Item #1: Open the Meeting – Trustee Grady called this meeting to order at 7:09 p.m.

Item #2: Consider Approval of the Minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting held on October 6, 2015 – Motion was made by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg, to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting held on October 6, 2015. Vote by voice call: Trustee Grady declared motion carried.

Item #3: Discuss Ordinance Amending Chapter 75 (Equipment Loads) of Title VII (Traffic) of the Tinley Park Municipal Code Relative to Overweight and Overdimension Vehicles. – Chief Neubauer gave an overview of the proposed amendments to the Village Code related to Overweight and Overdimension Vehicles. It was noted that the primary changes were due to the fact that the Village now has the ability to prosecute overweight and overdimension vehicles as a local ordinance violation. Motion was made by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg to recommend proposed amendments to the Village Code related to Overweight and Overdimension Vehicles. Vote by voice call. Chairman Grady declared the motion carried.

Item #4: Discuss Ordinance Amending Title XI of the Village of Tinley Park Municipal Code to Add Chapter 129I – Massage Establishments and Revise Chapter 129D – Sexually Oriented Businesses. – Chief Neubauer gave an overview of the proposed amendments to Chapter 129I and 129D of the Village Code. Chief Neubauer noted that the proposed changes would require massage establishments to obtain a Village license, unless a license for the massage service is already required by the State of Illinois. The proposed changes also require that employees of massage establishments obtain the appropriate licensing from the State of Illinois pursuant to the Massage Licensing Act. Motion by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg to recommend approval of proposed ordinance amending Chapter 129I and 129D of the Village Code. Vote by voice call. Chairman Grady declared the motion carried.

Item #5: Discuss Towing Services Request for Qualifications. – Chief Neubauer gave an overview of the nine (9) proposals received by the Village regarding Towing Services. Upon discussion, it was recommended that the following vendors contract with the Village of Tinley Park to provide towing services.

- STAT Towing
- Tinley Auto
- STS Towing

The firms are recommended for several reasons, including but not limited to, the following:

- Prior service history
- Storage location
- Security features
- Response time ability

The Committee also discussed and recommended approval of staff's proposed changes to the Village's Towing Fee Schedule as required by Village Ordinance. Motion was made by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg to recommend approval of staff's proposed Tow Fee Schedule. Vote by voice call. Chairman Grady declared the motion carried.

Item #6: Discuss Stop Sign at Ridgeland Avenue and Willow Lane. – Chief Neubauer gave an overview of the research conducted by Officer O'Hern related to a citizen complaint regarding traffic safety at the intersection of Ridgeland Avenue and Willow Lane. The Chief noted that upon review of the intersection it was recommended that a 3-way stop be implemented at this location. Specifically, stop signs on Willow Lane at Ridgeland and Forest Glen Dr. at Ridgeland should be added. Motion was made by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg to approve the recommended 3-way stop signs. Vote by voice call. Chairman Grady declared the motion carried.

Motion was made by Trustee Younker, seconded by Trustee Vandenberg to adjourn this meeting of the Public Safety Committee. Vote by voice call: Trustee Grady declared motion carried and adjourned the meeting at 7:28 p.m.
