Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz

The month of February brought 207 calls for service with several of those incidents being significant. We had 4 structure fires with substantial damage on a couple of them. We responded to a large brush fire that required Mutual-Aid to control the fire. We also responded to 183rd Street and 91st Avenue for an accident that required extrication.

The new recruit fire academy has completed their first month. All the candidates are doing very well and are showing pride and desire to succeed.

 - Air Fill station at Station 47 is scheduled to be installed in March
 - Fit testing will be completed in March

 - Box 46-3 5 minutes 51 seconds

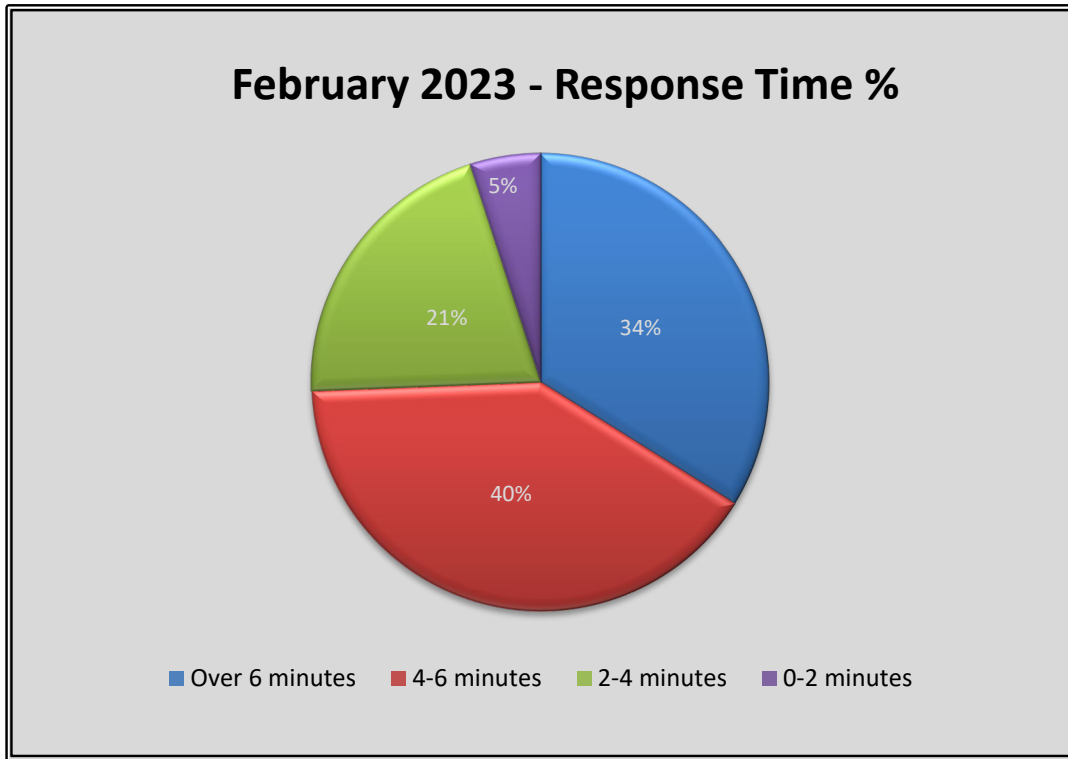
- **Top 5 incident types:**

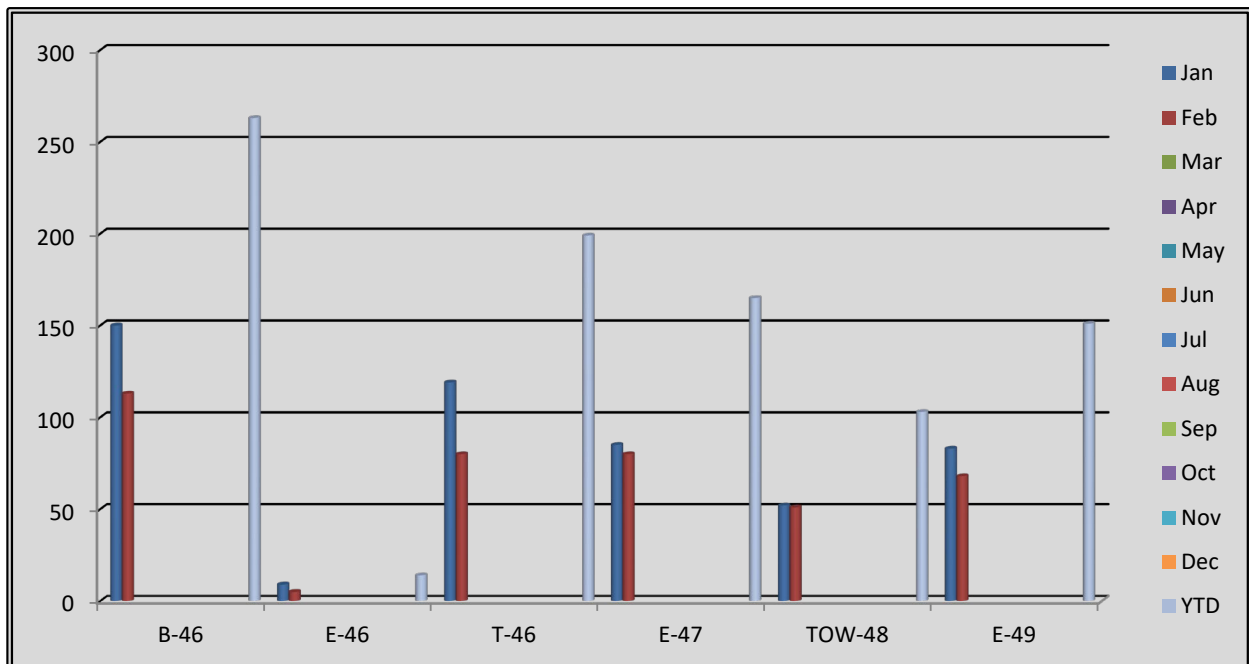
