## *Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz*

The month of January had a busy start with 255 calls for service. We had two significant fire responses during this month with one large house fire that we assisted Thornton Fire Department with, and the other was in our town on 171<sup>st</sup> St. The house fire in town resulted in a resident receiving burns to her hands. Our drone team also assisted MABAS 24 at the Thornton Quarry with locating and recovering an individual.

The Training Division along with the help of HR have been busy processing our academy bound employees for an early February start date.

We are continuing to update all needed policies to remain compliant with all needed standards.

The next several months will be busy with the academy classes and getting students familiarized with our department's operations.

  - Smoke detector activation, no fire – unintentional (4.47%)

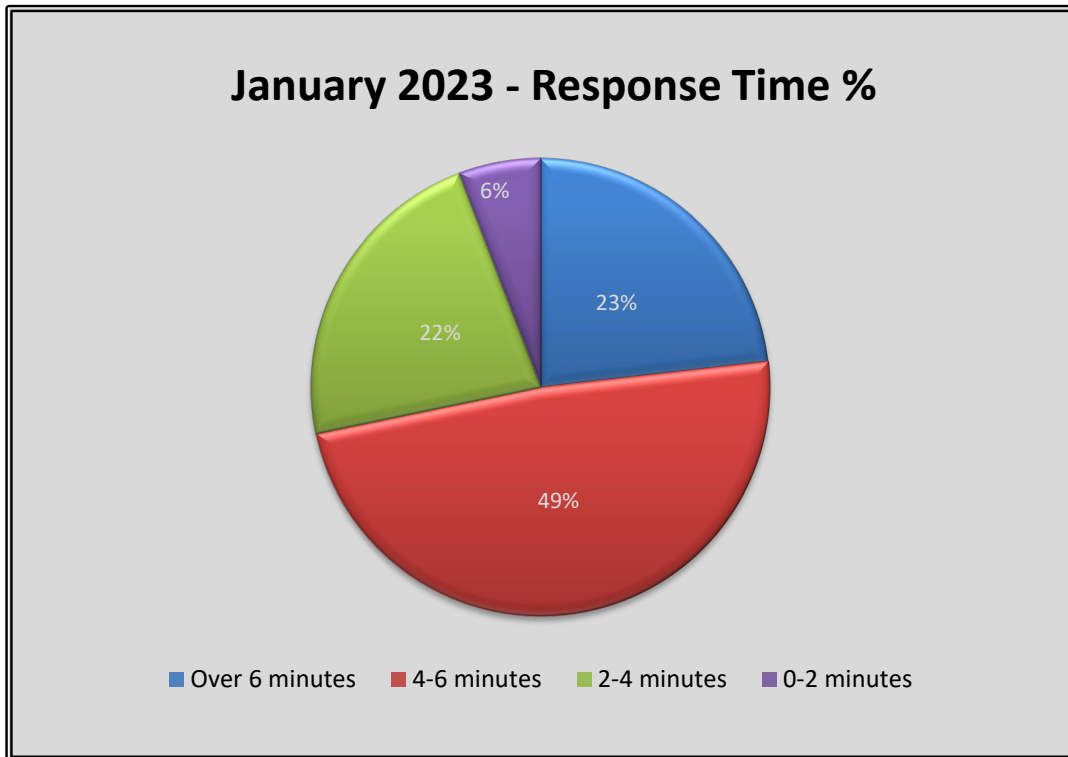

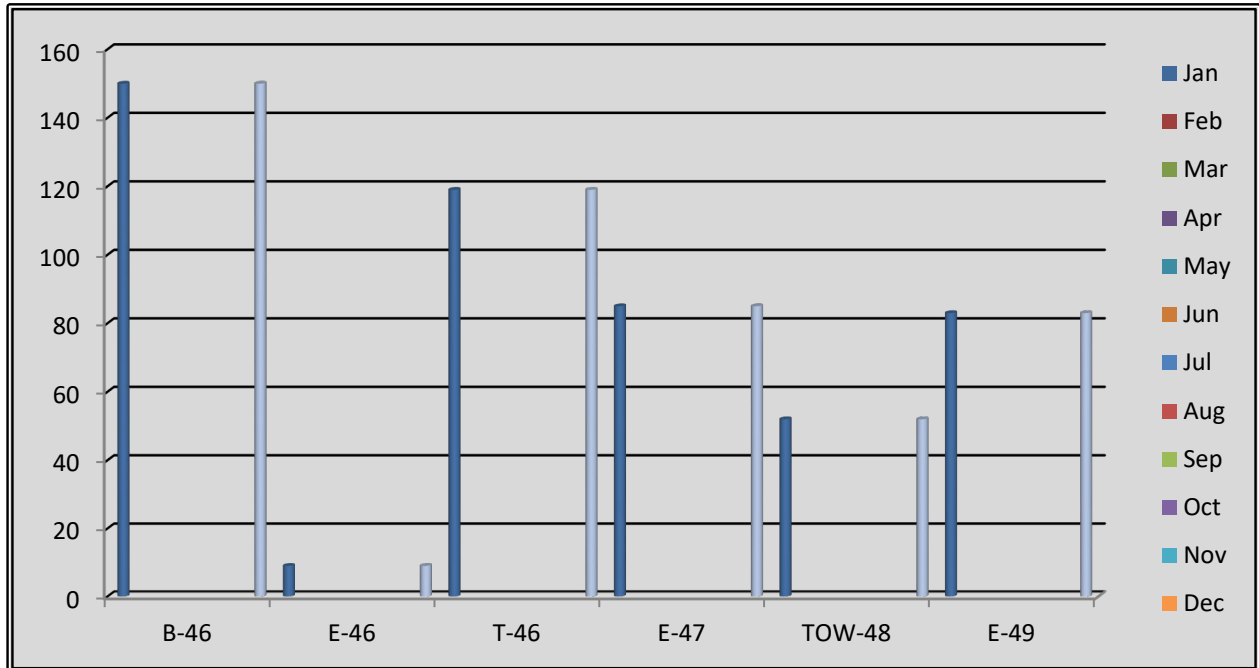
