August was a very busy and challenging month for the fire department. We responded to 306 calls for service throughout the month. We had a couple of structure fires in town and assisted some of our surrounding towns with mutual aid. The extreme heat presented a challenge for our firefighters as we need more help to give ample rehab for the crews.

Our newest recruits are working very well. They are being mentored while working on shifts by our more seasoned firefighters.

Our Public Education crew is in full swing with setting up appointments to visit all the schools in town. We also schedule fire drills for all the schools as it is mandated by the State.

We will be hosting the Patriot's Day Ceremony at Station 46 on Monday, September 11th starting at 7:30 am. We invite all to join.

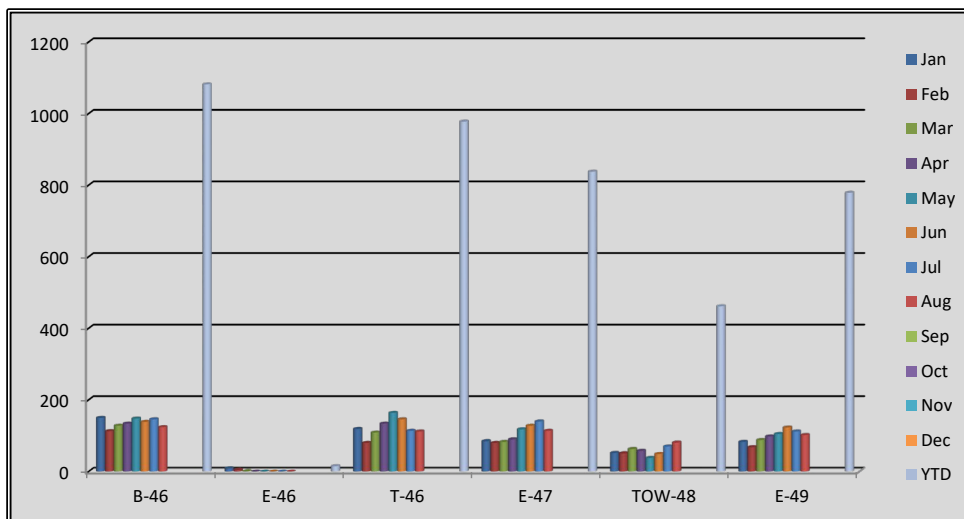
