2020-37 REINSTATEMENT OF STATE HISTORIC TAX CREDITS

By Councilperson DeSana, supported by Councilperson Maiani

WHEREAS, the historic buildings, neighborhoods and places in Michigan villages, towns and cities distinguish each community and provide character and a sense of place that contribute significantly to the quality of life and the economic benefits enjoyed in and by each community; and WHEREAS, the preservation and rehabilitation of historic buildings, places and neighborhoods

contributes to the beauty, character, and economic vitality of Michigan communities; and,
WHEREAS, the labor-intensive nature of historic rehabilitation creates jobs and investment in l

WHEREAS, the labor-intensive nature of historic rehabilitation creates jobs and investment in local businesses and has been proven to generate more economic activity than equivalent investment in new construction; and

WHEREAS, demolition or destruction of historic buildings creates costs to Michigan and its communities by destroying the often-irreplaceable construction and ornamental materials of each structure and by adding significantly to landfills, whose makeup is estimated to be more than 40 percent building materials and waste; and

WHEREAS, development and redevelopment within established villages, townships and cities is encouraged by Governor Whitmer; and

WHEREAS, many public policies and financial and lending practices and policies create disincentives or barriers to the preservation, renovation and rehabilitation of historic buildings and resources and create a preferential financial environment for new construction; and

WHEREAS, Michigan has measured the economic impacts of the former Michigan Historic Tax Credit programs between their enactment in 1999 and their elimination in 2011 and seen significant positive direct impacts on the revitalization of neighborhoods and communities, the preservation and creation of affordable and market-rate housing, the creation of skilled local jobs, and the subsequent private investment in areas surrounding tax-credit-driven revitalization projects; and

WHEREAS, each \$1.00 of credit issued leverages \$11.37 in direct economic impact, such that the former Michigan Historic Tax Credit programs during their twelve-year history have leveraged \$251 million in Federal historic tax credits that otherwise would not have returned to Michigan, spurred \$1.46 billion in direct rehabilitation activity, and created 36,000 jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Michigan Legislature is presently considering Senate Bill 54 and House Bill 4100 that would reinstate an up-to-25 percent investment tax credit for owners of historic residential and commercial properties who substantially rehabilitate their properties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Wyandotte endorses and supports both Senate Bill 54 and House Bill 4100 and calls upon the Michigan Legislature to pass this important legislation and Governor Whitmer to sign it, in order to stimulate appropriate development and redevelopment and protect the historic character and quality of life of our communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Michigan Historic Preservation Network.

2020-44 ANNUAL PERMIT – MDOT RIGHT OF WAY AND MISC. OPERATIONS

By Councilperson DeSana, supported by Councilperson Maiani

This Performance Resolution is required by the Michigan Department of Transportation for purposes of issuing to a municipal utility an "Individual Permit for Use of State Highway Right of Way", or an "Annual Application and Permit for Miscellaneous Operations within State Highway Right of Way".

RESOLVED WHEREAS, the City of Wyandotte hereinafter referred to as the "GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY," periodically applies to the Michigan Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "DEPARTMENT," for permits, referred to as "PERMIT," to construct, operate, use and/or maintain utilities or other facilities, or to conduct other activities, on, over, and under State Highway Right of Way at various locations within and adjacent to its corporate limits;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the DEPARTMENT granting such PERMIT, the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY agrees that:

- 1.Each party to this Agreement shall remain responsible for any claims arising out of their own acts and/or omissions during the performance of this Agreement, as provided by law. This Agreement is not intended to increase either party's liability for, or immunity from, tort claims, nor shall it be interpreted, as giving either party hereto a right of indemnification, either by Agreement or at law, for claims arising out of the performance of this Agreement.
- 2.If any of the work performed for the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY is performed by a contractor, the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY shall require its contractor to hold harmless, indemnify and defend in litigation, the State of Michigan, the DEPARTMENT and their agents and employee's, against any claims for damages to public or private property and for injuries to person arising out of the performance of the work, except for claims that result from the sole negligence or willful acts of the DEPARTMENT, until the contractor achieves final acceptance of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY. Failure of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY to require its contractor to indemnify the DEPARTMENT, as set forth above, shall be considered a breach of its duties to the DEPARTMENT.
- 3.Any work performed for the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY by a contractor or subcontractor will be solely as a contractor for the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY and not as a contractor or agent of the DEPARTMENT. The DEPARTMENT shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities by vendors and contractors of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY, or their subcontractors or any other person not a party to the PERMIT without the DEPARTMENT'S specific prior written consent and notwithstanding the issuance of the PERMIT. Any claims by any contractor or subcontractor will be the sole responsibility of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.
- 4.The GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY shall take no unlawful action or conduct, which arises either directly or indirectly out of its obligations, responsibilities, and duties under the PERMIT which results in claims being asserted against or judgment being imposed against the State of Michigan, the Michigan Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, and all officers, agents and employees thereof and

those contracting governmental bodies performing permit activities for the DEPARTMENT and all officers, agents, and employees thereof, pursuant to a maintenance contract. In the event that the same occurs, for the purposes of the PERMIT, it will be considered as a breach of the PERMIT thereby giving the State of Michigan, the DEPARTMENT, and/or the Michigan Transportation Commission a right to seek and obtain any necessary relief or remedy, including, but not by way of limitation, a judgment for money damages.

5.The GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY will, by its own volition and/or request by the DEPARTMENT, promptly restore and/or correct physical or operating damages to any State Highway Right of Way resulting from the installation, construction, operation and/or maintenance of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY'S facilities according to a PERMIT issued by the DEPARTMENT.

6. With respect to any activities authorized by a PERMIT, when the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY requires insurance on its own or its contractor's behalf, it shall also require that such policy include as named insured the State of Michigan, the Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, and all officers, agents, and employees thereof and those governmental bodies performing permit activities for the DEPARTMENT and all officers, agents, and employees thereof, pursuant to a maintenance contract. 7. The incorporation by the DEPARTMENT of this resolution as part of a PERMIT does not prevent the DEPARTMENT from requiring additional performance security or insurance before issuance of a PERMIT.

8.This resolution shall continue in force from this date until cancelled by the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY or the DEPARTMENT with no less than thirty (30) days prior written notice provided to the other party. It will not be cancelled or otherwise terminated by the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY with regard to any PERMIT which has already been issued or activity which has already been undertaken. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following position(s) are authorized to apply to the DEPARTMENT for the necessary permit to work within State Highway Right of Way on behalf of the GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.

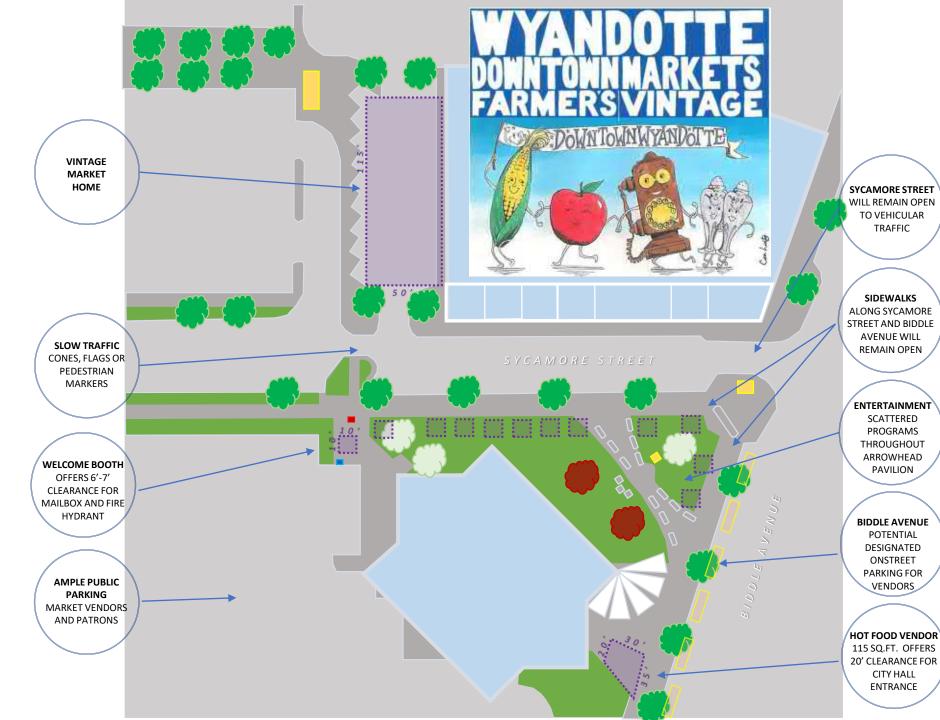

Introduction:

The proposed Five Year Parks & Recreation Master Plan was made public. I read it and wrote a letter to Mayor and Council with suggestions. Mr. Marsh invited me to get involved. We formed a team, together with a representative from McKenna Associates (they drew up the plan) and the Community Outreach Manager from Riverside Kayak Connection. We would also like to recruit someone from Ecorse Rowing to join our team. We conducted an Asset Inventory before finalizing the Parks & Rec Master Plan. We identified Ecorse Creek as a major asset that is currently underutilized. I went on an exploratory paddle to identify potential benefits and uses. 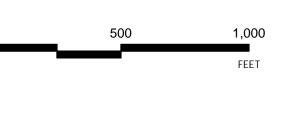

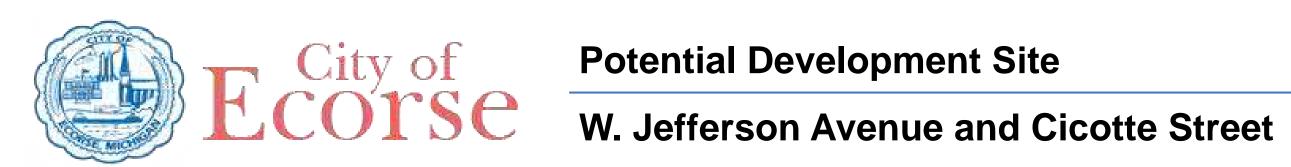

Partners in Public Art

Program Overview

Partners in Public Art is a collaboration between the Detroit Institute of Arts and communities, organizations, and municipalities in Southeast Michigan to co-create community-driven, highly visible public works of art.

Goals

- · Help people explore, express, and strengthen their sense of community
- · Create a highly visible work of public art
- Expand and deepen the relationship between the DIA and communities throughout Southeast Michigan

Process

DIA staff meet with community partners to determine the type of public art they are interested in, discussing themes, aesthetics, and project scope that reflect and resonate with each community.

A survey is disseminated to the community that asks respondents to describe ideas and themes that are reflective of their community. After the survey results are analyzed, DIA staff and a Lead Artist meet with community partners to discuss ideas, locations, and determine community involvement.

The artist creates renderings based on community input, receives feedback from community partners, and adjusts the design as needed while retaining his or her own artistic vision. The artist creates the artwork—with community assistance if so determined—and the project concludes with an unveiling celebration. Projects generally take between 3-6 months to complete.

Funding

Funding for these projects are made possible by generous voter investment in the tri-county millage. Costs to partnering organizations are only accrued if the partnering organization desires a project that exceeds our general budget and agrees to associated costs ahead of time. Funding expires at the end of each calendar year.

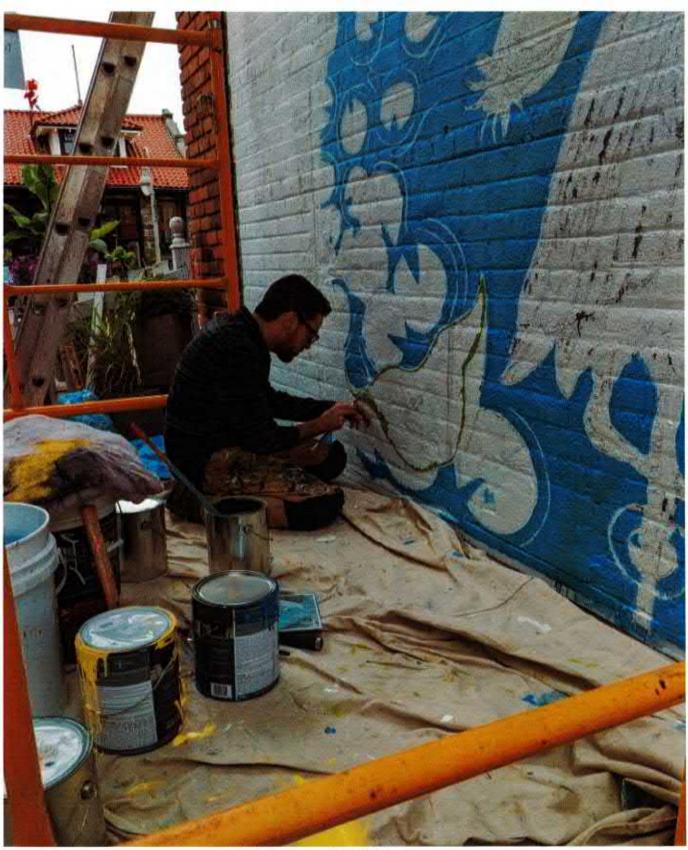

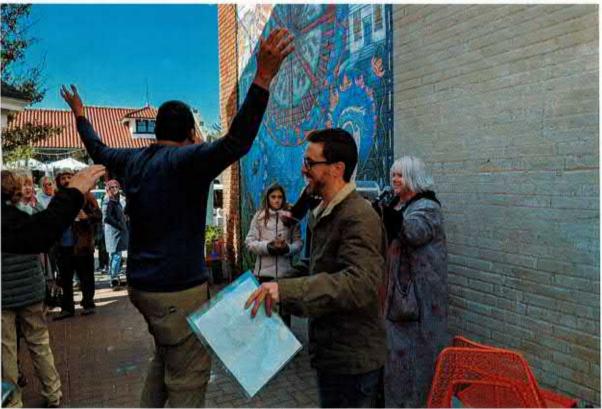

I appreciate the opportunity to discuss adjusting the zoning designation for 2011 Oak Street, Wyandotte Mi from an "Open Space" designation to a "B1" business classification.

The historical Fire Station on Oak Street is an iconic building that many of us local residents remember from our childhoods. My goal has been to share the nostalgia and experiences of this beautiful building with our neighbors and friends, while still respecting the surrounding homes and businesses.

In order to try and maintain compliance with city regulations, I have made a list of guidelines we will adhere to in an attempt to minimize any inconvenience to our neighbors.

Additionally, I understand that appropriate parking arrangements are an important consideration in approving this zoning adjustment. In anticipation of that, I have made several accommodations to try and provide solutions and prevent inconveniences to our neighbors as well as to our guests at the firehall.

- 1) I will forfeit the use of the 2nd floor space (vacant), so all on site parking spaces will be dedicated to the first floor of the firehall. (The only use of the entire building will be the first floor as a small event venue). This allows for 13 parking spaces off street on site. Plus any additional street parking permitted in the allowable calculations.
- 2) I have made arrangements with Anna's Shear Rumors (2205 Oak Street) to give us full access to their parking lot for overflow parking. The business hours for both businesses do not overlap. This lot will accommodate an additional 23 vehicles.
- 3) To ensure that guests to the firehall abide by the parking arrangements, and to prevent inconvenience to the neighborhood, written parking instruction will be distributed to guests/ hosts prior to every event. These rules will also be reviewed prior to booking events, and displayed on our website.
- 4) I believe the firehall was previously registered as an event venue by an owner a few years ago. I know that several local residents have shared great memories of having small gatherings in the building, and I look forward to being able to continue those experiences. If they previously found an adequate solution, then I am confident we can find one as well.

In conclusion, I feel as though the above arrangements will allow for appropriate accommodations to allow for the zoning to be adjusted from OS to B1. I wish to be fully compliant with city regulations, and be a good steward to this historical building. I would love to continue renovations on this important Wyandotte symbol, and to have the ability to share its history with our community.

In those instances where patrons are served without seating one (1) parking space for each twenty (20) square feet of standing room floor area in addition to the above requirements shall be provided. The proposed use requires a total of nineteen (19) off street parking spaces.

SECTION 2403.B:

The applicant is proposing to use off street parking located at 2205 Oak which requires Planning Commission Approval.

The parking lot at 2205 Oak has 18 paved off street parking spaces, the hair salon utilizes 11 of these parking spaces based on Section 2403.R.3.G, which provides 7 non-required spaces for proposed use at 2011 Oak.

The parking lot at 2011 Oak has 13 paved off street parking spaces, the 2nd floor businesses requires 7 parking spaces, which provides 6 non-required spaces for the proposed use.

BACKGROUND: Per the request from the prospective developer, Ron Thomas C/O Rise Above Ventures, for the City of Wyandotte to initiate action to consider establishing a Commercial Redevelopment District (CRD) for the above referenced properties, in accordance with the Commercial Redevelopment Act, Public Act 255 of 1978 Act, as amended, the enclosed resolution has been prepared authorizing the holding of a public hearing for the Mayor and Council to consider establishing a CRD. If a District is established, the property owner will then be eligible to apply to the Mayor and Council for a Commercial Facilities Exemption Certificate (CFEC).

Establishing the District is the first step in the process. Dear Mayor and Members of Council:

To assist with redeveloping the existing buildings at 100 Maple and 140-142 Maple, I am requesting that the City of Wyandotte initiate action to establish a Commercial Redevelopment District (CRD), as allowed by the Commercial Redevelopment Act, Michigan Public Act 255 of 1978, as amended. The property at 130-134 Maple is also proposed for inclusion in the CRD because it is in between and adjoins both properties, allowing the properties to be combined into one CRD, instead of creating two separate districts.

Establishing the CRD will make the properties eligible to apply for a tax exemption known as a "Commercial Facilities Exemption Certificate (CFEC) for a Restoration Project," which will assist with the project's financial viability. The preliminary plans are as follows:

1. 100 Maple – Former "Daly-Merritt Insurance" Building (technically 3040 1st, 3056 1st and 3058 1st).

On the first floor and second floor of all three buildings, complete substantial interior renovations, totaling approximately 24,175 square feet. Additionally, we plan exterior repairs, glazing additions, exterior cleaning, lighting additions, signage additions, and building floor plan changes to accommodate its return to physical and economic productivity.

The proposed use will be for office space, and potentially residential apartments, restaurant or retail as the market may demand. Specific improvements and estimated costs will be determined when the CFEC application is submitted to the Mayor and Council for review and approval. These properties are currently owned by the City of Wyandotte, and my company is working with Joe Daly, C/O his entity Oak Wyandotte LLC, to complete a redevelopment of these properties per the stipulations outlined in i) the Purchase Agreement of December 3, 2018, by and between the City of Wyandotte and Oak Wyandotte LLC, and ii) the Certified Resolution of December 17, 2018, by the Mayor and City Council affirming said Purchase Agreement.

2. 140-142 Maple - Former "Studio 142" Building

The two-story building, consisting of approximately 9,000 square feet (first floor of 7,000 square feet, and second floor of approximately 2,000 square feet), is proposed for redevelopment into an as yet unspecified use or uses. A variety of uses are being explored, including entertainment, recreation, indoor off-street parking, and/or residential. Specific uses, improvements and estimated costs will be determined when a CFEC application is submitted to the Mayor and Council for review and approval. My company purchased this property in late 2019.

If the District is established, two separate applications for a CFEC will then be submitted to the Mayor and Council in the near future. As noted above, additional information about each proposed project will be submitted with each application.

Maple street is at the center of Downtown Wyandotte, and these buildings are situated just behind our iconic Millennium Clock Tower, yet they make up what is a mostly vacant block at present. My intent in redeveloping these two properties is to restore this block into a hub of economic vibrancy, adding value to our Downtown district.

Memorandum of Understanding Destination Downriver Coalition

The Mission of the Coalition is to gather likeminded organizations and individuals to promote Downriver as a premier tourism region. In addition, this Coalition will serve as the organization that will help identify recommendations, resources and capacity to develop a strategy to build a strategic plan.

Parties to the agreement are:

The Destination Downriver Coalition, referenced hereinafter as the "Coalition" (includes public, private and non-profit organizations)

Purpose:

This agreement formalizes the relationship between members of the Coalition and allows the Coalition to speak with one voice for the mutually agreed upon goals set forth below.

Downriver Definition: Downriver is defined for the Coalition as geographically municipalities South of Detroit and North of Monroe County.

History of the Coalition

Benefits

The Coalition agrees that the ability to achieve common and related goals can be enhanced significantly by working collaboratively to support projects that support our mission. Benefits include networking opportunities, ability to be a part of community development and create new economic benefits for our region.

Responsibilities

The Coalition agrees to

- Work together to create a tourism strategy for Downriver
- o Identify resources to further the goals of the Coalition
- Promote Destination Downriver
- Cooperate to develop and distribute outreach, marketing, branding, tools and events that enhance, enrich and or promote Downriver
- Appoint a minimum of one representative from each partner agency to the Coalition and attend
 each meeting, averaging one meeting per month. Meetings can be attended in person, or by
 any telecommunication method available to the Coalition.
- Organize group work to include/but not limited to Committees: Marketing/Branding,
 Fundraising, Hospitality and Resource Development

Decision Making Process

Name of Organization:

Actions in support of specific projects will be made during regularly scheduled meetings. The Coalition will strive to make all decision at meetings by consensus of the members at the meeting. If a consensus cannot be achieved, then the members attending the meeting may decide to vote on the action by a majority vote. A quorum of more than 50% of voting members present is required. Each Coalition member is encouraged to have multiple representatives attend the meetings; however, each partner only has one vote.

Modification, Termination and Other Conditions

Coalition members will be notified in writing of any proposed changes to the MOU at least 30 days proper to the vote. This MOU may be modified through the decision making process for this MOU. In such case, all agreeing partners will re-sign the MOU.

Any partner may terminate its involvement in the Coalition at any time by providing written noticed to the facilitator of the Coalition. Any additional members may be approved by utilizing the decision making process in the MOU. New members may be added without the then-current Coalition members re-signing the MOU. The full list of Partners to the MOU will be kept by the Destination Downriver facilitator.

This MOU becomes effective when signed by the signatory Coalition member and remains in effect until modified or terminated.

BACKGROUND: The DDA is seeking a landscape and maintenance contractor for the Eureka Road Viaduct. The City prepared project specifications for the landscaping and maintenance contract and advertised the project per procurement procedures. The City received zero bids. The DDA Board of Directors then instructed the DDA Director to solicit and procure at least three proposals which included specific items of work and quotes for service. The DDA Director collected three proposals. The proposals were reviewed and the low bidder was interviewed to confirm his understanding of the scope of the work and bid.

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS: As stated in the DDA's Mission Statement, "The Wyandotte Downtown Development Authority shall initiate and coordinate downtown development through design, business recruitment, promotion and the effective use of private and public space for an attractive, festive downtown atmosphere."

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> The DDA Director is requesting Mayor and City Council to award the Eureka Road Viaduct Landscape and Maintenance contract to the low bidder, Grosse Ile. Lawn and Sprinkler, and to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute the contract.

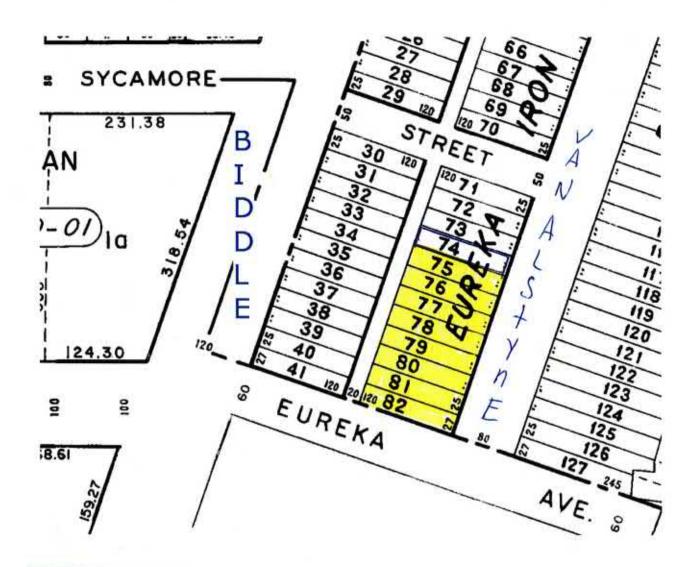

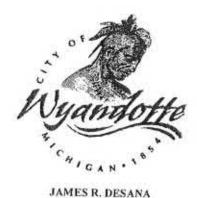

In response to the City Council resolution dated November 18, 2008 relative to the noise complaint from Marie R. Douglass of 857 Plum Street, we have investigated the noise levels by using the Police Department's decibel meter. After inspection of the complainant's neighborhood, it was decided to take random sound level readings from the front of her home, from the alley to the rear of the home, directly behind Cadon Plating Inc., along with control samples away from the site adjacent to Pulaski Park on 12th Street. The City of Wyandotte does not own a decibel sound measuring device which could be placed on the site for an extended period of time as noted in the Council resolution as our "hand-held" unit will calculate the decibel levels averaged for maximum periods of 3 ½ minutes. By taking random samples at different times of the day over a 2-week period, we felt that we could establish a reliable average to determine ambient sound levels.

As noted on the attached satellite photograph of the area, you can see that the complainant's home is located near the west end of Plum Street on the east side of the railroad tracks and Cadon Plating of 3715 11th Street is located approximately 1/8 of a mile away on the west side of the tracks. When standing outside of Ms. Douglass' home, you can hear what sounds like a compressor motor operating which is located at the rear/east side of the Cadon Plating building. The device emitting the noise is an R.T.O. unit which according to Plant Manager Joseph Gooding is a "fume destructor" which was installed approximately 5-years ago as a result of government mandates. This device is mounted on the roof of the building on the southeast corner of the Cadon building and runs constantly as part of their plating process. It is somewhat louder in the alley behind the Douglass home where there exists a direct line-of-sight to the device while the front and sides of their home are obstructed by a neighbors home and one other home which obstruct the view of the device and are situated closer to Cadon Plating.

Additional sound level samples were taken from the complainant's home when a train was passing (no train whistle blowing) and from Goodell Street at 1st Street which is approximately 1/8 of a mile from the BASF industrial complex. These additional samples were taken to compare the various decibel sounds levels at different locations in the City of Wyandotte.

There exist many environmental and natural variables which may have an effect on levels of sound. Passing motor vehicles, train whistles, passing aircraft, strong winds, and other variables which effect noise levels were avoided when using the decibel meter. When the above readings were taken, with the exception of the passing train, sample times occurred when there were no impulse noises that would have an effect on the average readings.

In her letter dated November 6, 2008, Ms. Douglass references several problems she has experienced as a result of the noise generated from Cadon Plating. We cannot determine what effect these ambient noise levels have on her and her family but can only attest that according to the readings taken, the noise levels near her home are consistent or lower than levels in other residential areas in the City of Wyandotte. According to the Cadon Plating site manager, the equipment which is generating the measurable noise outside of the plant grounds is operating properly as it has for the past 5-years.

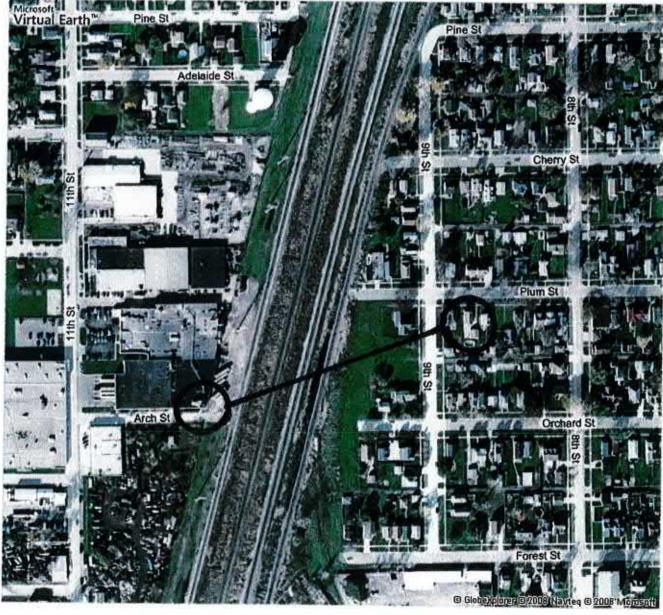

Dear Honorable Mayor and City Council Members.

I am contacting you regarding the Sound Frequency Disturbance Cadon Plating has been identified as the establishment subjecting a multitude of Wyandotte Citizens to.

It is apparent there is a faulty piece of equipment which is in dire need of repair or replacement. The sound disturbance began in late February 2008. This matter has been brought to City Council's attention by two (2) Wyandotte residents at meetings held March 17th by Michael Sura, 3827 15th Street and March 31th by Vick Nevin, 501 Plum Street. The Company generates this disturbance 24 hours daily. Between the hours of 4:30 am and 11:30 pm the disturbance generated is significantly louder. This loud disturbance permeates and penetrates through walls and windows preventing many of your working class citizens and their families from sleeping adequately enough to remain awake and functioning at performance levels required at their place of employment or educational institutions. Personal alarm clocks must be set louder and still my not be heard, white noise machines do not work, and fans can no longer be used to cancel out some of the sound due to seasonal change. There is no means citizens can take to cancel out this sound in their homes and by no means should be expected or subjected to.

Neither the City nor Cadon Plating may have given consideration as to how this disturbance is creating a safety hazard for citizens. The sound masks other emergency sirens used by BASF, Atofina and the City's general alarm systems. We citizens of Wyandotte would appear not reacting due to apathy or complacency in taking the proper precautions required by these independent alarm systems. In reality it would be because we are unable to hear or possibly distinguish between the alarms or that our minds are now conditioned only to hear and focus on that distinct sound disturbance generated by Cadon Plating.

Further more, fatigued citizens while working have their physical well being, efficiency and exemplary work ethic compromised. Fatigued citizens have the increased potential while behind the wheel of a moving vehicle for accidents to occurring because their realization or reaction time is compromised. Fatigued Students have their scholastic performance compromised.

Complaints cannot be filed through the Police Department as I have been informed that as long as an establishment is conducting business they are able to generate any disturbing sounds what so ever which in no way violates the ordinance or law for Disturbing the Peace yet is allowed to violate a citizen's right to take refuge and enjoy quiet in their home. This noise inhibits our right to come home to de-stress, refresh and reenergize and ready ourselves for the next day. Instead we become agitated and irritable as a result of being subjected to this unrelenting disturbance.

I request on behalf of myself and the multitude of other disrupted citizens of Wyandotte that this grievous matter be addressed and remedied for our welfare and well being. This noise did not exist prior to February, 2008 which indicates the sound disturbance is avoidable and can be remedied since Cadon Plating has been in it's present location and operating for at least the 26 years that I have been a Wyandotte resident.

Dear Mr. Kowalewski:

We are writing to you concerning the increasing amount of noise emanating from the Cadon Plating Co. located in the City's south end.

The noise levels at Cadon have been a concern for nearby residents for a number of years. About 5 years ago the City worked with Cadon to establish hour restrictions for running the air scrubber unit (the biggest source of noise). The City of Wyandotte also constructed a berm to help block the noise and beautify the adjacent track area. While we are grateful for what the City has done, we are asking that the Engineering office revisit the issue.

Currently, the air scrubber unit runs nearly 24 hours a day, 6 days a week with Sundays and Holidays being the exceptions. Since early this year, there is now a cycle of vibrations emanating from the Cadon plant whenever it is operating. These vibrations can be felt inside of our home. Add to this the truck noise coming from the loading docks and you can begin to understand our concern. Unfortunately, the berm behind our home does little to block the noise as the Cadon plant rises above the berm's height. Additional noise protection in the form of a sound barrier is needed if Cadon continues its current operations.

While we realize the benefits that a business the size of Cadon provides for the City, the business must be responsible to the surrounding community. The residents living near Cadon have invested in the City of Wyandotte and we are asking for your assistance in finding a solution to this ongoing issue.

ITEM: Sale of City Owned Commercial/Industrial/Multiple Family Properties

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE: n/a

BACKGROUND: The Engineering and Building Department has been receiving unsolicited proposals for City owned property for commercial/industrial/multiple family redevelopment. Currently, the City has no process to accept unsolicited proposals for these properties without bidding each parcel separately. In order to provide an orderly, documented process for marketing and soliciting proposals for City-owned commercial and industrial properties, the Engineering and Building Department is recommending the same process to sell these properties as the City utilizes for the sale of vacant lots for construction of a new single family home.

Therefore, attached for your consideration are the Specification for Acquisition of Vacant Parcels for Industrial/Commercial. Multiple Family Redevelopment. These specifications outline the process for the sale of these properties for development. There are two (2) properties with buildings (1213 Grove and 3131 Biddle Avenue) and ten (10) other vacant properties. See List of Available Properties attached.

These specifications outline the requirements to purchase the properties, cost to acquire the property, terms of sale, bidding requirements (experience, financial resources, participants, plan of action financing), zoning and master plan requirements, building requirements and evaluation of proposals. The specifications would be placed on the City's Website. Also a For Sale Signs will be posted on each property.

Further, it is recommended that a one (1) year subscription to LoopNet be approved for the listing of these properties. The cost for said subscription is \$7,986 per year, with a maximum of ten (10) listings at a time. LoopNet is a website for listings of commercial real estate with over 14,000,000 tenants and investors searching monthly for commercial development opportunities.

Delivery

Proposals shall be delivered to the City Engineer at Wyandotte City Hall, 3200 Biddle Avenue, Wyandotte, Michigan 48192 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Terms of Sale

The terms of sale will be cash only and all terms of Specification hereto.

Sales Price

The suggested minimum price for each property is listed on Attachment 2.

Posting of Property for Sale

When properties are ready to be sold, the List of Available Properties for Development (Exhibit A) will be updated and posted on the City's website, at www.wyandotte.net, placed on LoopNet and a sign erected on the property. The City will advertise a minimum of forty-five (45) days before reviewing any proposal(s) on properties listed on this list.

After forty-five (45) days, if more than one (1) proposal is submitted all proposals will be reviewed. The City will determine which submitted proposal, if any, will be accepted.

As Is Condition

This property is being sold in an "As Is" condition without expressed or implied warranty. The City of Wyandotte assumes no responsibility for the environmental condition of the property.

Contact the Engineering and Building Department to see if any environment studies have been completed when the property was purchasing by the City of Wyandotte. If studies were completed copies can be forwarded to interested purchaser.

Prospective purchasers shall understand that, whether buildings were removed or not, the City of Wyandotte accepts no responsibility for underground conditions in cases where there were previous structures, with or without a basement.

Evaluation

Bid Deposit

The proposal maker must accompany the proposal with a deposit of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars in the former of a cashier's check, or bank money order payable to the City of Wyandotte. The deposit shall be applied to the purchase price at the time of closing.

Title Insurance

Taxes and Prorated Items

All taxes and assessments which have become a lien upon the land as of the date of the Purchase Agreement shall be paid by the City as Seller. Current taxes, if any, shall be prorated and adjusted as of the date of closing in accordance with the "Due Date" basis of the taxing unit in which the property is located.

Prior to Closing

The Purchase Agreement outlining the development will require that a Building Permit be obtained prior to closing for the proposed structures.

Closing Fee

Purchaser is responsible for the payment of the Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollar closing fee. The closing fee will be paid at time of closing.

Timely Development When Purchasing Properties:

Purchaser is required to undertake development of the accepted proposal no later than 180 days after the closing. "Undertake development" shall mean completion of the foundation or complete or partial demolition of existing structures and appurtenances. Purchaser is required to complete the development within 365 days after closing. "Complete the development" shall mean issuance of a final certificate of occupancy by the City.

This letter of credit will require the City Treasurer to pay into the City's General Fund the sum of Seven-Thousand Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) dollars in the event the City Engineer notifies the City Treasurer that the undertake development requirement has not been timely satisfied.

The Letter of Credit will also require the City Treasurer to pay into the City's General Fund the remaining unused balance of the Letter of Credit in the event that the completion of the development requirement has not been timely satisfied.

The Letter of Credit will require the City Treasurer to refund any unused balance of the Letter of Credit to the Purchaser upon issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy within 365 days of the closing.

In the event the Purchaser has not obtained a mortgage on the property and has not undertaken development within 180 days of the closing, the City may at its option repurchase the property for Eighty (80%) percent of the purchase price (in lieu of applying the Letter of Credit). This right of repurchase will be evidenced by a recordable document to be executed at closing. In the event the City repurchases the property, the Letter of Credit will be refunded to Purchaser.

Development to Produce Real Property Taxes

It is the objective of the City to have the property generate ad valorem real property taxes and to remain on the tax rolls upon development. Inconsideration of the City agreeing to sell this property, Purchaser will be responsible to execute a lien reimbursement document at closing which will contain a formula requiring the City to be reimbursed for lost ad valorem real property taxes should the property become taxexempt. This obligation will not be subordinated to any mortgage and it is purchaser's responsibility to disclose this requirement to any potential lender prior to purchaser entering into any purchase agreement with the City.

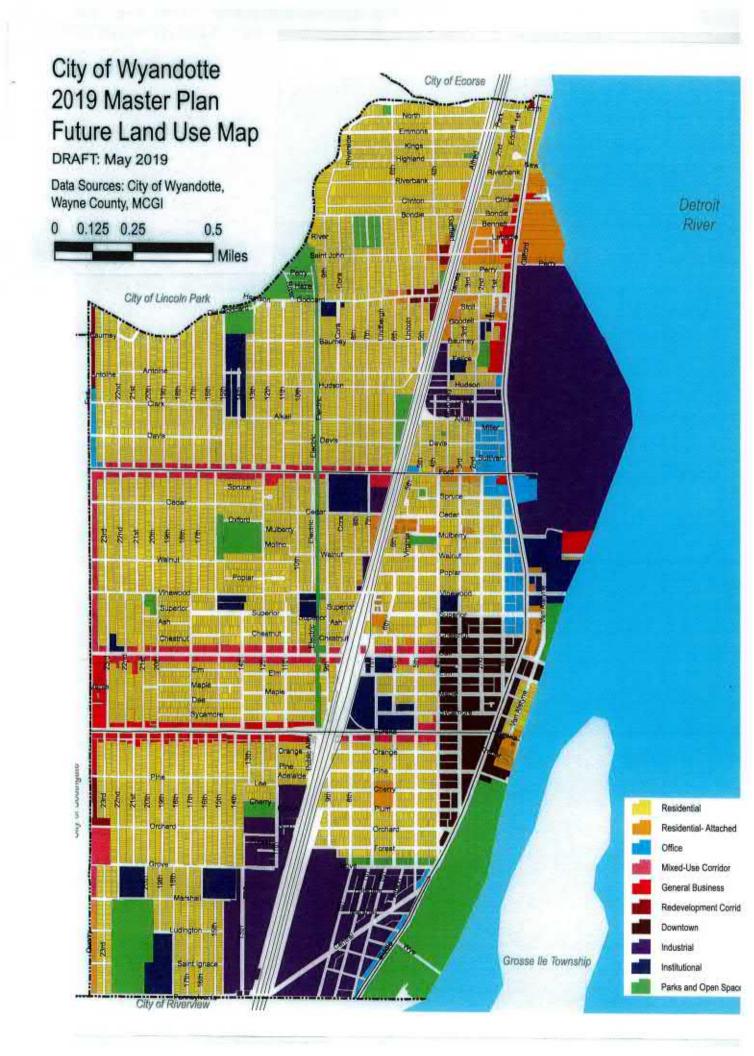

ITEM: Emergency Repairs to DPS Vehicles

PRESENTER: Gregory J. Mayhew, City Engineer

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE:

BACKGROUND: Truck #36, a dump truck used for road salting operations, was out of service and unable to be used until repairs were made. The DPS solicited, and received, written quotes from Wolverine Truck Group for the repair of Truck #36 in the amount of \$12,050.26. The repairs are to the air manifold and the aftermarket burner. The quotes are attached. Truck #36 was purchased in 2008 and is in good shape and worthy of repair. The truck was purchased from Wolverine and they are the closest service provider for this piece of equipment, and have provided quality service in the past for City equipment repair.

Vactor #107 is out of service and in need of repairs to the hose reel, controls and pump lines. Attached is a quote from Jack Doheny in the amount of \$6,978.13. Doheny is a distributor of, and nearest repair facility, for this vactor and are best qualified to make the repairs quoted. There are other items to be repaired to put Vactor #107 back in operation that will be performed by the DPS mechanics. This vactor was purchased in 2010 and is in good shape otherwise and worthy of repair.

In accordance with the procurement rules adopted by the City Council January 9, 2017, I requested, and received, approval from the City Administrator for the repair to be performed as soon as possible by Wolverine and Jack Doheny under the Emergency Procurement section of the procurement policy as the loss of use of these pieces of equipment will impact the operations of the DPS in delivery of services during snow and ice removal operations and clearing of drainage structures and sewer mains.

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS: This is consistent with the 2010-2015 Goals and Objectives of the City of Wyandotte Strategic Plan in the commitment to provide the finest services and quality of life.

<u>ACTION REQUESTED:</u> Approve the repairs to Truck #36 and Vactor #107 in accordance the emergency procurement section of the procurement rules and policies adopted by City Council January 9, 2017.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by John at 6:03 pm.
- 2. <u>Approval of Agenda:</u> Motion was made by Alice, seconded by Wendy, to approve this meeting's agenda as presented. The motion was approved.
- 3. Reading and Approval of Previous Minutes:
 - a. <u>January 8, 2020 Regular Meeting</u>: After review of the minutes, Noel made a motion, seconded by Andrea, to approve the draft minutes of the January 8, 2020 regular meeting of the Beautification Commission, without change. The motion was approved.

4. Chairperson's Report:

- a. <u>Distribution of Documents</u>: An updated Attendance Log was distributed
- b. <u>Delivery of Trash Bags from KAB for Wyandotte Spring Clean-Up</u>: John reported that he received 2 boxes of 30-gallon trash bags for the Wyandotte Annual Spring Clean-Up, courtesy of Keep America Beautiful.
- c. <u>Updated Lowe's LAR Account Beautification Commission Authorized Buyers</u>: This confidential Lowe's LAR account information was distributed to new authorized Commission buyer Alice Ugljesa.
- d. Action Item: Completion of Required Annual Disclosure Statements: The City Clerk's Office provided copies of the 2020 Disclosure Form to be completed, signed, and dated by all commissioners. The signed forms are to be returned to the City Clerk's Office no later than April 28, 2020. The Disclosure Forms were distributed at last meeting to commissioners John Darin, Kelly Dodson, Noel Galeski, and Wendy Leach. Forms were distributed at this meeting to commissioners Barbara Freese, Andrea Fuller, and Alice Ugljesa. Forms will be mailed by the City Clerk's Office to commissioners Michael Bak, Patricia Iacopelli, and Stephanie Pizzo for their completion and return to the City Clerk's Office.

5. <u>Treasurer's Report:</u>

- a. <u>FY 2019-2020 Beautification Commission Expense Report</u>: The Treasurer's Report was distributed. There were expenses in the amount of \$45.00 for 2020 BCSEM and KMB annual municipal dues, and an accrued expense in the amount of \$1,299.75 for Spring hanging baskets posted to the TIF Primary account, leaving a current account balance of \$6,061.98. The hanging basket order was reviewed in detail, and is very close to the 2019 expenses. There were no expenses posted to the GFM Reserve account, leaving a current balance of \$249.78.
- 6. <u>Public & Media Relations and Event Marketing Report:</u> Andrea reported that she will begin developing the promotional campaign for the Annual Clean-Up and Spring Dig-In.
- 7. 4th Annual Holiday Decorating Awards Presentation Recap:
 - a. Holiday Awards Formal Event Title: Andrea remarked that the name of the holiday event has changed over the years, and she wished to standardize the event titling language for marketing and promotion purposes, and for the award ornaments. After much discussion, Andrea made a motion, seconded by Alice, that the recognition event be formally titled as the "Outdoor Holiday Lighting and Decorating Awards". The motion was approved unanimously. This complete title, with Annual Year designation, should be used in all references to the event, including all promotional and marketing materials, press releases, and award ornaments.

- b. Program Enhancement Recommendations: Wendy made recommendations that were discussed. First, to advertise the "Outdoor Holiday Lighting and Decorating Awards" event on the Wyandotte cable channel, in addition to current media, to garner additional support and entries. Andrea will check out the cable channel outlet for event promotion going forward. Secondly, it was recommended that the judging be held earlier, so that interested parties can drive around and see the residences and businesses that have received awards. The Commission will review this recommendation for feasibility during the next holiday awards event planning.
- c. <u>Reviewing New Ornament Award Vendors</u>: There was discussion and general support regarding Michael's interest in reviewing other vendors to produce the ornament awards, currently supplied by Bronner's in Frankenmuth.
- 8. <u>"Adopt-A-Spot in Wyandotte" Program Update</u>: In response to Wendy's previous request for marketing assistance, Andrea reported that she will be developing a flyer to promote the AAS Program.
- 9. Community Garden Update: Community Garden Opening is scheduled for Saturday, April 25, 2020.
 - a. <u>Ribbon-Cutting Event Planning</u>: John is organizing a meeting with Barbara and Andrea to plan a Community Garden Relocation Ribbon-Cutting Event, to be scheduled at a convenient date and time after the community garden re-opens this year.
 - b. <u>Phase 2 Planning</u>: John is organizing a meeting with Barbara, and Brian Martin of DPS, to review the community garden Phase 2 plans prior to construction. It is critically important in this project due diligence to review the design and number of garden beds that will be placed for use by the handicapped or disabled population, prior to their purchase or construction.
 - c. <u>Possible Nomination for Keep Michigan Beautiful Award</u>: John reported that some Keep Michigan Beautiful Executive Committee members were interested in entertaining a nomination of the Wyandotte Community Garden for a 2020 KMB Beautification award, following publication of John's article on the community garden relocation in the BCSEM Newsletter! John will be following up on this nomination interest.
- 10. Spring Clean-Up Planning: The Annual Spring Clean-Up is scheduled for Saturday, April 18, 2020. Noel will be updating the Clean-Up tasks and duties lists. Kelly will start work on contacting volunteers. Andrea commented that the Commission needs to be mindful of other activities or venues that may be competing for volunteers during this 50th Anniversary of Earth Day. The consensus of the commissioners present was to expand the scope of the Clean-Up Day activities to include cleaning up Bishop Park. The Commission hopes to engage city departments, as appropriate, in this activity, also. Clean-Up Planning was also added to the February Agenda for the 2020 Commission Meeting Schedule for future reference.
- 11. <u>Spring Dig-In Landscape Planning</u>: The Annual Spring Dig-In is scheduled for Saturday, May 16, 2020. It was confirmed that outdoor planter pots ARE NOT permitted on the sidewalks downtown in the winter due to snow removal considerations. John was requested to contact Four Star Greenhouse to inquire regarding their annual Landscape Planting event.
- 12. Spring Hanging Baskets Planning:
 - a. Removal of Winter Greens: Per Noel, Michael will be removing the winter greens from the existing baskets downtown.
 - b. <u>Spring Planting Recommendations</u>: The planting recommendations in the quote from Eckert's Greenhouse were reviewed. Their recommended flowers are more wind-resistant than the plants they had been offering. Wind damage to the plants is a major issue with our proximity to the Detroit River. The consensus of the commissioners present was to plant the flowers as follows:
 - > 7 Hanging Baskets in Arbor: Bubblegum and Paradise Supertunias, mixed plantings, 7 ea.
 - ➤ 6 Hanging Baskets on 2 Free-Standing Poles at City Hall: Viking XL Red on Chocolate Begonia with Candle Vine, mixed plantings, 6 ea.
 - ➢ 6 Wrap-Around Baskets on Biddle: Dragon Wing Begonia, and Candle Vine and Ivy-Leaf Geranium, mixed plantings, 6 ea.

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Mr. Evans explained that this is an older neighborhood, and there is very little parking for anyone, and the City has provided to parking lots, Lot #5 is used 66% during the day, and 21% in the evening, Lot #6 is used 21% during the day and less in the evening, there are lots of spaces in the lot. Mr. Evans continued that the building has set empty for several years, and he wants to restore it. Mr. Evans continued that he has been working with the Building Department, and he wants to convert a couple of the floors to apartments, and he wants to use the old boat house for himself to live in. Mr. Evans added that there are a number of multiple family units in the area with 4 or 5 units, and some have even converted the old boat houses in rentals, and some have spaces above the garage. Mr. Evans also added that parking pads have also been put in all over, and that 12 properties have parking pads in front yard on VanAlstyne, they either built new ones or widened the old ones.

Mr. Evans continued that when he purchased the home there were 92 code violations on the inspection list, and he has found even more. Mr. Evans added that the neighbors would like to see the house stay vacant, and that the neighbor to the left has 4 units and parking in the front, and that is nonconforming. Mr. Evans stated that if his appeal is granted, he will add curb appeal to the property.

Member DiSanto asked Mr. Evans when did he purchase the property. Mr. Evans replied late September. Member DiSanto asked if he knew it was a single family dwelling when he bought it. Mr. Evans replied yes, but it could be a multiple if he met the requirements.

Member Olsen asked Mr. Evans if he planned on living in the home. Mr. Evans replied that he wants to live in the secondary building, he doesn't want to have to climb steps anymore.

Member DiSanto and Member Flachsmann discussed the recent ordinance change allowing single family dwellings. Member Flachsmann commented that he counted 17 front parking on VanAlstyne.

Pat & Lynn Kearney, 3179 VanAlstyne.

Mrs. Kearney stated that their property abuts Mr. Evans's property to the north, and they do oppose the appeal. Mrs. Kearney continued that they do own a conversion home, but it was done in the 1940's and they purchased it that way. Mrs. Kearney added that now if a single family dwelling were to burn down, it would be rebuilt, and felt that was the reason for the ordinance change. Mrs. Kearney continued that in the evenings, there is a lot more traffic, and the parking lots are packed if there is a function downtown. Mrs. Kearney also stated they have do have front yard parking, but there house sits back about 75' from the sidewalk. Mrs. Kearney stated that in 1978 when they bought their property, the building next door was a boat house.

Mr. Kearney stated that they have been waiting 5 years for someone to occupy the house next door, and they were looking forward to it being a single family dwelling.

Mr. Voszatka stated that he had written a letter and submitted to the Board at the December 4, 2019, meeting (attached to minutes). Mr. Voszatka stated that Mr. Evans has to meet certain criteria for the Zoning Board to grant a variance, and he does not see that.

Carolyn Belcher, 3219 VanAlstyne.

Ms. Belcher stated that the building in the rear at 3213 VanAlstyne is 16" from her property. Ms. Belcher added that she enjoys her backyard, and the lots are very small. Ms. Belcher continued that Mr. Evans wants to put 4 families on a 37' lot, and to build a new house in Wyandotte, you need a lot bigger lot than that. Ms. Belcher continued that the parking is terrible, there is not enough space for 4 units, it would create a hardship on her family.

Robert and Joyce Jacques, 3200 VanAlstyne.

Mrs. Jacques stated that she is opposed to the appeal, and is not looking forward to a 4 family. There is no room for parking in the front. Parking is bad during the summer and Art Fair, and is busy all the time. Mrs. Jacques added that the smaller city lot is full all day, and the larger city lot will get even busier if a restaurant goes into the vacant restaurant spot on Biddle.

Five (5) communications were received in opposition to this appeal.

Mr. Evans also supplied a packet to the Board, which is filed in the Zoning File.

Appeal #3315

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Judy Owens, owner, present.

Ms. Owens explained that they want to build a nicer home, make it a little bigger, and only asking for 90 square feet variance.

Member Trupiano asked if the existing home would be demolished. Ms. Owens replied yes.

No communications were received regarding this appeal.

Appeal #3316

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Mark and Karen Silka, owners, present.

Mrs. Silka explained that they purchased the home in 2016 and converted it to a single family dwelling, and now they want a 2 car garage. Mrs. Silka added that the lot is very irregular, and the lot lines have changed many times over the years, there have been issues with the lot lines, but now they have been cleared up. The garage would be too close to the street and the vacated alley. Mrs. Silka stated that there was some confusion, the appeal stated 0' from the east lot line, and there is 2' and 1' to the north. Mrs. Silka added that there are no neighbors.

Member Nevin stated that he would like to compliment them on the property, and can see that many improvements have been made, and they are doing a nice job and have improved the neighborhood. Member Flachsmann asked who owned the property to the north. Mrs. Silka replied that it was half city and half railroad. Member Flachsmann commented that the house looks great.

Member Gillon asked when the slab was poured. Mrs. Silka replied that the old garage was torn out, and they hired Oscar's Cement to prep for a new garage, and they applied for a permit, but did the work before the permit was issued.

Member Trupiano commented that it looks like the survey shows more property than the City states.

Dan Exner, 2489 - 21st, Wyandotte, contractor.

Mr. Exner stated that he will be building the garage and had applied for the permit and discussed the irregular lot, and added that the Mr. & Mrs. Silka just want a garage. Mr. Exner added that the previous contractor did not follow the proper steps, and he does not feel that the wall needs to be fire rated, and they are trying to do the right thing.

David Levely, 843 Cherry, Wyandotte.

Mr. Levely stated that he is all for the garage.

4 communications were received in favor of this appeal.

Appeal #3317

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Patrick Gallagher, owner, present.

Mr. Gallagher stated that about 10 years ago he put the porch on the back, it is 8'4" from the garage, he had the air condition moved to the side, and know he wants to build the bedroom out, and expand the bathroom. Mr. Gallagher added that his mother-in-law lives with them now, and he needs the extra space.

Mr. Gallagher discussed the fire rating, walls and construction, and added that he will fire rate all 3 walls.

Member Flachsmann asked if this was an existing porch. Mr. Gallagher replied yes.

Member Trupiano commented that it was a nice looking home.

No communications were received regarding this appeal.

To the Zoning Board of Appeals Board Members:

We are opposed to the request of John Evans to convert the existing single-family home into a 3unit dwelling, and convert the existing storage building in the rear yard into an additional 1-unit dwelling, for the reasons specified below.

According to the City's Zoning Ordinance, Section 2704.C,1, the Zoning Board of Appeals may grant a "Non-Use Variance" if the applicant shows practical difficulty by demonstrating all of the following:

 (a) That strict compliance with area, setbacks, frontage, height, bulk, or density would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose, or would render conformity unnecessarily burdensome;

(b) That a variance would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district, or whether a lesser relaxation would give substantial relief and be more consistent with justice to others:

(c) That the plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances of the property;

(d) That the problem is not self-created.

Regarding the criteria above, the applicant has failed to demonstrate a practical difficulty for the following reasons:

(a) The property owner may use the property as it was previously used for many decades, a single-family dwelling; therefore, strict compliance with setback and parking requirements, etc., would not "render conformity unnecessarily burdensome."

(b) A variance would not do "substantial justice to other property owners in the district..." or "...be more consistent with justice to others." Existing buildings with 4-5 residential units in the immediate area have adequate off-street parking or were converted into multi-unit buildings decades ago. Also, the trend in the neighborhood in the last 20-30 years has been to convert previously existing two-unit buildings into single-family dwellings, including our house at 3166 Van Alstyne (which was a two-unit residence until approximately 1995), and 3148 Van Alstyne, (which was a two-unit residence until approximately 2010).

(c) The plight of the owner <u>IS NOT</u> due to unique circumstances of the property. Many homes on Van Alstyne (and throughout Wyandotte) are on non-conforming lots and don't require conversion of an existing single-family home into a total of four (4) residential units.

(d) The "problem" IS self-created. The owner purchased the property and knew (or should have known) what uses are allowed. The property should remain as a single-family home.

To the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) Members:

This communication outlines general issues and requirements for the ZBA to consider when reviewing a non-use variance request, and then applies the requirements to Appeal #3314 at 3213 Van Alstyne.

- It is up to the applicant to justify the variance. If the applicant doesn't support their application with facts, then the application could be tabled to allow the applicant to provide additional information. Or, the ZBA could deny the variance on the basis that "the applicant has failed to present information demonstrating that one or more criteria for a variance has been satisfied." It is not up to the ZBA, or any members of the neighborhood, or anyone else, except the applicant, to present information to demonstrate that the criteria for a non-use variance has been satisfied.
- II. ZBA procedures for review and standards for approval. The City's Zoning Ordinance, Section 2704.C.1, states that the ZBA may grant a "Non-Use Variance" if the applicant shows <u>practical difficulty</u> by demonstrating <u>all of the following</u>:

Excerpt Below from Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance

2704.C. Variance. To authorize the following upon an appeal:

- 1. A non-use variance from the strict applications of the provisions of this ordinance where by reason of exceptional narrowness, shallowness, shape or area of a specific piece of property at the time of enactment of this ordinance or by reason of exceptional topographic conditions or other extraordinary or exceptional conditions of such property, the strict application of the regulations enacted would result in peculiar or exceptional practical difficulties in the use of the property in question upon the owner of such property, provided such relief may be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent and purpose of this ordinance. The applicant must show practical difficulty by demonstrating:
- (a) That strict compliance with area, setbacks, frontage, height, bulk, or density would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose, or would render conformity unnecessarily burdensome;
- (b) That a variance would do substantial justice to the applicant <u>as well as to other property</u> <u>owners in the district</u>, or whether a lesser relaxation would give substantial relief and be more consistent with justice to others;
 - (c) That the plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances of the property;
 - (d) That the problem is not self-created.

End of Excerpt from Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance

- III. Based on the information above, the Applicant has failed to demonstrate a practical difficulty for the following reasons:
 - a) Property may be used "as is" and would not "render conformity unnecessarily burdensome." The property owner may use the property as it was previously used for many decades, a single-family dwelling; therefore, strict compliance with setback and parking requirements, etc., would not "unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose, or render conformity unnecessarily burdensome." Note: The applicant purchased the home in September 2019, after it had been vacant for the last 3-5 years.
 - b) A variance would not do "substantial justice to other property owners in the district." One definition of "justice" is: "conformity to truth, fact, or reason." The applicant has failed to demonstrate that the variance would "do substantial justice to other property owners in the district." To document how this variance, if approved, would actually be contradictory to the truth, facts, and "substantial justice to other property owners," attached to this communication is a table summarizing land use information in the area (Exhibit 1).

To summarize, the table identifies the applicant's property in yellow, and then compares other properties and summarizes them into three (3) different color categories, as follows:

- The orange color indicates at least six (6) other properties that are similar in lot frontage, lot size, and year built. Note: All properties are existing single-family homes;
- 2. The grey color indicates two (2) properties previously converted from single-family homes into multi-family homes many decades ago (in the 1940s for the property at 3175 Van Alstyne); Note: Both properties have larger lot frontage and lot sizes than the applicant's property AND provide adequate off-street parking for their housing units (as detailed in the Exhibit); and
- The information with no color indicates three (3) properties that have smaller lot frontage and lot sizes than the applicant's property. Note: All properties are existing singlefamily homes.
- c) The plight of the owner <u>IS NOT</u> due to unique circumstances of the property. The applicant has failed to demonstrate "any unique circumstances of the property," and as previously indicated above and in Exhibit 1, there are no "unique circumstances of the property."
- d) The "problem" <u>IS</u> self-created. The owner purchased the property and knew (or should have known) what uses are allowed and the requirements for each use. Further, the applicant has failed to demonstrate that the "problem" is not self-created.
- IV. ZBA Finding of Fact: Findings of Fact Must Say Why Each Factor Is Met, Not Just That Each Factor Is Met. If a variance is challenged in court, the judge reviews whether the decision represents the exercise of reasonable discretion based upon competent, material and substantial evidence in record. A finding by the ZBA that: "We find that practical difficulties are present" is not sufficient. Consequently, if a variance is approved, please ensure findings of fact are made on all four (4) criteria and based upon competent, material and substantial evidence in record.

In conclusion, the applicant hasn't demonstrated any of the requirements for practical difficulty. In fact, the information presented above specifically demonstrates how the variance request fails to meet any of the criteria, let alone all four (4) criteria.
