New Recycling Program Basics

Everyone keeps the current blue city can.

This can is now for **yard waste only**.

If you do not have a yard waste can, you can request one on the mail in postcard.



Recycling will now be picked up twice a month in the new recycling can displaying the Republic Services logo. (Paper, plastics, clean metals)

To participate in recycling, you must request a can on the mail-in postcard.



Yard waste and recycling sites remain available to all Waterloo residents.
