Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz

January was a busy month with 233 calls for service. We had extra staffing a couple of times in the month of January due to the severe cold. Our crews also assisted Orland Fire Department with an apartment fire.

This month also brought some changes to the upper management of the Fire Department. With the retirement of Deputy Chief Riordan, Assistant Chief Reda was promoted to Deputy Chief, and Inspector Lorendo was promoted to a new position of Fire Marshal. Both Dan and Steve have hit the ground running, and are doing a great job.

I am also pleased to announce that we have posted to fill the two vacant Assistant Chiefs positions. We hope to have the vacancies fill by the end of February. We also welcomed 4 new firefighters to the Department, which brings us up to 9 new members. Our goal is to bring on a total of 15 new firefighters to shore up the gap we have been experiencing.

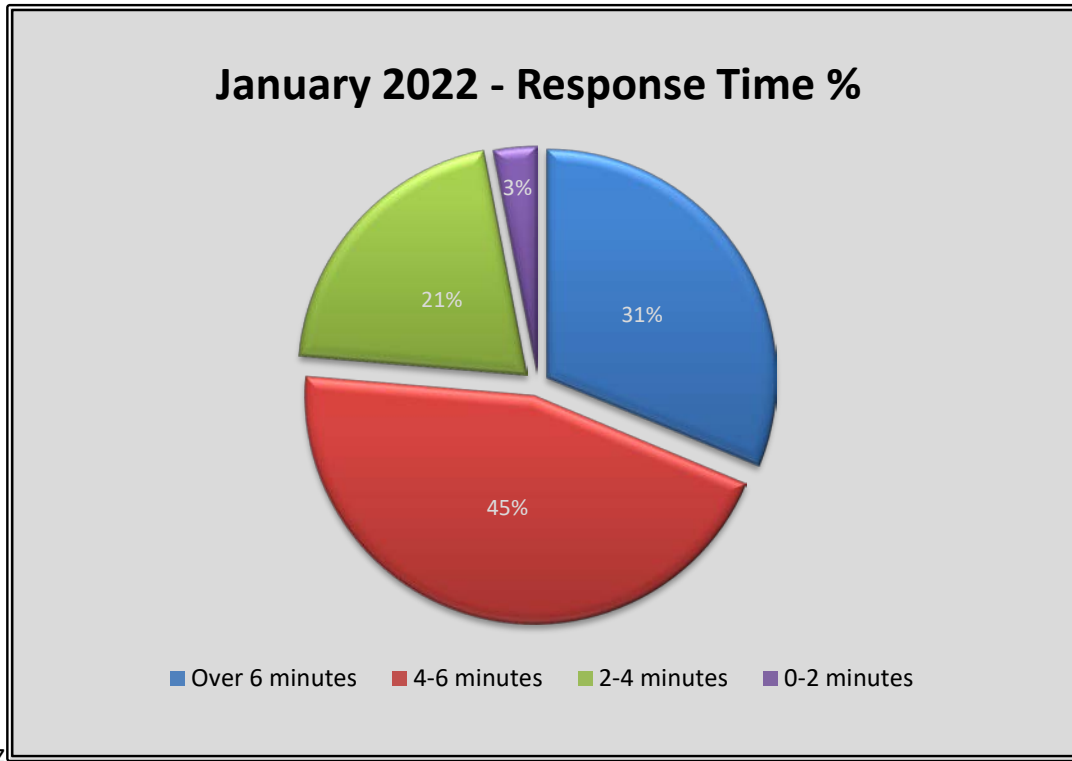
- Response time average for January was 5 minutes and 16 seconds.

 - Alarm system activation, no fire – unintentional (5.38%)

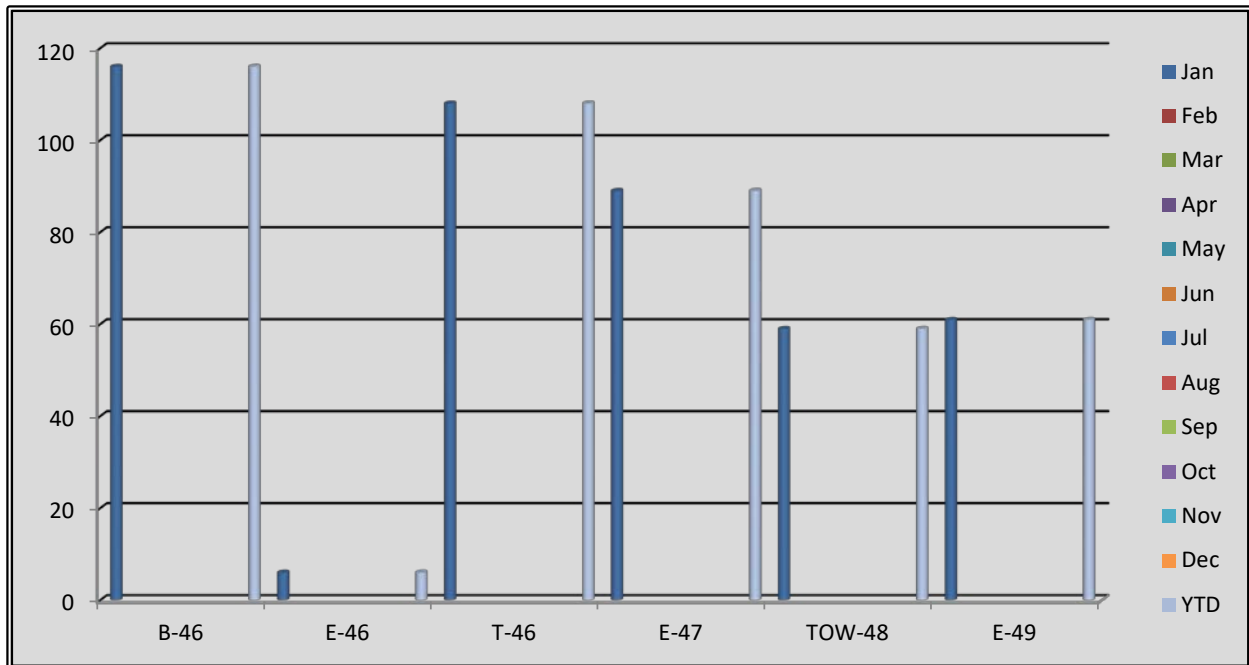
