Brown Derby:

The Brown Derby built in 1903 and was originally host to the Elks Lodge meetings. Later on the Sultana Club before turning into the Brown Derby in the 1940s through 1963. During the 1940s the Brown Derby was owned by various individuals. When JSA Development took ownership the Brown Derby still had some plaster designs and original tin ceiling to refurbish. Portions of the tin ceiling that were lost were recreated to match the original in order to keep the historic detail throughout the ballroom. Plaster details were able to be recreated based on old photographs. A sign was recreated to match the signature L-shaped sign to hang in front of the building.



Lee Byrd Residence:

Ms. Byrd's residence is within the Highland Historic District. The home is known as the J.W. Rath House and was built in 1919. The craftsman style home was created by Architect Mortimer B Cleveland and is known to hold significance with the development of Rath Packing Company in Waterloo. The home entails many original built-ins throughout and has been fully refurbished to match the historic significance it entails. The home has over 60 windows throughout and almost 4,000 square feet in living area.



Riverloop Public Market:

The Riverloop Public Market Building was built in 1947. The City of Waterloo purchased the property in 2006 and began remodeling shortly after.
