Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz

The month of December was the busiest month this year with the Fire Department responding to 358 calls for service. Not only was this the busiest month, but 2022 was the busiest year ever in the Fire Department's history with 3,216 calls for service. EMS calls were 7,233 for a combination of 10,449 Fire and EMS responses. One of the fires this month was a heater on fire in an industrial building on Duvan Drive. We also had additional responses during the late December winter storms which caused several auto accidents.

We hosted our bi-annual retirement breakfast which was well attended. Fire Inspector Bob Buttala retired after 33 years of dedicated service.

I also ordered an internal Task Force to be created for emergency responses to the Tinley Park Mental Health campus due to the limited access we have to their buildings.

We are looking forward to the new challenges that we will face in 2023. Staffing will be on the frontline of our goals as our call volume continues to increase.




