Plan Submittal. Submit one hard copy and one electronic copy with this application. The plans shall include a site plan drawn to scale showing the location of property lines, the proposed tank location, dispensing area location, any buildings or tanks existing and planned, vehicle access, power lines and other utilities, onsite fire protection, vehicle impact protection and any hazards within and near the area.

The plans shall include, but not be limited to, the type of tank)manufacturers information sheets, details of tank design and construction, dispenser design information, location and classification of electrical equipment including lighting of area, emergency fuel shutdown devices, product MSDS's, list of Listed parts, venting details, plans for secondary containment, valves, piping, first and secondary tank capacities, fire extinguisher size and location and signage display. Proposed NFPA 704, safety and no smoking signage and instructions.

Compliance with the International Fire Codes does not automatically constitute compliance with the EPA or other mandated regulations. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all installations are in full compliance with applicable regulations for the City of Waterloo, the State of Iowa and the Federal Government.

No work is authorized to commence without approval from Waterloo Fire Rescue Inspections. Tanks may not be placed into operation prior to inspection and approval.
