel, legal, and purchasing procedures.
- (10) To organize the work of county departments, subject to an administrative code developed by the administrator and adopted by the Board, and review the departments, administration, and operation of the county and make recommendations pertaining thereto for reorganization by the Board.
- (11) To select, employ, and supervise all personnel and fill all vacancies, positions, or employment under the jurisdiction of the Board. However, the employment of all department heads shall require confirmation by the Board.
- (12) To suspend, discharge, or remove any employee under the jurisdiction of the Board pursuant to procedures adopted by the Board.
- (13) To negotiate leases, contracts, and other agreements, including consultant services, for the County, subject to approval of the Board, and make recommendations concerning the nature and location of county improvements.
- (14) To see that all terms and conditions in all leases, contracts, and agreements are performed and notify the Board of any noted violation thereof.

- (15) To order, upon advising the Board, any agency under the administrator's jurisdiction as specified in the administrative code to undertake any task for any other agency on a temporary basis if he or she deems it necessary for the proper and efficient administration of the county government to do so.
- (16) To attend all meetings of the Board with authority to participate in the discussion of any matter.
 - (17) To perform such other duties as may be required by the Board.
- B. It is the intent of the Board to grant to the County Administrator only those powers and duties which are administrative or ministerial in nature and not to delegate any governmental power imbued in the Board as the governing body of the County pursuant to s. l (e), Art. VIII, Constitution of the State of Florida. To that end, the above specifically enumerated powers are to be construed as administrative in nature, and in any exercise of governmental power the County Administrator shall only be performing the duty of advising the Board in its role as the policy-setting governing body of the county.

2. TERMS.

- A. The initial term of this AGREEMENT shall be for a three year period commencing May 15, 2015 and ending May 14, 2018. The Board may, by vote, extend this AGREEMENT for two additional terms of one year periods. If, on or before 60 days before the expiration of this AGREEMENT (or any extension), the Board has not held a vote to extend this AGREEMENT, then this AGREEMENT will automatically extend for a one year period.
- B. The employment of Employee shall be at the will of the Board. Nothing in this AGREEMENT shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the County to terminate the services of the Employee at any time, subject only to the provisions set forth in Sections 3. and 5. of this AGREEMENT.
- C. Nothing in this AGREEMENT shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employee at any time to resign his position with the County, subject only to the provisions set forth in Section 3. of this AGREEMENT.

3. TERMINATION AND SEVERANCE PAY.

- A. In the event the Employee is terminated by the County before the expiration of any term of this AGREEMENT, or if this AGREEMENT is not extended at the end of any term and such termination or failure to extend this AGREEMENT is during a time when the Employee is willing and able to perform his duties under this AGREEMENT, then the County shall pay to the Employee on the final day of his employment liquidated damages in a lump sum cash payment in an amount equal to 25% of the total annual base salary payable under Section 4. of this AGREEMENT (hereinafter, "Aggregate Sum"). The County shall also provide health and dental insurance for six months commencing from the date of said termination under the same terms as if Employee were still employed by the County under this AGREEMENT. However, the County shall have no obligation to pay the Aggregate Sum, or health or dental insurance, if the AGREEMENT is terminated by the County for willful breach of this AGREEMENT or in the event that the Employee is convicted of a felony; however, in the event the Employee is terminated by the County for willful breach or conviction of a felony, the Employee shall be entitled to cash out his accumulated annual and sick leave pursuant to the same terms as other employees pursuant to the County Employee Manual in place on the date of this AGREEMENT.
- B. The Employee may, at his option, be deemed to be "terminated" as contemplated by Section 3.A. on the date of any of the following events: (1) the County at any time during the term of this AGREEMENT reduces the salary or other financial benefits of the Employee, or (2) following written notice, the County refuses to comply with any other provision benefiting the Employee herein, or (3) the Employee resigns following a formal request to do so by the County, or (4) the Employee's ability to perform the duties and functions of County Administrator are materially impaired by action of the Board.
- C. In the event the Employee voluntarily resigns his position with the County before the expiration of the initial term of this AGREEMENT (or any term of extension) as set forth in Section 2., the Employee shall give the County notice of 90 days in advance of any such resignation, unless the parties otherwise agree in writing.
- D. Notwithstanding anything in this AGREEMENT to the contrary, the County is hereby given the option to terminate this AGREEMENT in the event that the

Employee, during the term of this AGREEMENT, becomes permanently disabled due to a "serious medical condition" as the term is used in Section 5.C. of this Agreement. Such option shall be exercised by the County by giving notice of 90 days to Employee, sent by Certified Mail (return receipt requested) to the Employee's home address. This AGREEMENT shall cease on the 90th day after the Employee receives the notice, with the same force and effect as if the 90th day was the date originally set forth in this AGREEMENT as the termination date of this AGREEMENT. However, in such event, the Employee shall be entitled to the continuation of health and dental insurance for six months and to cash out annual and sick leave, as set forth in Section 3.A. of this Agreement.

4. SALARY.

- A. In exchange for his services rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the County agrees to pay to Employee an annual base salary of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) payable bi-weekly.
- B. In addition, the County agrees to place the Employee on a pay scale advancement plan in which the County will pay to the Employee, beginning May 15, 2017, an amount equal to the amount paid to the Taylor County Clerk of the Court. This pay scale advancement plan shall be implemented by two annual increases, commencing on May 15th of each year of the initial term of this AGREEMENT. The increased annual base salary shall be rendered forth from each date in equal amounts across Employee's base salary bi-weekly pay.

5. <u>HEALTH INSURANCE, LIFE INSURANCE, FMLA.</u>

- A. The County shall pay the full amount required annually for the cost of a health plan of the Employee's choosing with the County's current health insurance provider for the Employee, Employee's spouse, and Employee's children, if any.
- B. The County shall provide and pay for a term life insurance policy on the life of the Employee with a face value of twice his annual salary payable to the beneficiary or beneficiaries designated by the Employee.

- C. The County shall provide up to a maximum of twelve (12) weeks of salary and benefits to the Employee due to his inability to perform his duties due to a "serious medical condition" or other form of incapacity as defined under the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA).
- D. If the employee is not back to work at the end of 12 weeks due to the Employee's inability to perform his duties due to a "serious medical condition" or other form of incapacity as defined under the FMLA, the Board may terminate this AGREEMENT at its discretion, subject to the provisions of Section 3.D. of this AGREEMENT.

6. RETIREMENT.

Employee shall be a member of the Florida Retirement System (FRS) Senior Management Class as provided in Section 121.055(1)(b), Florida Statutes, or, in lieu of participation under the Senior Management Class, Employee may participate in the FRS Investment Plan pursuant to FRS regulations and/or another individual retirement arrangement of the Employee's choosing. Contributions will be made by the County on behalf of Employee, regardless of which option is chosen, at the rate equal to the rate paid for other members of the Senior Management Class.

7. <u>LEAVE ACCRUAL.</u>

- A. The Employee shall begin his employment under this AGREEMENT with his current balance of accrued annual leave and shall earn 200 hours upon the execution of this AGREEMENT, and earn 200 hours annually on the date of this AGREEMENT.
- B. The Employee shall begin his employment with his current balance of accrued sick leave and shall thereafter earn the same amount of sick leave as other employees of the County up to the maximum.

8. PROFESSIONAL DUES, SUBSCRIPTIONS, AND EXPENSES.

The County shall budget and pay for the Employee's professional dues, subscriptions, and related expenses necessary for his full participation in the Florida City and County Manager's Association, Florida Association of County Managers, and the

Florida Association of Counties, as well as for official travel, consistent with the Florida Statutes.

9. **AUTOMOBILE.**

The County shall furnish the Employee with his choice of an automobile from the County's fleet of vehicles.

10. **BONDING.**

The County shall bear the cost of any fidelity or other bonds required of the Employee under any law or ordinance.

11. OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT.

- A. The Board, in consultation with the County Administrator, shall fix any other terms and conditions of employment, as it may determine from time to time, relating to the performance of the Employee, provided such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with or in conflict with the provisions of this AGREEMENT.
- B. The Employee shall be entitled to all other benefits provided to employees of the County, except as otherwise modified herein.
- C. The Employee shall be entitled to receive any and all collateral or employment benefits and working conditions as are now or are in the future accorded to department directors by the County except insofar as this AGREEMENT provides for a greater benefit, in which case this AGREEMENT shall control.
- D. The County shall defend, save harmless, and indemnify the Employee against any tort, professional liability claim or demand ethics charge or other legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the performance of the Employee's duties as County Administrator. This provision is subject to Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and the County shall pay no more than is authorized by said statute. The County shall not be liable in tort and save harmless or indemnify the Employee for acts or omissions by the Employee while acting outside the course and scope of his employment or committed in bad faith or with malicious purpose

or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard for human rights or property. The County waives none of the provisions of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and a copy of Chapter 768.28 is attached herein and marked **Exhibit A**.

12. NOTICES.

Any notice required to be given pursuant to the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be given in writing. Notices shall be given by deposit in the custody of the United States Postal Service via Certified Mail (return receipt requested). Notices shall be deemed effective as of the date of receipt of such written notice. Notices shall be properly addressed to the parties at their respective addresses (Employee's home address) or to any such other address as may be specified by either party in writing.

13. ANNUAL PERFORMANCE REVIEW.

The County Administrator is subject to an annual performance review with the format to be agreed upon by the Board and the County Administrator.

14. **GENERAL PROVISIONS.**

- A. This AGREEMENT contains the entire AGREEMENT and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, oral or written, with respect to the terms of this AGREEMENT and may be changed only by an AGREEMENT in writing, signed by both parties.
- B. The waiver by the County of a breach of any of the provisions of this AGREEMENT by the Employee shall not be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach of this AGREEMENT.
- C. This AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation arising out of this AGREEMENT shall be Taylor County, Florida.
- D. Paragraph headings are for convenience only and are not intended to expand or restrict the scope or substance of the provisions of this AGREEMENT.

Dear Mr. Hinkel:

We would first like to thank you and the commissioners for your ongoing support of the courts. Support from the counties is vital to our success, and we appreciate and value the relationship we have with you. We are writing to you now on three primary issues of concern in Taylor County.

COURTROOM SOUND

After assuming the duties of your new position, you met with our court administrator regarding, among other things, the issues we were having with the sound system in the upstairs courtroom of the Taylor County Courthouse. She explained that we had moved the amplifier from Courtroom B to meet the immediate need, and we borrowed an amplifier from Columbia County to have sound reinforcement in Courtroom B. She also provided you with prior quotes from Music Masters, one for repairing the current system and one for replacing it. You stated that you would have your maintenance staff look at the system and advise you on your options.

The equipment borrowed from Columbia County has now failed, so there is no sound reinforcement in Courtroom B. The sound system in the upstairs courtroom is also inadequate and at risk of additional failures due to the age of the equipment. Proper sound reinforcement is vital to our courtroom operations. We need to be sure that everyone hears what is going on so that we can protect our citizens' due process rights and ensure that justice is served. This is also an investment that should last for many years, so funding a properly functioning sound system now seems preferable over continuing to put more money into a system that is old and inadequate.

We have been discussing this with Taylor County for quite some time now, so the last quote we received was in February 2013. At that time, the quote for replacement of the sound system upstairs was \$22,769.66, a copy of which is attached for your convenience. By replacing that sound system, we would be able to return the amplifier to Courtroom B and restore sound reinforcement there as well. We will be glad to have Music Masters give us an updated quote if this is something Taylor County is ready to pursue, and we strongly urge the commissioners to do so. It is our understanding that there are ample funds available to cover this cost in the court facilities fund.

SOUNDPROOFING

Another sound issue in the Taylor County Courthouse is the lack of soundproofing in the area of the upstairs courtroom, jury room, and circuit judge's office. This is critical, as jury deliberations are required to be confidential, and the circuit judge cannot work in his office during deliberations without overhearing the juror's conversations. There are also confidential proceedings and conversations that take place in the circuit judge's office at times, and those can be heard in the courtroom, jury room, and JA's office. This is another matter we are asking the commissioners to address as soon as possible, and we will be glad to work with you in any way possible to accomplish this.

DOOR ACCESS

We continue to be very concerned about courthouse security in Taylor County. While people are often lulled into a feeling of security in a small community like ours, Taylor County's courthouse is absolutely not exempt from attacks like those that continue to increase throughout the country. We will be working with the sheriff on some of our concerns, and we strongly urge you to do whatever possible to fund the requests that may come to you as a result of our joint efforts.

In the meantime, one of the many security matters of concern to us is the unscreened and unrestricted access the public has to the circuit judge's office. As a minimum level of immediate security, we are asking that a remote door lock be installed in the circuit judge's office so that visitors must be allowed access by the judicial assistant (or the judge in her absence).

While we are very sensitive to the budgetary constraints of the small counties in our circuit, there are basic needs that must be met to ensure safe and meaningful access to the courts, and compliance with applicable statutes and rules. These three requests are critical for our courts, and therefore a priority for us. Please give these matters your careful consideration, and feel free to contact either of us for more information or to discuss your concerns.
