To: Peter Cote a Resident in the Town of Waterboro, in the County of York and the State of Maine.

GREETINGS: In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby commanded to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Waterboro, qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to assemble at the Waterboro Town Hall, 24 Townhouse Road, in said Town on Tuesday, 13 of June 2023, at 7:00 a.m. then and there to act upon Article 1, and by secret ballot on Articles 2 through 26 as set out below, the polling hours therefore to be from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m..

Absentee ballots will be processed June 9, 2023, beginning at 9:00 am.

<u>ARTICLE 1</u>: To elect a Moderator to preside at said election.

ARTICLE 2: To elect all necessary Town Officials by secret ballot as follows:

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the purchase of a new Transfer Station Roll Off truck and to finance said purchase through a lease-purchase agreement in a principal amount of up to \$260,000 and to appropriate the proceeds thereof for the purpose of financing the costs of a Roll Off Truck, with the details of such borrowing (including, but not limited to, provisions related to prepayment, dates, term and interest rates(s)) to be determined by the Board of Selectmen, and debt service payments to be subject to annual appropriation.

Explanatory Note: Currently the Town has 1 roll off truck, however due to the volume and need for repairs, a second truck would ensure the efficient and continued operation of hauling waste to ecomaine.

(Note: Total estimated debt service is \$295,760.72, of which \$260,000 is principal and estimated interest at a rate of 4.722%, over 4 years is \$35,760.72. The Town anticipates that it will order the truck in this fiscal year (FY23-24), but that the truck may be delivered in the next fiscal year (FY24-25) and the first principal payment will be deferred until next fiscal year (FY24-25). The Board of Selectmen recommends a "yes" vote. The Budget Committee recommends a "yes" vote.

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<u>ARTICLE 4</u>: Do you support the planning, engineering, and appropriating \$50,000 towards the construction, planning and engineering of a public works facility and authorize the Town Administrator/Board of Selectmen to apply for any available grant funding that might be available.

Explanatory Note: This building would allow the Town of Waterboro a facility to work on equipment and to be prepared to assume plowing of our approximately 70 miles of roads. Currently we have a 3year contact (outside vendor) for our winter plowing for a cost of \$729,000 which is an increase of 42% over the past 3 years. The cost to outsource our winter plowing continues to rise. We need to be prepared in 3 years to plow a portion or all of our roads, which will require us to purchase several plow trucks in subsequent years. For several years we have only had (1) bidder, which raises several concerns and requires us to look ahead. This investment will position our community to be prepared and ready, while also providing adequate staff workspace, and storage of expensive equipment.

ARTICLE 5: Should the Town of Waterboro, Maine allow Medical Marijuana Retail Business to operate under Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act, 22 MRSA Chapter 558-C? Outlined within ordinance titled "Medical Cannabis Retail Store Ordinance".

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the I.T. Department, with fiscal approval from the Town Administrator, to appropriate up to \$25,000 of franchise fees to enter into joint partnerships with the Cable TV Company (currently Charter/Spectrum) and/or in conjunction with State and/or Federal grants for the purpose of expanding broadband internet to un-served areas in the Town of Waterboro. Note: this money is **NOT** raised through taxation.

Explanatory Note: Franchise fees are paid to the town by Charter/Spectrum and are generally designated to be used for Cable TV operations. A portion of these funds support the Town Hall meeting broadcast equipment and staff, operation of the Public Access TV station, and equipment repairs and upgrades. The \$25K request in this article represents the portion of franchise fees that will not be expended in the aforementioned operations.

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$95,000 for the first annual debt service payment of certain capital equipment identified in the FY 2024 Municipal Budget Capital Improvement Program including a wood chipper for the Department of Public works, an F550 truck with body for the Department of Public Works, a ³/₄ ton truck for the Department of Public Works, and extrication tools for the Fire Department, and to finance said purchases through one or more lease-purchase agreements in an aggregate principal amount estimated at \$278,500, and to appropriate the proceeds thereof for the purpose of purchasing said capital equipment, with the details of such borrowing (including, but not limited to, provisions related to prepayment, dates, term and interest rates(s)) to be determined by the Board of Selectmen and Town Administrator, and debt service payments to be subject to annual appropriation.
