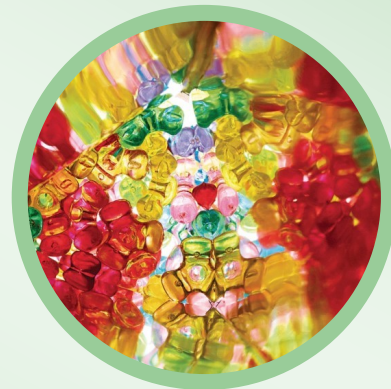

This workshop is for Adults and Teens! Supplies are provided.

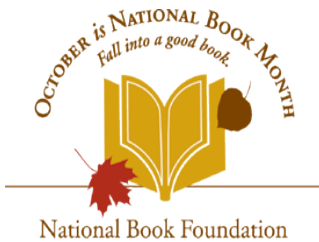

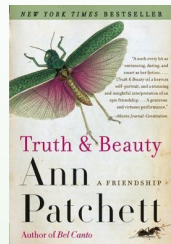


Books & Banter Book Group

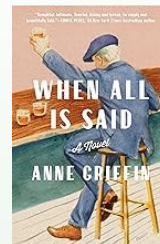

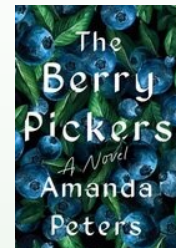

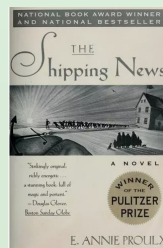


Opening Lines Book Group

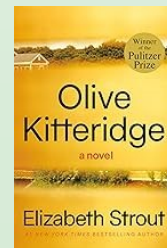

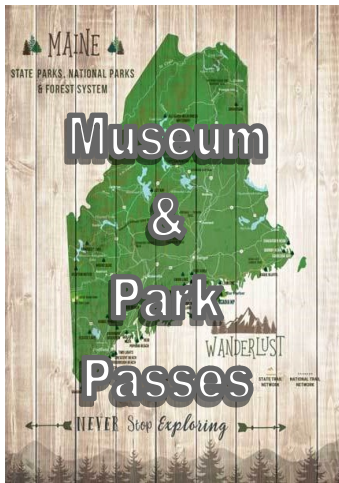
