Department Remarks – Chief Stephen Klotz

The month of March proved to be a challenging time for the fire department. We responded to 247 calls for service this month. Of those calls, two were structure fires. We had a resident hurt along with two firefighters in the first one. The second fire the resident was able to escape unharmed due to the working smoke detectors. We also responded to a large brush fire during the month of March.

Our fire academy is moving along well. The graduation will be held in June, the exact date to be determined. After their graduation these firefighters will be able to start working on shift.

We set up a meeting with CSX railroad to discuss some of the recent train derailments that have occurred in other jurisdictions. This meeting will be held at our Unified Command Team meeting.

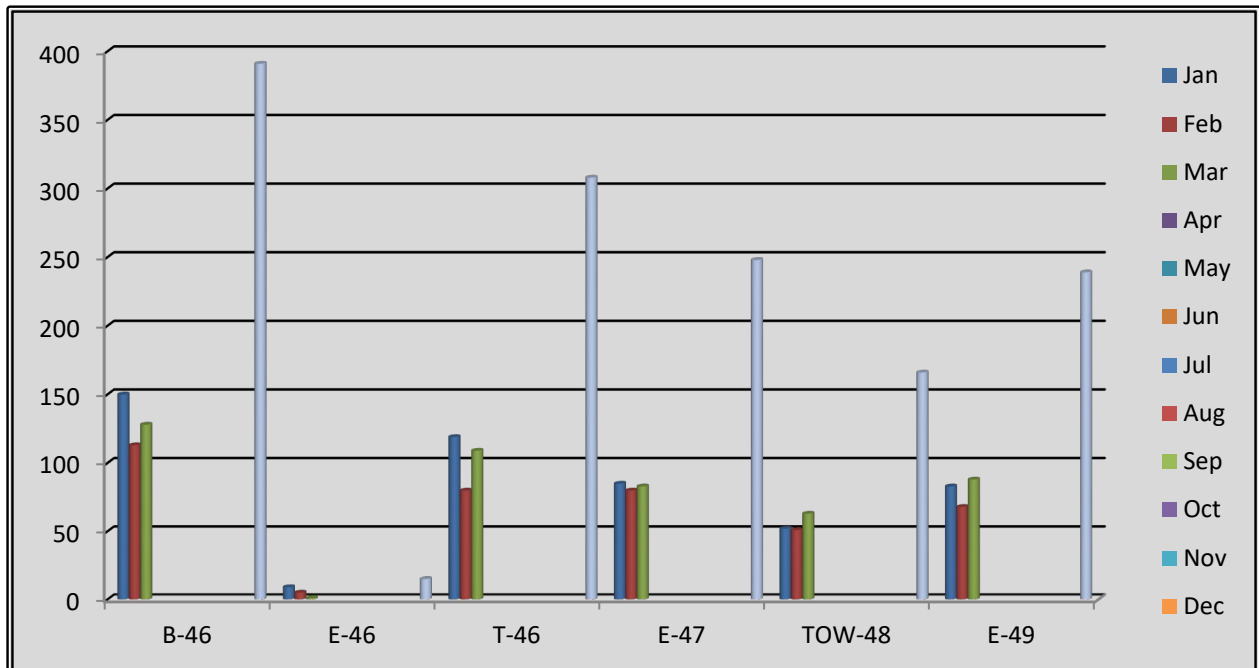
