The month of June was the busiest month this year with 355 calls for service. Due to the recent drought, our brush and mulch fires were much greater than normal.

We have been working hard with the planning of the Rib Fest and the upcoming Downtown Block Party. I am pleased to say that our recent Fire Academy students will be graduating on July 8th. Once they graduate, they will start working shifts. We also had the retirement of Lieutenant Bob Reynold who gave the department 21 dedicated years of service.

Our Fire Department continues to attend family block parties throughout the Village which is a great opportunity for us to share fire safety tips and meet our residents.

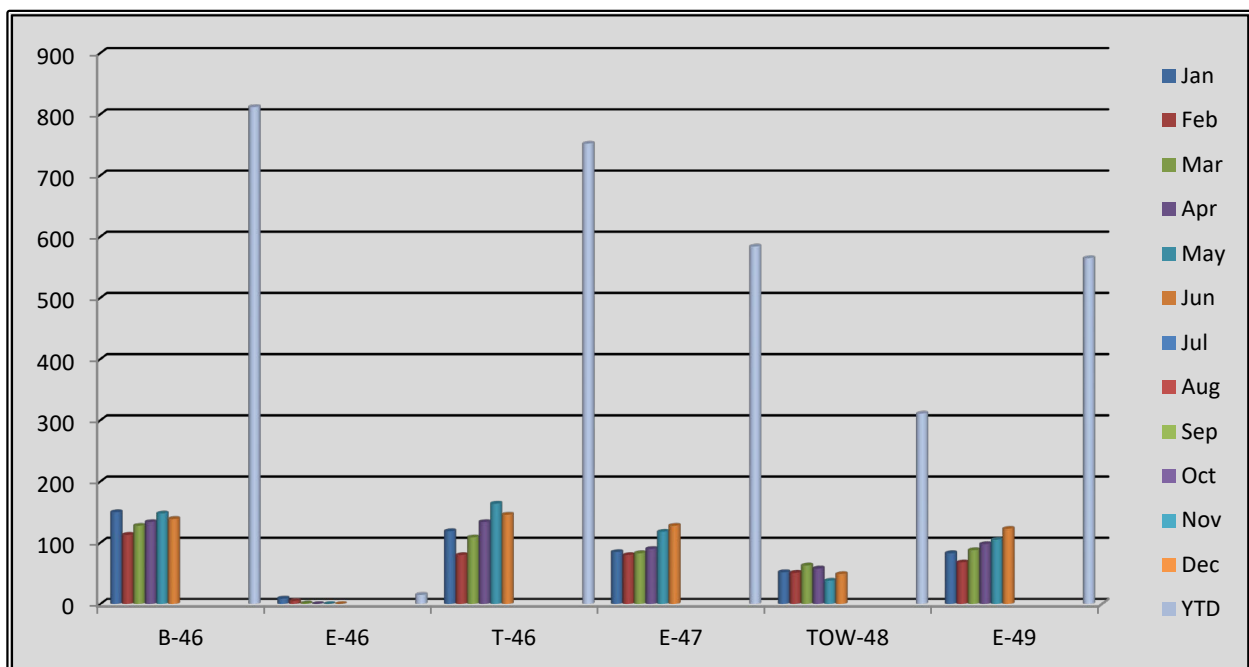
