Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz

This year was the busiest on record for call volume with the Department responding to 3,130 calls for service. This month we responded to a small house fire which started in the crawl space, but was quickly extinguished by our crews. The Fire Department also participated with the holiday events working with the other departments in the Unified Command Role.

On a sad note, veteran Lieutenant Adam Culbertson's mother passed away earlier this month. Also, Firefighter Tim Brooks' father (Firefighter Joe Haaga's grandfather) passed away. We continue to keep the Culbertson and Brooks/Haaga families in our prayers.

The remodeling of Station 49 has been completed. Not only has the remodel enhanced the overall appearance, but has also created more space in the kitchen for the Firefighters and Paramedics working at that station. This project was fully funded by the Foreign Fire Board at a cost of \$72,000.

We are looking forward to 2022, as we have several exciting projects in the works.

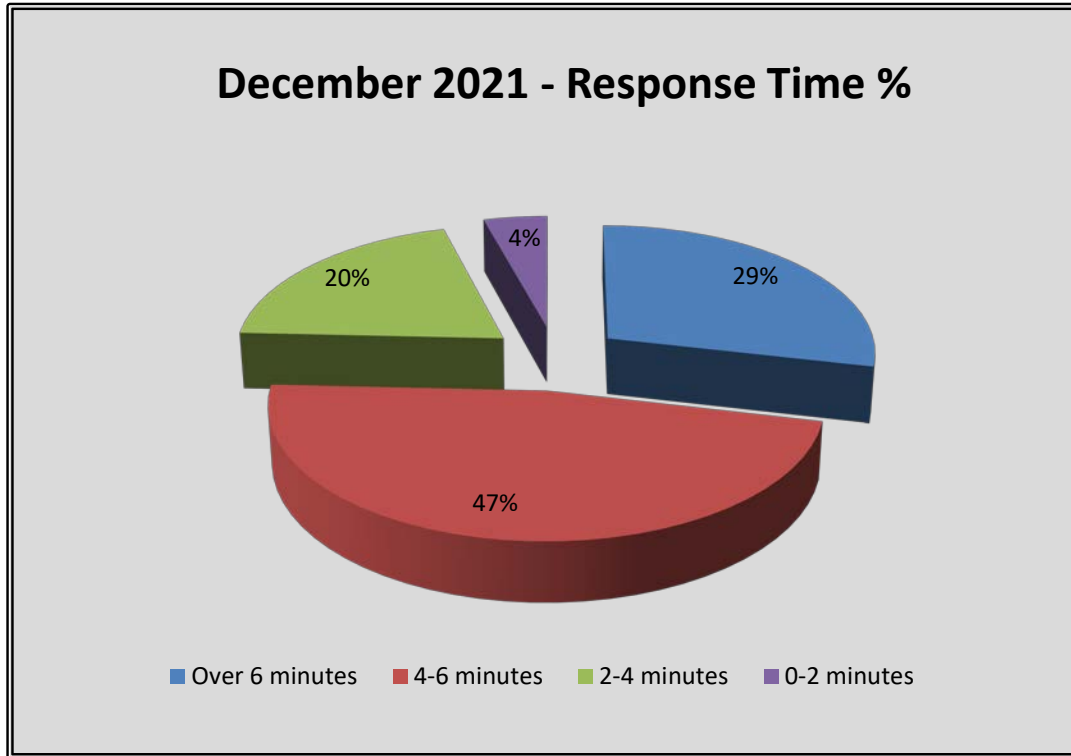
Summary of significant events:

 - Gas leak (natural gas or LPG) (5.85%)

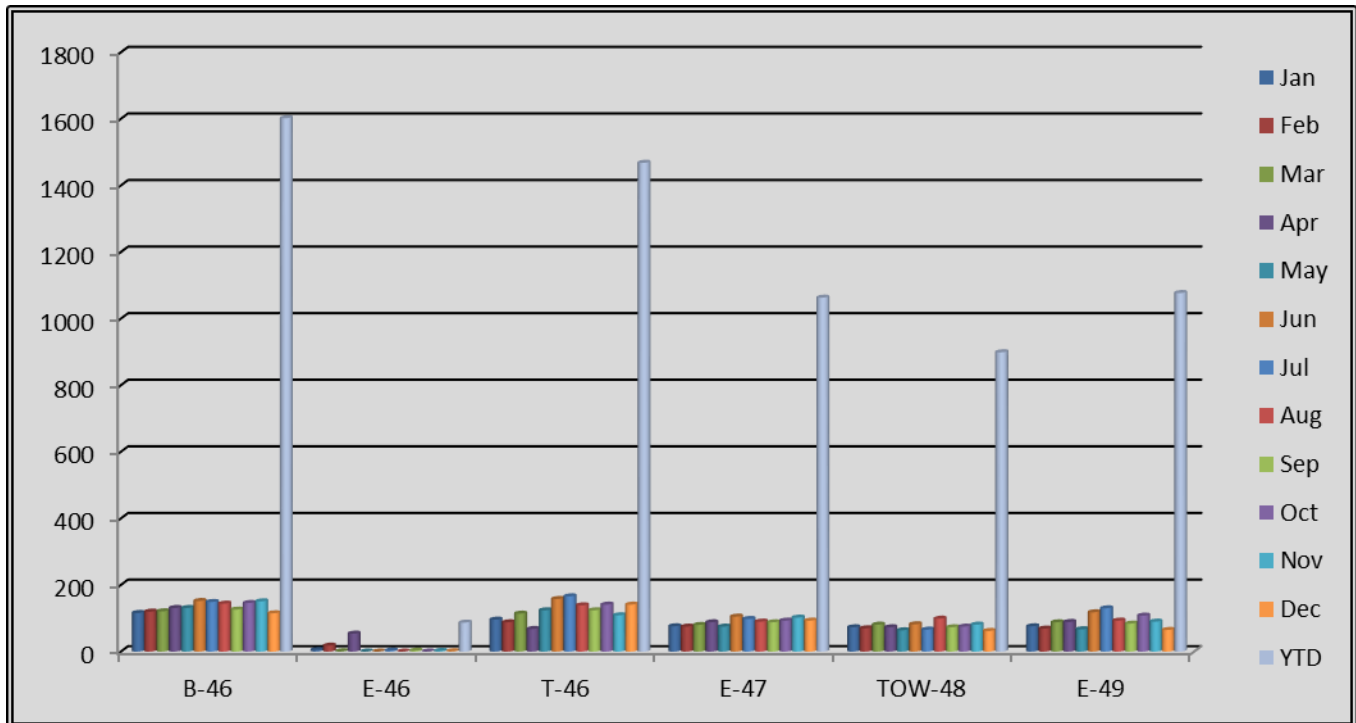
