City of Waterloo Development Update SPRING 2019

BUSINESS DISTRICTS & INDUSTRIAL PARKS

Hwy 20/Hwy 63 Corridor

Cedar Valley Crossing Work continues on the 10 lot commercial subdivision near the intersection of Highway 63 and Highway 20. Cedar Valley Crossing is working towards finalizing the plat for the area and will continue grading and road construction in the spring. The subdivision is designated for professional offices, commercial and light industrial businesses.

Cardinal Construction has started work on their building along Martin Road. The 20,000 square foot facility will be the new headquarters for the company.

Vandello Family Dentistry construction is well underway on a \$1.75M dental office near the northeast corner of Highway 63 and Ridgeway.



Midport

Waterloo Air & Rail Park located just west of the Waterloo Regional Airport continues to move forward with platting to open up over 400 acres for development purposes. This industrial park will allow for commercial and industrial uses to utilize not only rail lines to the area but also allow for easy access to the Waterloo Regional Airport.

Downtown

Art Bloc construction began for the multi-use structure along the Riverfront. Ground level of the structure will be reserved for parking with the second floor reserved for retail and commercial space. Levels three through seven will be housing with each unit overlooking the Cedar River

The Friedl Bakery building at 300 Commercial Street renovation will begin this spring. The first floor will be designated as retail/commercial space with floors two and three designated for residential. An estimated investment of \$2.1 million will be made with the renovation and the building will be restored to the original historical esthetics of the Friedl Bakery.



Northeast Industrial Park

Tyson Foods continues construction on their 50,000 square foot expansion. An additional 245 jobs are expect at the Waterloo facility.

The City is in process of platting approximately 45 acres west of GT Drive into four lots to allow for additional industrial development.

The City recently acquired an additional 19 acres East of John Deere for industrial development along Elk Run Road.

Waterloo Sewer & Water Rates Still Lowest

A 2018 survey compiled by the city of Ames found the average residential customer in Waterloo has lowest combined water and sewer bills of the 38 lowa communities with populations exceeding 10,000 people monthly housing costs.
