ANNUAL REPORT

Waterloo Fire Rescue (WFR) has been serving the City of Waterloo since the 1800s, but became a recognized department in 1904.

The current mission statement that guides the members of WFR is "To protect the lives and properties of the citizens of Waterloo by being an innovative and progressive emergency service organization.

The current approved sworn member count for WFR is one hundred eleven(111). We also have two (2) full-time non-sworn members within our department's family.

Waterloo Fire Rescue recognizes and strives to achieve the supported guidance from the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA). NFPA Standard 1710 establishes an 80 second "turnout time" and 480 second "travel time" benchmark time goal for the deployment of "an initial full alarm assignment at a fire suppression incident" for not less than 90% of dispatched incidents.

2022 Year In Review

PREVENTION MEASURES

WFR implemented an 'After the Fire' initiative in 2021. This initiative, combined with our partnership with the American Red Cross, has enabled residents to request smoke detectors, and smoke detector installations, free of charge. In 2022 WFR installed 103 new smoke detectors in 37 homes.

WFR has also continued to expand their Knox Box program with 8 additional residential key boxes installed this year.

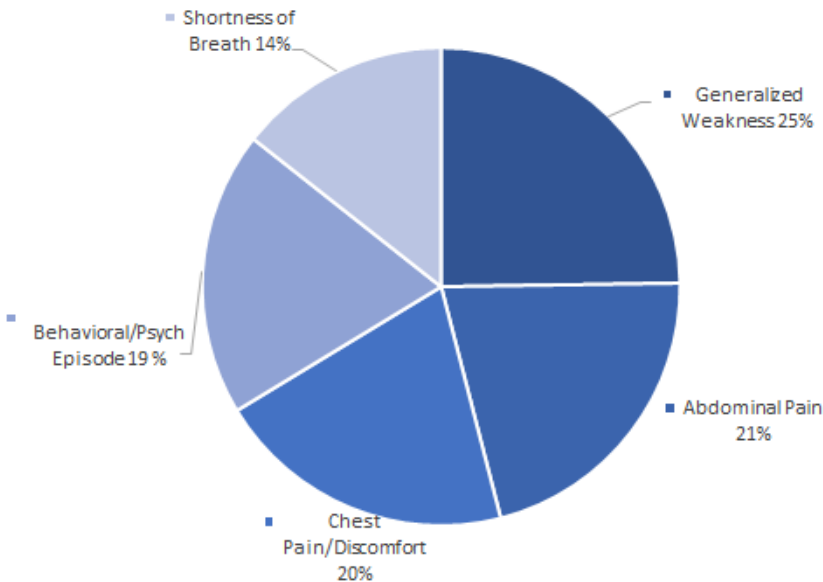
